







states, "At first, I was apprehensive about going to the high school, but then I realized it would give me an opportunity to meet new people and show up my brother at golf."


When Jason's senior brother, Mike, was reached for comment, he responded, "In his dreams!" It's relationships like these that help make having a sibling in the high school so special.




















**Math League**


















