Como Church.

The Como Methodist Church in Spring Lake Heights and adjoining burial ground is located on the east side of Church Street, formerly the easterly end of Allaire Road, between Route No. 71 and the railroad. Prior to the erection of the original one room church in 1870, services were held in private dwellings. One of the oldest of these meeting houses was the old Newman residence on 18th Avenue, opposite "L" Street in West Belmar, built in 1825. Regular services were held here for 60 years. It was at this house that plans were organized for the erection of a new church.

In 1870, Captain Samuel Ludlow, a local resident and large property owner, cleared a strip of land he owned and donated it, with the stipulation that a portion of the land be set aside for the burial of shipwrecked seaman and paupers. He also gave a substantial sum of money for the erection of the church.


It is not known how many seaman or paupers may have been buried here. Like in the neighboring Presbyterian Church property on Allaire Road near Route 35, graves of the unknown seaman were all unmarked. Such is the case here.

Prior to the erection of the Como Church, a small burial ground was set aside for the Ludlow family at this spot. One of their children, Abraham Lincoln Ludlow died at the age of one day on March 5, 1861. His wife, Sarah Smith Ludlow, died five days later on March 10, 1861. Her funeral services were held in the Wall Methodist Church on Old Mill Road, and was buried on the family farm.


In 1889, the present structure was built, and remained in use until June 5th 1960 when the congregation merged with the St. Andrew's United Methodist Church in Spring Lake.

The old Como Church is still standing and the cemetery well maintained, but the stones are well worn and many are not legible. The church building has been taken over by the Manasquan Brotherhood of the Masons for use as a Masonic Temple.

Sea Side Newspaper, Manasquan, N.J. October 6, 1878.

The dead body of a girl, about nine or ten years, was found lying on the beach. about half a mile south of the Neptune House, (now 17th Ave. & Ocean, Belmar) on Tuesday afternoon, by Freeman Gifford, a fisherman. It was clothed in a light buff calico dress, with dark spots; blue sack trimmed with chinchilla; gray striped stockings; laced gaiters, very little worn. The face was disfigured beyond all recognition. In the absence of a Coroner, Esquire John E. Tilton was notified. He examined the body but found no violence thereon. An inquest was decided unnecessary. The body was placed in a coffin and buried in the burying ground in Sea Plain, (now Spring Lake heights.) COMO CEM.

Capt. Ludlow Dead.

Oldest Resident of North Spring Lake Passes Away After Four Week's Illness. Aged 79.

Captain Samuel Ludlow the oldest resident of North Spring Lake died about 7 o'clock this morning of senility after an illness of four weeks. Funeral arrangements will be announced.

Captain Ludlow was born July 16, 1822, and for many years conducted a fishery at Hoboken. He was first president of the board of commissioners of North Spring Lake borough. He leaves a widow, 11 children, 16 grandchildren and one great-grandchild.

Death of Peter F. Brown

The funeral of Peter F. Brown of West Belmar, who died Tuesday afternoon at the age of 84, will be held tomorrow afternoon at the Brown residence, H street, at 2 o'clock, Rev. Charles Everett officiating. Interment will be made by Undertaker Hardy of Manasquan in Como.

In the death of Mr. Brown, Belmar loses perhaps her oldest continuous resident. Mr. Brown always lived where he died on H street, West Belmar. He was the son of

William Brown and was the last surviving member of a family of nine children. Mr. Brown was a farmer by occupation and always followed that with a few months in the year fishing until his retirement about eight years ago. He leaves four children: Mrs. Frank Morton of Long Branch, George, Harry C., and Edwin of Belmar. There are 35 grand children, and 27 great grand children.

Obit of Peter F. Brown of West Belmar, Wall Twp. N.J. appeared in the January 20, 1916 Asbury Park Press on Thurs. Peter Brown, was the son of Jemima or Gemima (Newbury) & William Brown.

The house that Mr. Brown lived in is now known as 1717 "H" street, or Route No. 71 in West Belmar.

Reference To Como Cemetery.

Information taken from the Manasquan Sea Side Newspaper, Oct. 9, 1885.

"Mr. Joseph Runyon of Ocean Beach (now Belmar) who was killed near Easton Pa., by falling off the rear platform of an excursion train returning from Mauch Chunk, was brought home on Saturday and buried at Sea Plain." (Como Cemetery) formerly Wall Township, presently Spring Lake Heights.

The 1885 Census of Wall Township lists a Joseph Runyon, aged 19 years. William Runyon was listed as aged 50

Lydia Runyon as aged 56. These three names were listed together. It is not known if they were related, but this was the only Joseph Runyon listed in the town in 1885.

An Aged Lady

"The death of Mrs. Jamima Brown occurred on Saturday last at the residence of her son Mr. Peter Brown, at West Ocean Beach. The funeral took place on Monday afternoon last at the Hopeville M.P. Church. Mr. James H. Sexton, of Asbury Park, was the undertaker, and every apointment of the funeral was arranged in Mr. Sexton's usual good taste and conducted with that care much appriciated at such times. The attendance was large as Mrs. Brown was so well and favorably known that a host of friends and relatives desired to show their respect by following her to her last resting place. A very impressive sermon was delivered by Rev. Faront of Ocean Beach.

Mrs. Brown was well advanced in years being in her 86th year. She was the mother of 9 children all of which excepting two survive her, the grandmother of 103 grand-children, seventy-three of whom still live, the great-grandmother of 105 great-grandchildren 80 of whom are now living. Her oldest child now living is 65 years; the oldest grandchild 49 years; the oldest great-grandchild 17 years."

The house that Mrs. Brown lived in is now known as 1717 "H" Street, or Route No. 71 in West Belmar.

There are no visible stones or markers to mark the grave where she was buried in the Hopeville M.P. Church, now known as the Glendola Methodist Churchyard. It is presumed that she would be buried with her husband William Brown, no dates.

Jamima, or Gemima, as she is also known by, was born March 24, 1797.

Asa Freeman Gifford of West Belmar died on Friday last of gangrene of the intestines. The funeral took place on Saturday afternoon at 2:30 from the Como M.P. Church. The Knights of Pitheous and Jr. O.U.A. of Belmar attended the funeral in a body. Interment was made in Como Cemetery. Undertaker Thos. E. Hardy in Charge.

Father's name, Richard Longstreet Gifford. Mother's Maiden name, Hannah Brown.

Freeman Gifford, as he was known, and his family lived in West Belmar, on what is now "H" Street, or Route No. 71 opposite Karl and Erma Newman's Gasoline Station, at Fifth Avenue and "H" Street. In later years the Henville Family lived there, and eventually it was purchased by the Wall Auto Wreckers and the house was torn down.

Mr. Gifford was born on October 6,1842 and died October 31, 1903 aged 62.

There are no stones or markers at the Como Cemetery marking the Gifford graves.
