It will be difficult for the quartet to improve on their 1965 records. Williams led the Continental League in rushing with 1088 yards and a total of 12 touchdowns.

The team will be in action on August 6th at the Temple Stadium in Philadelphia, Pa., against the bulldogs in a pre-season game.

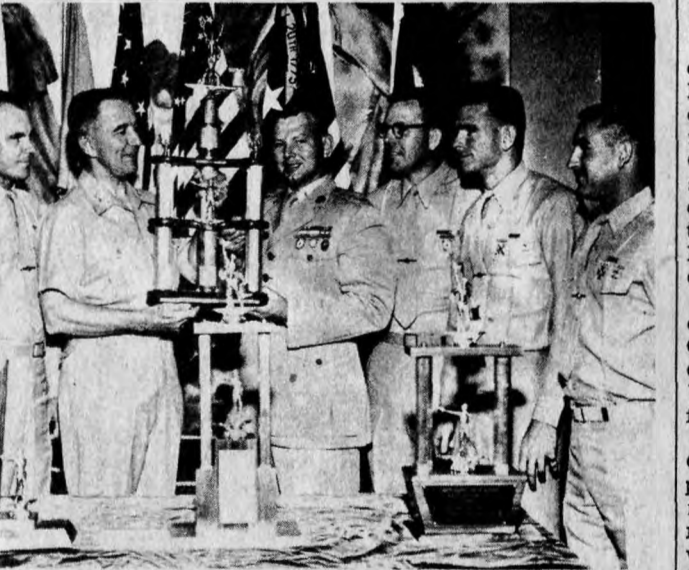

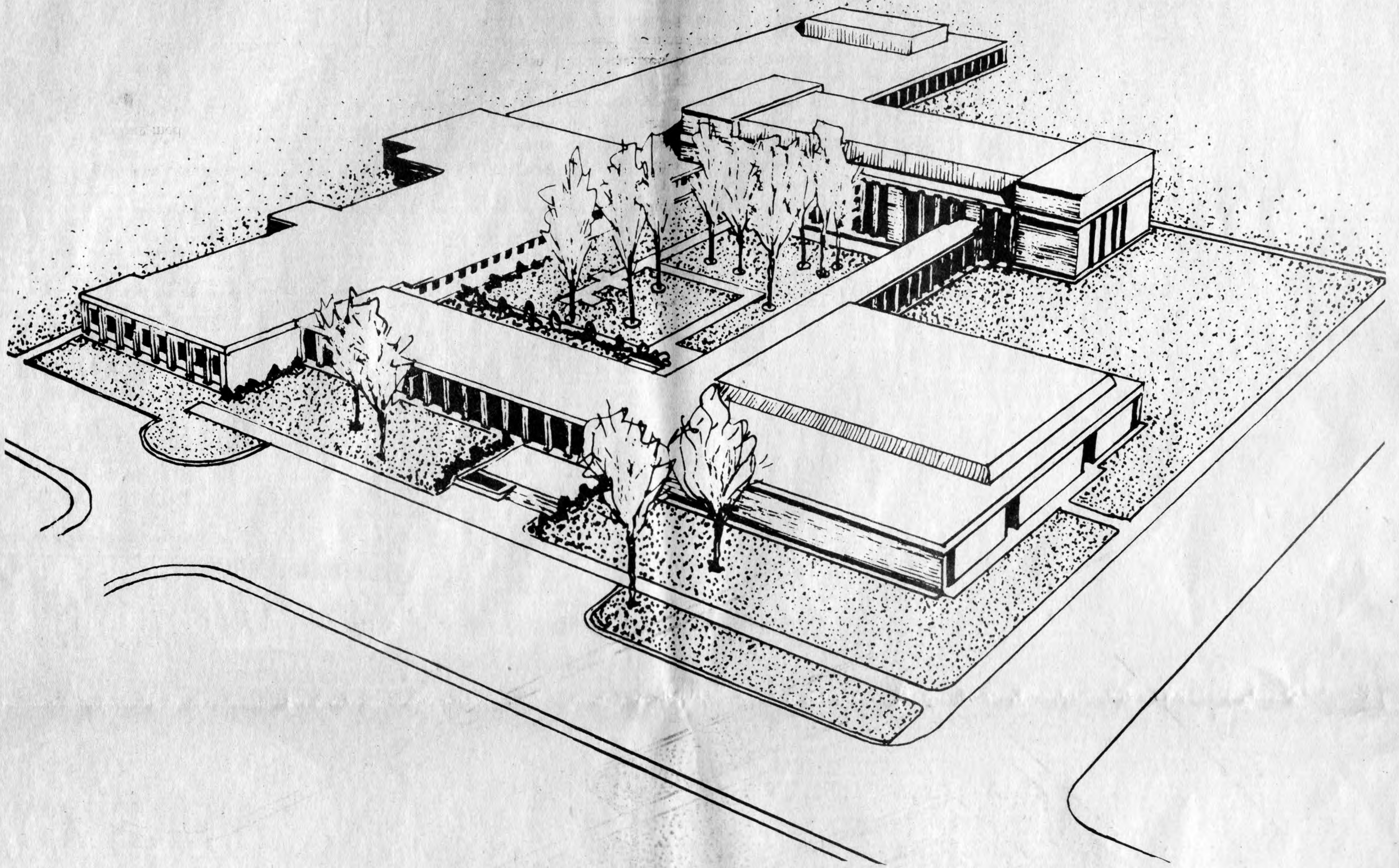
