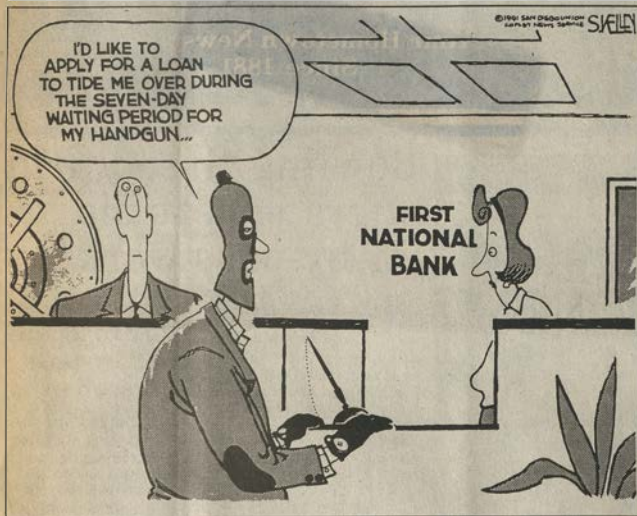

As old cronies gathered around a line of tables loaded with assorted delicacies, some catching up on the latest was evident, but this soon lapsed into the group's common knowledge of many years ago. In that sense, married or widowed ladies were regarded by their maiden names which were representative of the depth of recollection.

George Major and I were the only males present at the party and were hence among the few who's last names had not been changed. In the spirit of the dim past (and my laziness), here are the other members of the gathering.

Margarine Timmons was the guest of honor. Others were: Charline Jones, Sarah Malone, Mary Elizabeth "Scoots" Alexander, Elaine Baker, Ola Timmons, Mae Minton, Mary Magdelene "Cotton" Cunningham, Mary Magdelene Banister, and Marsha Held (she's Margarine's daughter and a furriner).

Most all of the above had been born and raised within hollering distance of each other. Margarine and I went to school together for twelve years back before there was such a thing as oleomargarine. Her father was Lewis "Red" Timmons who could cut hair so fast that he may hold a record of some sort.

As we jabbered in the *Hamtown USA Restaurant*, we remembered when one lone business place sat isolated on that hill. Rumor had it that it was burned down by a competitor in the hard-drink business.

This spurred my memory of being told by my old friend, Garfield Poston, that a saloon once inhabited the rear of the building that burned when the newspaper office of *The Kentucky Telephone* (the forerunner of *The Cadiz Record*) caught fire next door. The replacement buildings now house *Mildred's Flowers* and *Miz Malva's Antique Mall*. Such was the antiquity of much of our conversation.

Those were the days before my friends went their separate ways to strange surroundings where everything lay ahead of them, and they had little time to think of their roots. But there comes a time when the reality dawns that everything we have experienced is integrated into what or who we eventually become.

Margarine's mother was just 'Miz Timmons' to me. So I inquired as to her maiden name, and discovered that she was the daughter of Pete Light who built the old log house that is now camouflaged as *Pete Light Springs Restaurant*.

## Prisons today differ from 'hang 'ems'

Man's inhumanity to man is less today. This I learned from Bill Cunningham's most interesting account of history of prisons in Kentucky, which he gave to the Trigg County Historical Society.

In pioneer days there was less need for prisons for they "hung 'em as soon as they caught 'em."

The first Kentucky prison was built in Frankfort in 1797. It was run by private contractors and by 1878 conditions were so bad it was known as the "black hole."

Governor Luke Blackburn, a doctor in the Confederate Army, put through prison reform. General Highland B. Lyon, a Confederate general, was instrumental in bringing the penitentiary to Eddyville.

"Abandon hope all yea who enter here," was inscribed on the wall.

Cunningham was the most complementary of the two who served Eddyville from Trigg

County: M.W. "Chuck" Thomas and Luther Thomas. The Luther Thomas Educational Building, which Luther established is named for him.

Conditions at the prison are much improved over early days.

This clock on the wall has been ticking in the John Street Methodist Church in New York City. It is the oldest Methodist Church in America.

Sheriff Randy Clark will soon be gathering a few children from Trigg County who will be attending the Kentucky Sheriff's Boys and Girls Ranch in Gilbertsville in western Kentucky.

Last summer, the Sheriff's Ranch had a record number of boys and girls. Eleven hundred and three children, split almost equally between boys and girls, enjoyed the summer camp experience. Since 1979, almost 11,000 children have attended.

There has been a lot of adverse publicity about law enforcement officials in the last month, but in Kentucky, the

sheriff and his deputies are to be commended for taking care of needy children by making this summer camp experience possible for them.

The sheriff provides the transportation to and from the camp for the children attending, as well as hosting fundraisers for the camp. Sheriff Clark is a strong supporter of the Boys and Girls Ranch and we appreciate his help.

In addition to being involved with the ranch, more than 70 Kentucky sheriffs have a DARE program in the school, many block and neighborhood watch programs and some are starting a

TRIAD program to help the elderly.

Sheriffs are proving that "service to humanity is the best work of life."

Our summer camp will be open on Sunday, June 9. If you know of an unfortunate 9-13 year old, please contact Sheriff Clark. Last summer 16 children from Trigg County enjoyed this once in a lifetime experience free of charge to them.

This is the greatest summer camp in the nation and we are eager to accommodate children from Trigg County.

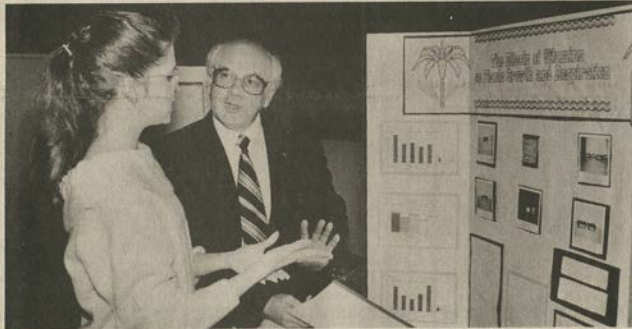

# April 28 is Workers Memorial Day for Kentucky, Wilkinson proclaims

FRANKFORT, Ky. - Gov. Wallace G. Wilkinson has proclaimed April 28 Workers Memorial Day in Kentucky to honor the men and women who have been killed, injured or diseased on the job.

The proclamation was issued in response to the efforts of the Kentucky State AFL-CIO to raise public awareness of the inadequacies of existing occupational safety and health laws and enforcement.

"This marks the third annual event sponsored by the AFL-CIO to both honor our brothers and sisters who have been killed and injured in the

workplace and to call attention to the need for stronger OSHA laws," said Ron Cyrus, executive secretary-treasurer of the state AFL-CIO.

"We appreciate Gov. Wilkinson's action by proclaiming the day in Kentucky. We will continue to look to our state, federal and local government leaders to make workplace safety a guarantee, not merely an empty promise."

Each year more than 10,000 workers die, 6.6 million are injured and 60,000 are permanently disabled as the result of job-related accidents and illnesses.

In the 20 years since enactment of OSHA, 245,000 workers have been killed on the job, more than 100 million have been injured and up to 2 million have died from occupational diseases.

Recent technological advances have also created new workplace health and safety hazards. Many chemical agents common to the workplace have been directly linked to birth defects, disease, infertility and sterility.

"Working people must be given the legal right to refuse life-threatening job assignments without being fired for doing so," Cyrus said.

"Workers must also demand the right to protect their unborn children from reproductive hazards of exposure to workplace chemicals and other threats to the health of the unborn."

According to government statistics, the deadliest industries are mining, agriculture and construction - which employ hundreds of thousands of Kentuckians.

Cyrus said it is a matter of life and death that workers have a voice in safety and health matters on the job.

The AFL-CIO supports legislation which would give

### INSPECTION PERIOD FOR THE PROPERTY TAX ASSESSMENT ROLL

The Trigg County property tax roll will be opened for inspection from May 6 through May 18, 1991. Under the supervision of the property valuation administrator or one of the deputies, any person may inspect the tax roll.

This is the January 1, 1991, assessment on which state, county and school taxes for 1991 will be due about September 15, 1991.

The tax roll is in the office of the property valuation administrator in the courthouse and may be inspected between the hours 8:00 and 4:00, Monday - Friday; 8:00 to 11:00, Saturday.


Any person who wishes to appeal a real property assessment must file a written letter or petition with the county clerk within the above period of time. This letter or petition must state the reasons for appeal, identify the property in question and state the taxpayer's estimate of actual fair cash value (KRS 133.120).

Appeals of personal property assessment shall not be made to the county board of assessment appeals. Personal property taxpayers shall be served notice under the provisions of KRS 132.450(4) and shall have the protest and appeal rights granted under the provisions of KRS 131.110.

The following steps should be taken when a taxpayer does not agree with the assessed value of personal property as determined by the office of property valuation administrator.

- (1) He must list under protest (for certification) what he believes to be the fair cash value of his property.
- (2) He must file a written protest directly with the Department of Property Taxation within 30 days from the date of notice of assessment.
- (3) The protest must be in accordance with KRS 131.110.
- (4) The final decision of the Revenue Cabinet may be appealed to the Kentucky Board of Tax Appeals.

mentation at press time. Angie Siegel, a spokesperson for the transportation cabinet, said it could be two weeks before the committee makes a recommendation.

Siegel said that the low bidder is not necessarily the one that will be offered the contract. Once it is offered, though, the bidder has 15 days to accept or reject it.

James D. Scott, president of Scottie's Construction, said Monday that if his company is awarded the contract, work on the by-pass could start in about a month. Work would be finished sometime next year if things go as planned, he said.

Scott said a separate bid will be let for the actual asphalt

1. When being carried in a parade or procession, the flag should always be aloft, never flat or horizontal. Its place at such a ceremony is on the marching right.

2. When displayed with other flags, the U.S. flag should be at the right, that is, the left of an observer facing the display. Or it may be placed at the center of the line at a higher level than the others.

3. If displayed on a wall, either vertically or horizontally, the stars section should be on the flag's right -- the observer's left, and the flag should be above the audience's eye level.

4. When lowering the flag from its staff, no part of it should touch the ground. The fold for storage should be in the shape of a triangular hat.

## Louise Thomas... This is your life!

### Family, friends help celebrate Thomas' 80th birthday Sunday

Mrs. Louise Sumner Thomas was born April 29, 1911 in her parent's home on U.S. 68 near the present entrance to Lake Barkley State Park.

Floyd and Lillie Jane (Thomas) Sumner.

She traces her ancestry to Wales, England, Scotland and Spain.

Mrs. Thomas attended the Oak Grove Elementary School. In the fall of 1925, she entered Cadiz High School. She graduated in May 1929, and enrolled in Western State College in Bowling Green.

She received her bachelor of science degree in elementary education and was also certified in administration and supervision in May 1941.

In the fall of 1935, after she had completed a year and a half of college, she began teaching all eight grades in a one-room school at Hickory Grove.

After one year, the building burned and the school was closed; and she began teaching at Delmont School, where she taught the school years 1936-37 and 1937-38.

She then taught at Siloam School for one year (1939-1940).

The last one-room school she taught in was her home school, Oak Grove. She taught

there for three years (1940-43), making a total of seven years of teaching in one-room schools.

In 1943, Mrs. Thomas joined the Cadiz Grade School faculty and taught second grade for 20 years. In 1962, the school was closed and the students moved to the new Trigg County Elementary School.

She taught there for nine years -- six years in second grade and three years as principal.

She began principal in the spring of 1963, when Miss Franny Wallace became ill; but after three years she asked

13 years old in 1924. She was an active leader in church for many years: Sunday School teacher for 45 years; Vacation Bible School teacher for a number of years; Sunday School department superintendent; church purchasing secretary; member of WMU; and church historian.

In 1975, for the centennial celebration, she wrote and published a church history -- "Oak Grove Baptist Church - The First 100 Years."

On Aug. 13, 1949, she married John Alex Thomas by the Rev. J.T. Lewis at his home in Hopkinsville. They lived

Palamiotis and Jane Sumner-Harper.

Mrs. Thomas suffered a severe stroke Sept. 13, 1978, which left her right side paralyzed, and ended her active life.

She has continued to live in their home and enjoys her visitors, the television and her telephone calls.

She was a charter member of the Thomas Bridges Association. She served as vice-president and on the board of directors, where she was serving at the time of her stroke.

She is a charter member of the Cadiz High School Alumni Association. She joined the Kentucky Historical Society in 1972.

Mrs. Thomas was organized regent of the first chapter of the Daughters of the American Revolution (DAR) in Trigg County, the James

Thomas Chapter; and served as the first regent.

She also served as chaplain, registrar, and historian. She is a lifetime member of the Kentucky Regents Club, and a member of the Trigg County Retired Teachers.

On Sunday, April 28, she

will be honored with an 80th birthday reception from 2-4 p.m. at Oak Grove Baptist Church.

HOPKINSVILLE, KY -- In between dodging a weed full of showers, the Trigg County Wildcats notched their first two wins of the season with a sweep of the Hopkinsville Tigers.

The teams squared off April 17 in a doubleheader at Hoptown after rain postponed an April 9 game in Cadiz.

And Trigg, now 2-4, used the momentum from the first win, a 7-4 decision, to claim a 10-6 win in the nightcap.

Wildcat coach Glen Ringstaff said he noticed a definite change in team after the first game. The players were "more into the game, more supportive."

"It was a different team between the first and second game," he said.

Trigg picked up the first win despite allowing eight Hoptown hits to Trigg's five. The key was a three-run homer by freshman Michael James in the third inning.

Ringstaff said the home run was important because it made the score 7-1. Trigg. After that inning, the 'Cats didn't score again while Hoptown picked up three more runs.

Scotty Hampton, who got the win for Trigg, added a double to Trigg's offense.

James also sparked Trigg's

# Mr. Football Hood more than 'a player'

If Kentucky coach Bill Curry needed a PR person to extol the virtues of his fledgling football program -- and he does not -- UK fans can be assured he would not refuse if the man was 6-2, 215 pounds, runs a 4.5 40 and is as competent with the English language as one might expect an aero-space engineering major to be.

Damon Hood, known by some in these parts as Kentucky Mr. Football, qualifies on all counts.

A bright-eyed and articulate youngster who speaks more with quiet confidence than gridiron bravado, Hood volunteered some straightforward views last week on UK's future and his own.

In the first of two parts, here are some Damon Hood views: **On why he chose UK over Penn State and UCLA.**

"There were some questions about why I waited so long to announce. I wanted my family to meet (Penn State's) Joe Paterno, get to know him a little in case I decided to go there."

"UK? I didn't get any kind

of gut feeling like some recruits say they do. Actually it just came down to which school offered the best opportunity for me. Things like an opportunity for early playing time, the CATS (tutorial program) there, and I liked the support I got across the state (to sign with UK)."

**From Rick Norton (1965) to Al Baker, Kentucky football has looked promising before but never enjoyed any success. What's different now?**

"I think the team last year made a statement. There was a whole change in attitude among the players up there. Now it's time to build on that. And I think we will. I think we will make a statement next year."

**Role models, sports idols?**

"My role model has been my father (Stanley). I remember when I was little ev-

son even started that I wasn't going to live up to it all. It just created a lot of pressure."

**Al Baker's influence in decision to sign with UK.**

"I talked with him two days before I signed and he told me about his conflicts there, how he'd decided to give up football. Then coach Curry changed his life around. Coach really made such a total difference to Al Baker, persuaded him to stick with football. Now look what's happened; he might be in the NFL draft this year."

**Damon Hood does not expect to be red-shirted. He expects the same for a number of other freshmen.**

"I wouldn't be surprised to see a lot of freshmen maybe even in starting roles this year."

**Realistically, can a rookie expect to "jump in," play right away in the SEC?**

"Being the strong-willed person I am, I think I can. When I put my mind to it there isn't much that can stop me. I know there's a lot of hard work involved, but I don't mind hard work."

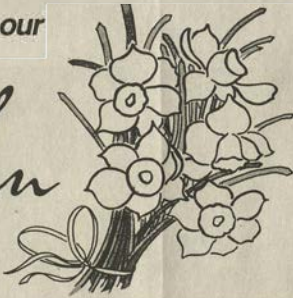

## Before building a new barn, check out your many options

With burley quotas up 20 percent this year, many farmers are wondering how they will house and cure the additional poundage. What are their options?

Tobacco producers have several options, including renting barns, building shed or additional length, putting temporary rails in machinery, hay or cattle shed, hanging tobacco on scaffold wagons or portable frames or using double-barning, as well as building new barns.

With suitable weather conditions and state-of-the-art cultural practices, producers can double barn the additional quota without ever driving a nail.

New facilities include traditional barns, portable curing frames and open interior barns, cable hoist systems, two-tier partially enclosed barns and one-tier field curing structures with mechanized or manual housing.

"Although some producers seem to be locked into building 'old fashioned' barns, many are considering lower cost facilities with labor-saving advantages," according to George Duncan, University of Kentucky Agricultural Engineer.

The lowest labor system is the one-tier structure with mechanized trailer-carrier and cantilever beam housing which requires just two workers and 14 to 15 hours per acre to move tobacco for the field stick-row to the curing position.

In comparison, a traditional "four-tier barn requires three to five workers and 24 to 35 hours per acre for the same task.

"In short, producers need to consider the cost of the labor

required to house tobacco before they decide what type of housing to build," Duncan says.

The lowest-cost facility to house three to five acres of production is a plastic-covered field structure at \$1,500 to \$2,500 per acre of capacity.

Traditional air-cure barns and the cable hoist barn and equipment cost \$3,500 to \$5,000 per acre.

The practice of double-barning does not involve any additional construction but does require timely management, favorable weather and available labor to be successful.

Whether to build a barn or get by with options depends on a producer's short-term and long-term needs and tobacco production plans.

The demand for burley appears strong through the mid-1990s. Thereafter, farmers who are currently expanding housing capacity will likely have opportunities to use their increased housing capacity in future years, should quotas decline, by purchasing or leasing in additional quota.

Tobacco farmers who want to find out about costs and descriptions of various methods of housing tobacco can obtain copies of Extension publications and handouts on tobacco housing available at their County Extension Office.

**Control of Slugs**  
Actions should be taken to re-

duce the number of slugs around outdoor plants as soon as homeowners spot silvery slime trails, says Rick Bessin, an entomologist at the University of Kentucky.

Slugs may appear harmless, but a closer examination of outdoor plants may show otherwise.

Slugs make holes and scars around outdoor plants as soon as homeowners spot silvery slime trails, says Rick Bessin, an entomologist at the University of Kentucky.

Slugs are fleshy, slimy animals that feed at night and prefer cool, moist hiding places during the day. Slugs rasp when they scrape leaves with their abrasive mouthparts.

A common belief is that when slugs are spotted, it's time to use salt. Bessin says that using salt does more harm than good in the long run. Do not make salt barriers around plants or gardens.

This can damage the soil and eventually reduce soil fertility through salt accumulation.

The cool, wet weather of spring that attracts slugs cannot be changed, but there are some tips that can help prevent or reduce slug problems:

- Remove plant debris (leaves, prunings, pulled weeds) and old boards or tires which can house slugs.
- Prune branches of trees and shrubs so they do not touch the ground.
- Rake leaves or mulch to allow the ground to dry.
- Kill individual slugs by dropping them into a bucket of soapy water.
- Beer traps are effective.

## Small-grain growers okay check-off

FRANFORD, Ky. -- Kentucky Commissioner of Agriculture Charles T. Hamilton has announced that a statewide referendum regarding an assessment on small grains passed by a 83 percent majority of those voting.

The referendum, held April 3, at the request of the Kentucky Small Grain Growers Association, requested an assessment of .25 percent (one-fourth of 1 percent) of gross market price per bushel on the

sale of small grains. Small grains include wheat, barley, oats and rye.

Assessments will begin June 1 and will be collected by the purchaser at the first point of sale. Funds collected will be used for promotion, education and research programs for small grains and their products, and will be administered by the Kentucky Small Grain Growers Association through a Fund Utilization Committee.

This seven-member com-

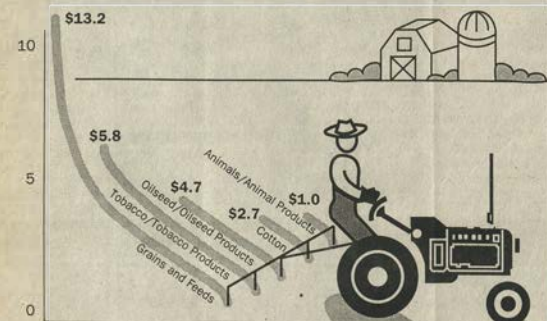
mittee will be composed of four appointees of the Small Grain Growers Association, two appointees of the state farm organization representing the largest number of small grain farmers and one appointee from the Department of Agriculture.

The assessment program will be subject to an annual review by the state board of agriculture and will continue until May 31, 1996, at which time a new referendum must be held.

## Trend now moves to hiring older workers

### Study reveals employers value older workers, willing to meet salary demands

Age does not have to be a barrier in returning to work, according to studies by the international outplacement consulting firm Challenger, Gray & Christmas, Inc., headquartered in Chicago.

In fact, the report states that rehired workers age 50 and older are winning new jobs just as fast as their younger counterparts and more than 20 percent are receiving salary increases as well.

The length of time for a job search is now nearly identical for older as for

younger workers, at 3.36 months for 50-plus workers and 3.26 months for job seekers of all ages, according to James E. Challenger, president of the consulting firm.

"Employers are not only hiring older workers rapidly, but are also putting their money on them," Challenger emphasized.

"We show that 22 percent of the discharged managers age 50 and older who have been rehired in the past four quarters received increases over their former salaries.

"The results are undoubtedly a surprise to many," states Challenger, "because the commonly held view of older workers is that they are 'over the hill' as far as being employees, and if they do get hired are offered and routinely accept less money than younger workers. Nothing could be further from the truth."

Challenger reported that employers today value older workers highly and are willing to meet their salary demands.

"The would not be happening if mature adults were unable to perform well on the job. Fifty-plus workers can get jobs by citing their significant accomplishments for previous employers.

The prospective employer wants to know one thing: how well will this individual perform on the job? The answer, to a large extent, is evident in what the person did for former employers.

"Older workers must realize that they can turn their considerable experience to

good advantage when seeking a new job. Once they start talking about what they have done for other employers, they are likely to outdistance younger competitors for the same job - because they can cite multiple accomplishments over a span of years on several different jobs."

Employers today require work-tested employees in order to help meet their increasing worldwide competition, counsels Challenger.

"Also, since many firms have had to downsize in order

to survive, the person who can do the job the right way with a minimum of supervision save the employer time, manpower and money, three valuable commodities in the business world.

"In fact, the presence of more older workers on the job is making employers increasingly comfortable with the idea of hiring in the 50-and-up age bracket.

"The trend to hiring older workers is evident since the third quarter of 1989," stated Challenger.

## Social Security law has provisions designed to encourage disabled, blind to seek jobs

There are special provisions in the Social Security law designed to encourage blind and disabled Supplemental Security Income (SSI) recipients to try to work.

These provisions allow recipients to attempt work with-

out fear of losing all their SSI checks or Medicaid coverage. Also, recipients whose SSI checks were stopped because their earnings made their income too high to continue getting SSI may be able to get checks again if they find they are no longer able to work.

In addition, many blind and disabled recipients can keep their Medicaid coverage even when their checks stop because their earnings are too high. To keep Medicaid coverage, a recipient must continue to be blind or disabled, meet all other non-earnings SSI eligibility requirements, depend on Medicaid coverage to continue working, and be unable to purchase similar medical care.

Blind or disabled recipients who work also are encouraged to develop a "plan for achieving self-support." Such a plan allows them to set aside income and/or resources to reach their work goal. And since the income set aside won't reduce their SSI check, people with a plan often get a higher SSI check than people without a plan. Expenses associated with reaching a work goal can include education, vocational training, purchasing work-related equipment, or saving to start a business.

More information about working and getting SSI can be obtained by visiting the Social Security office.

### Toll-free number for SS offers more services to callers

People calling Social Security's toll-free number (1-800-234-5772) now have more services options available to them.

Callers using a pushbutton tone telephone can automatically obtain a number of services. Of course, you can always speak to a Social Security representative if you choose.

Using pushbutton phones, you can:

- Request an application for a Social Security number;
- Obtain a request form for a personal earnings and benefit estimate statement;
- Request verification of the amount of your Social Security benefit or supplemental security income payment;
- Request publications that include information about the Social Security programs of retirement, survivors, and disability benefits; supplemental security income; and Medicare; and
- Listen to general information about these programs, including information about how to apply for benefits.

Service on the 800 number is available during normal business days from 7 a.m. to 7 p.m. The best time to call to avoid busy signals are later in the week, the second half of the month, and either early in the morning or late in the afternoon.

Recognizing that a disabled recipient's return to work may not follow a steady progression, the law allows the recipient to use SSI as a steppingstone to employment. Recipients may continue to get some money from SSI while testing their ability to work. The amount received depends on the amount of earnings - as earnings in-
