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Crane: High EER Ratings Save Money

With the summer air conditioning season close at hand, Crane, president of Crane Refrigeration and Air Conditioning Co., reports that "most people do not really understand what EER (Energy Efficiency Rating) means." To be considered as a high efficiency air conditioner, he says, a unit must produce at least as much cooling as conventional units, but use far less electricity. Crane says, "The EER number assigned to it. This EER number is a mathematical way of showing the comparison between the amount of electricity used and the cooling produced; the higher the number, the more efficient the system. EER numbers are certified accurate by the American Refrigeration Institute."

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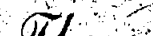
