### Study on Flooding

#### Legal Liability for Damage Subject of River Group Research

The board of directors of the Highway River Improvement Association of Cranford at its meeting last Friday authorized research to determine the legal liability involved in the event of flood waters causing damages here as a result of the lack of modern dams above North Union avenue and Lincoln avenue.

Modern dams are designed to permit flood flows unobstructed. The directors desire in a statement issued this week, "The present study is being conducted in the center of town were constructed many years ago when this community consisted principally of farms and woods, and were originally established to provide water power in the area prior to the advent of electricity. With the transformation of the community to our present residential town and our continuing growth of all the town, the Highway River drainage basin has been replaced with modern structures designed for flood control purposes.

Over ten years ago the New Jersey State Department of Conservation recommended that the dams be either eliminated or replaced with modern structures. These structures here should have operative gates the full width of the channel. With the flood control project presently under construction along Park in the area of Homestead Park in the North, and Barclay and Centennial avenue in the South, the association believes the replacement of the antiquated dams in the center of town becomes the next logical step in providing the town with adequate flood protection.

**Broiler Meats**  
Choose tender cuts of good quality meat such as club, porterhouse, sirloin, rib or shoulder chops. Thick steaks are usually juicier than thin ones and require more time to broil. Score the fat of meat so it will not curl.

**Smoked ham, bacon, liver and sausage may be broiled but pork is better when baked or broiled.**  
Chickens for broiling should be young and tender.

Whole fish should be split and broiled skin down without turning. Thick fish steaks may be turned and broiled on both sides.

**Firm vegetables are broiled with meat, they are placed on the rack for the last part of the broiling period. Cooked, canned or leftover vegetables may be broiled in the pan under the rack.**

**Parboiled or precooked meats should be parboiled.** To brown vegetables, brush with salad oil, butter or margarine.

Fruits can be broiled or dotted with butter or margarine and sprinkled with sugar. Some fruits and vegetables are broiled on one side; others should be turned.

**Allow 3 inches between broiler unit and food.**  
—STEAK—1 inch Thick  
Broil 8 to 10 minutes, turn, broil 8 minutes.  
Medium—Broil 10 to 12 minutes, turn, broil 8 minutes.
