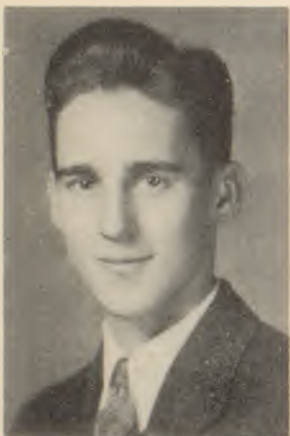

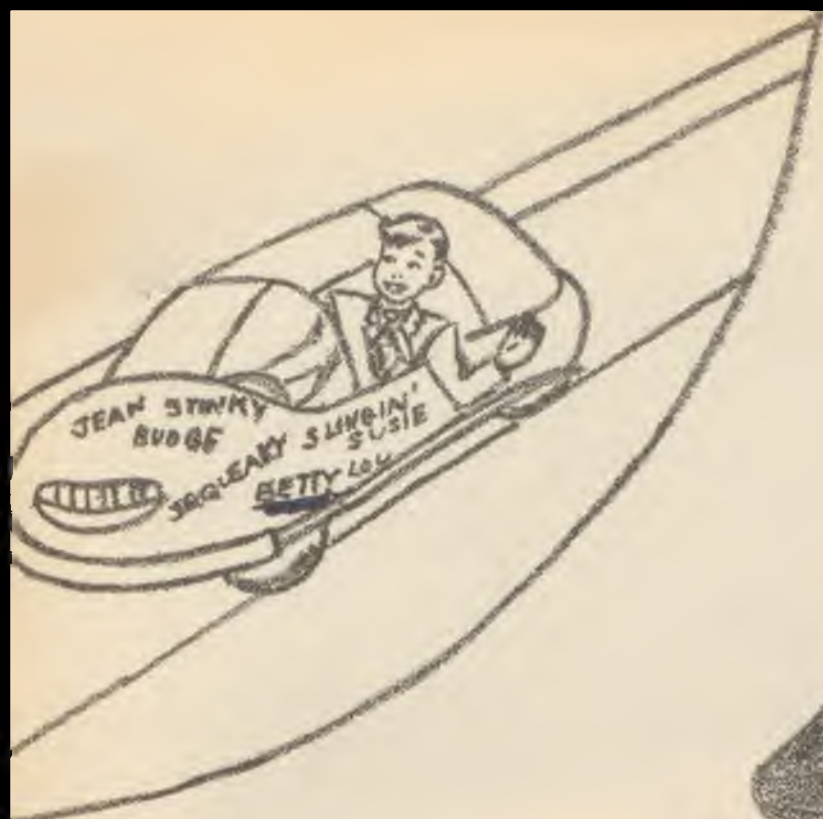
## JUNIORS

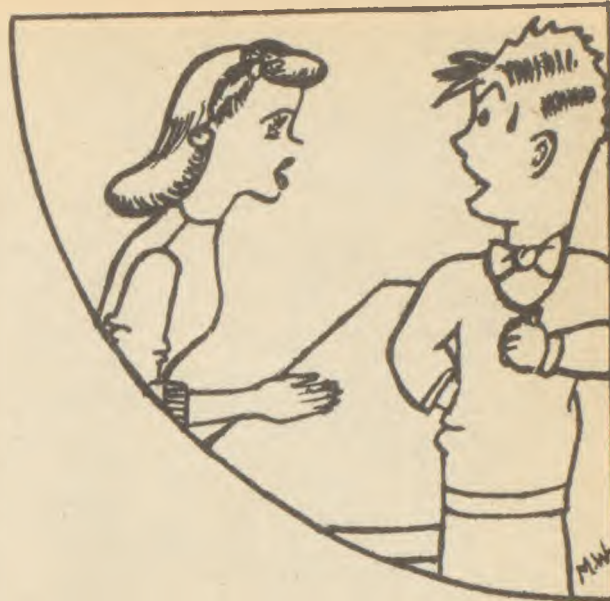
## INTERNATIONAL RELATIONS CLUB

The Aztecs were a group of the Nahuatl tribe, which founded the Mexican Empire in 1519. The Mayans were a people of high culture, as can be told by the ruins uncovered by archeologists.

Archeology is a scientific study which treats past human life and activities, as shown by the monuments and relics left by ancient peoples. According to Mrs. Potter, "The aim of the Archeology Club is to turn out good archeologists some day."

The Club meets once a week on Tuesday mornings in room 15, and includes both boys and girls—mostly freshmen and sophomores. They study these ancient peoples by means of special reports. If none of these are given, an informal meeting is held. At this time games are played, or a quiz of some sort is enjoyed.

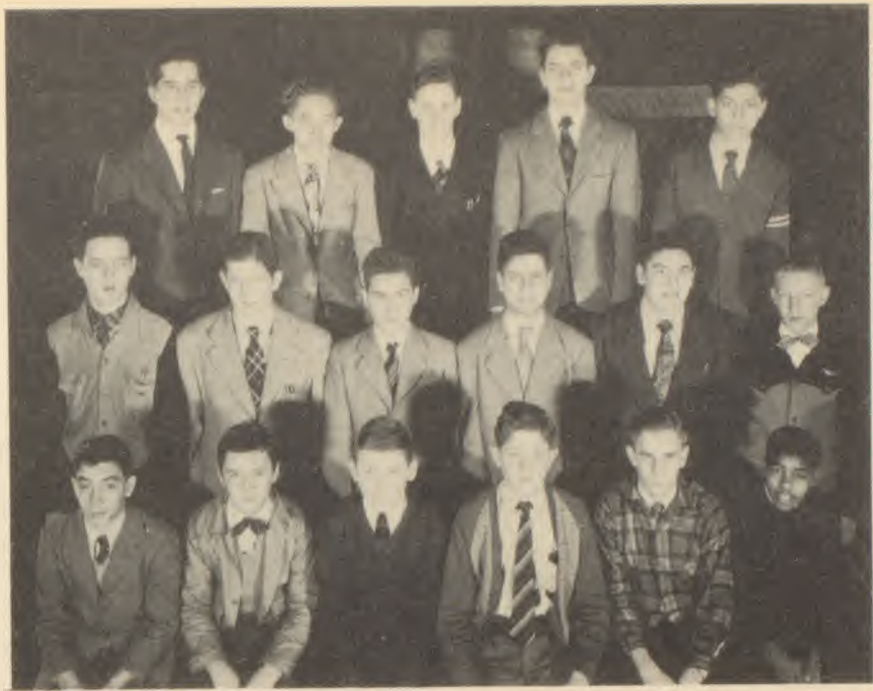

## SPEECH CLUB

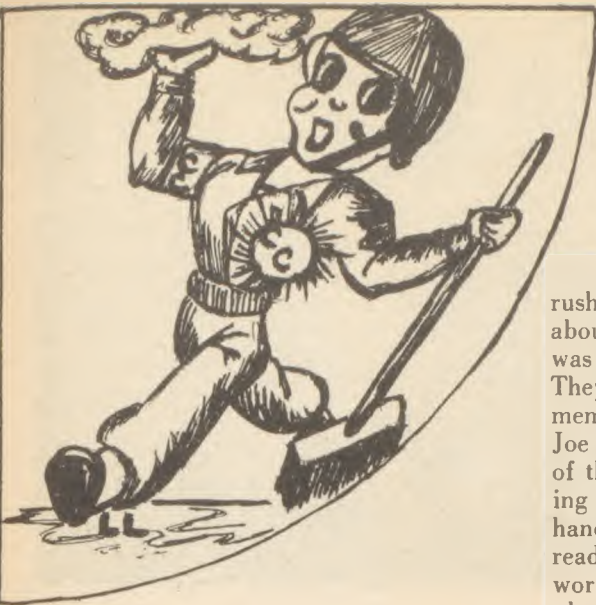

## CIVIL AIR PATROL CADETS

Since the beginning of the war the youth of America has become more and more air-minded. "Oh, come on; let's step on it. We have a test next period. I almost forgot about it."



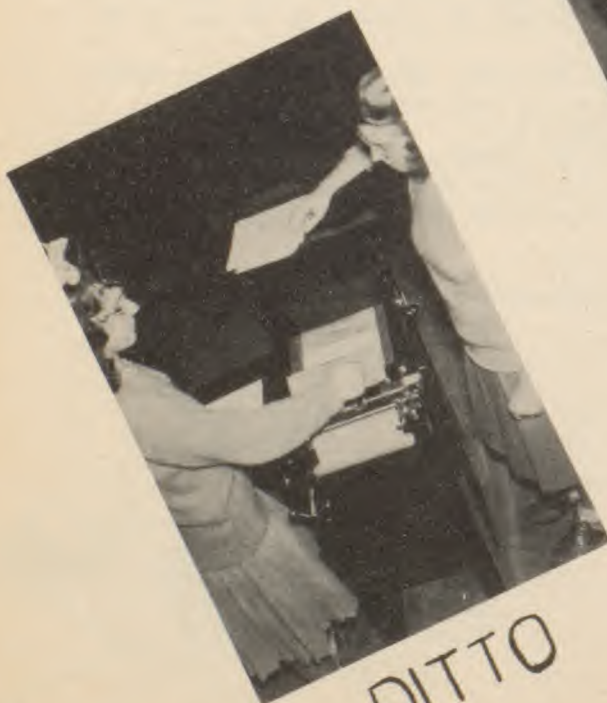

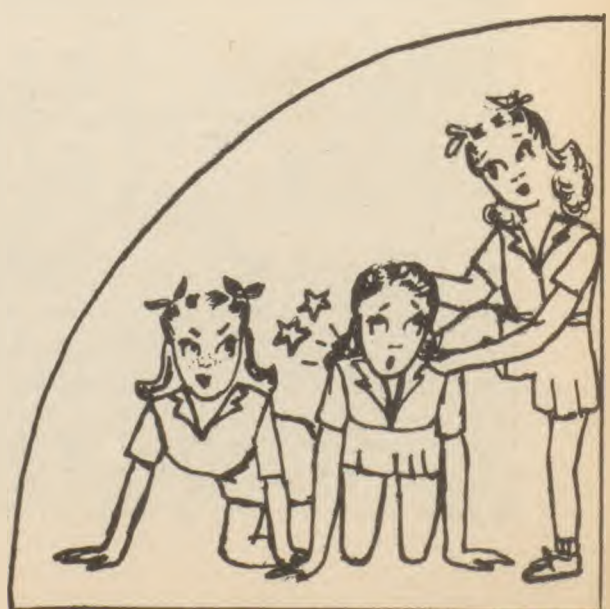
## GIRLS' SPORTS
