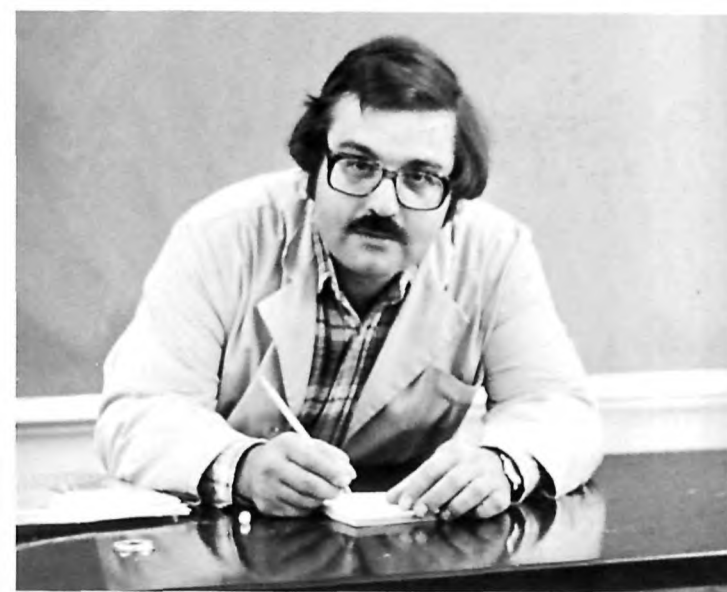


THE PHYSICAL, THE ABSTRACT



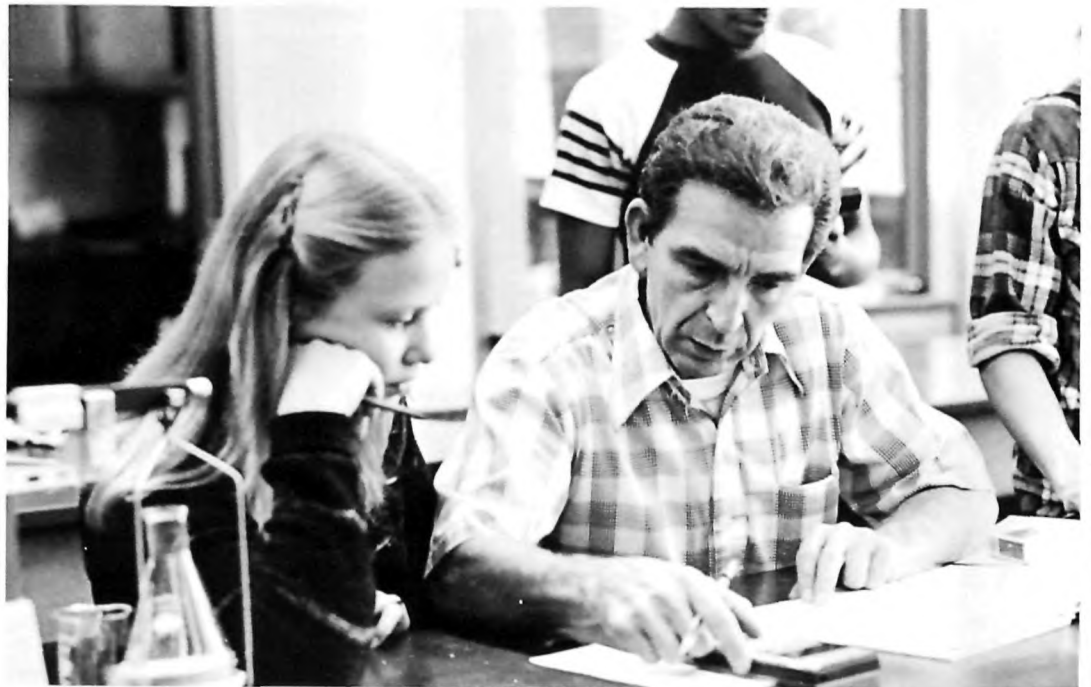

TOUGH SEASON

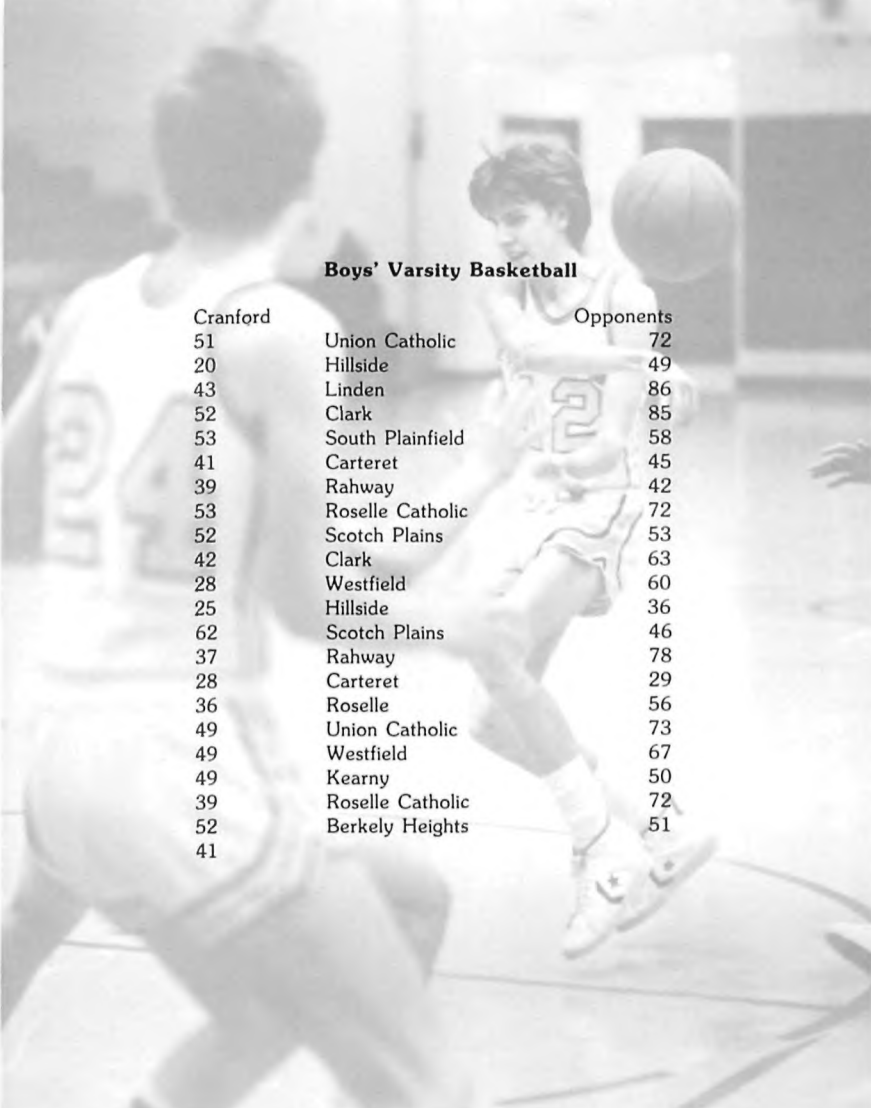

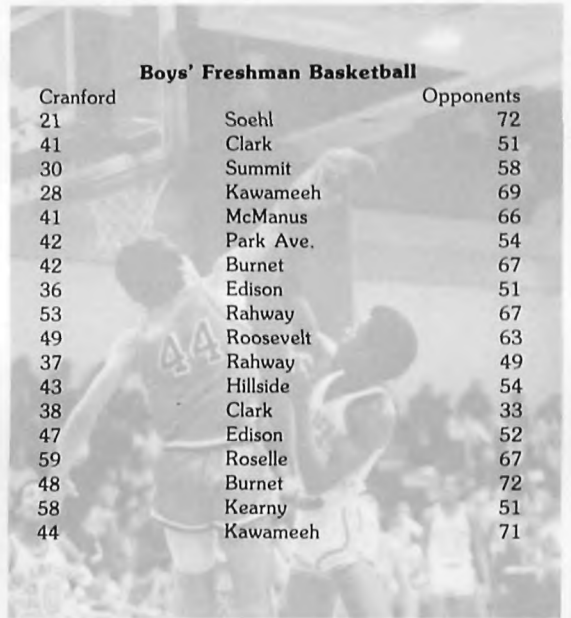

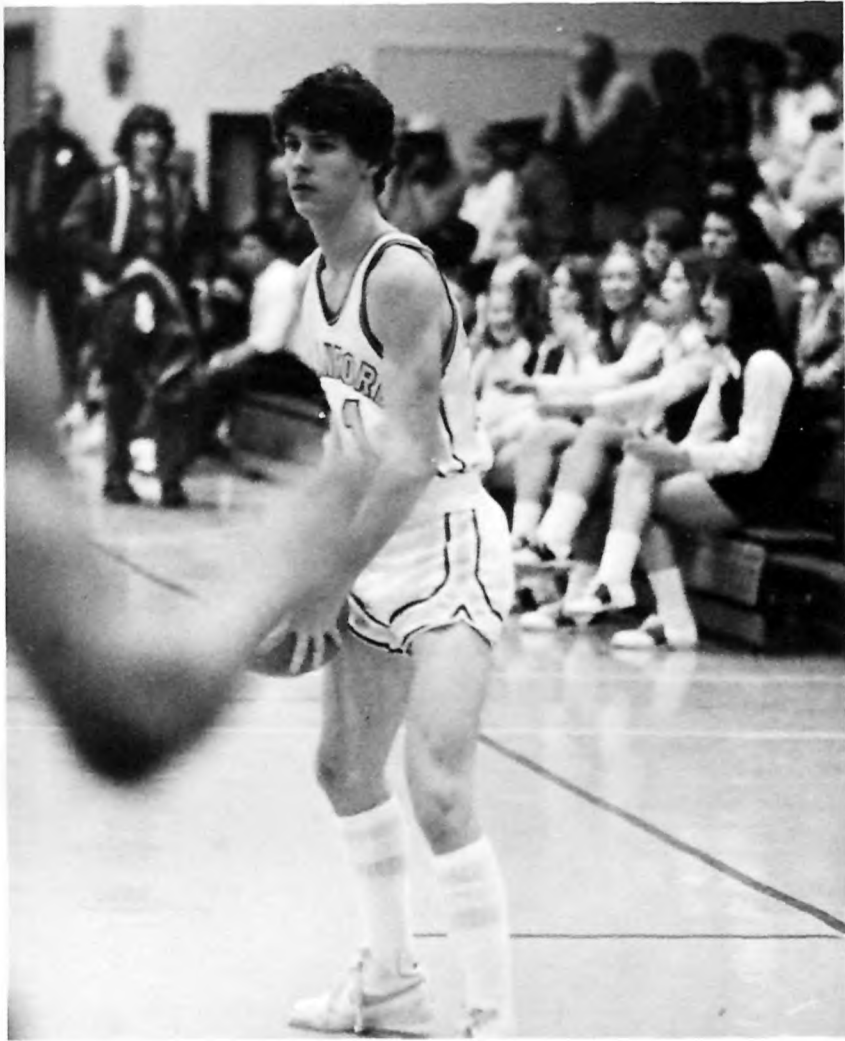

Both of these matches and the Rahway match came down to the heavyweight bout. All three times, the smart wrestling of heavyweight Steven Honeywell saved the team.

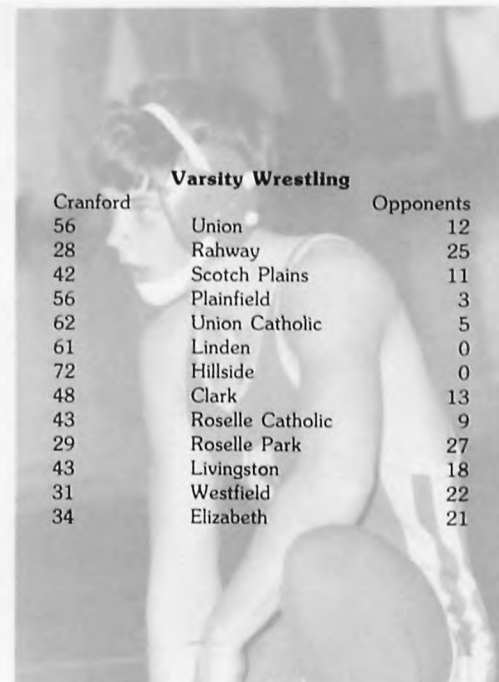
The boys did well in post-season tournaments also. They took the team title in the District 12 tournament. This was the 5th district title Cranford had won, but only the 1st title since Westfield had entered our district. Of the 12 men entered, 9 went to the finals. Robbie Pender, Phil Sandford, Rich Briscoe, and Al Brown each took a 1st place. Dennis Sullivan, Scott Senkarik, Dave Gelber, Marc Sirockman, and Brian Merkel each took a 2nd place. All 9 wrestlers advanced to the regions. Here only 3 made it to the finals. Merkel placed 2nd, Sandford and Briscoe both placed 1st. All 3 boys in the finals advanced to the state tournament in Princeton. An added surprise was Coach Farrell being voted "Coach Of The Year" in the state.

Captains for the team were Rich Briscoe and Phil Sandford. Both boys were seniors and wrestled 3 years varsity. Other seniors were Al Brown, Mike Checko, Steven Honeywell, Tom Marotta, Brain Merkel, and Dave Swanson. Briscoe, Sandford, and Pender were the 3 strongest wrestlers on the team. Between the 3 of them there was only 1 loss in dual meets.

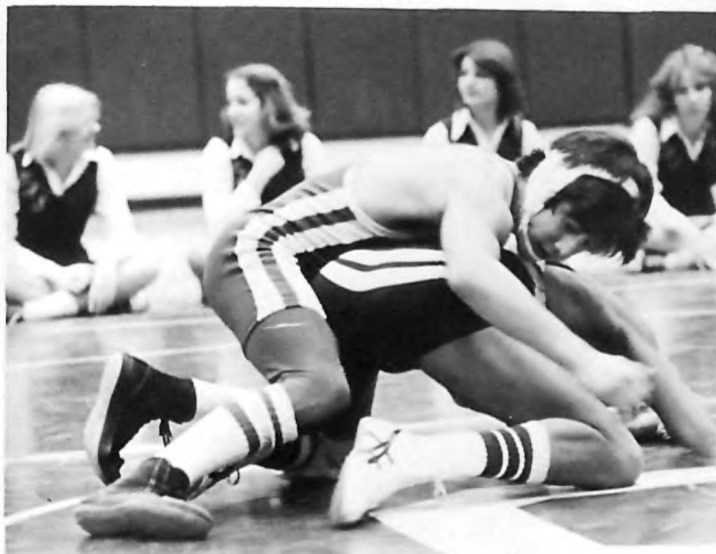




FRESHMEN STUMBLE

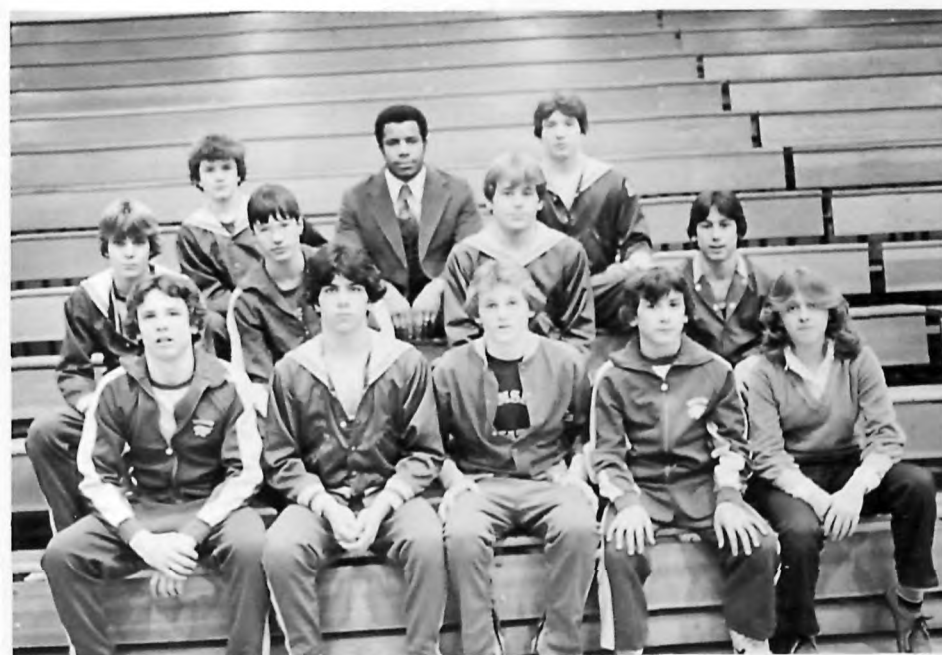

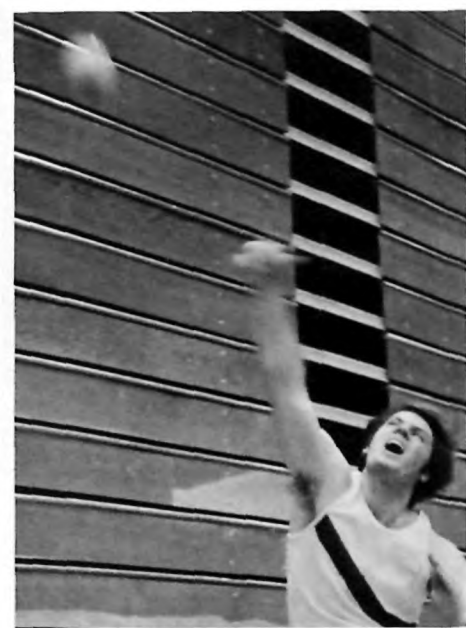
