The tiger cagers once again turned in a .500 or better record for the third consecutive year, and they proved that as always, they can be found at or near the top of the Union County basketeers.

The season opened on a disappointing note, as North Plainfield High School defeated Linden 48-35. The Tigers, however, soon crashed the win column against Cranford at the High School gym 48-33. After dropping two tough ones to Rahway and Regional by 30-28 and 39-31 scores, the Orange and Black captured their next six out of seven





games, spearheaded by the fine play of George Martis, Jack Callander, and Ed "Nemo" Burke. The Tigers vanquished Union, Rahway, Cranford, Plainfield, Union and Hillside in a series interrupted only by a one-point defeat at the hands of North Plainfield. In what was probably the most exciting game of the year, the Tigers beat Hillside into submission 61-60 after five long periods of play. The Orange and Black hit their highest score of the year, and George Martis recorded the highest individual score of 17 points in the Comet game.

Following the Hillside game the Tigers entered a losing streak that stretched through four games, Edison, Plainfield, Jefferson, and Regional, and it did not come to an end until the last game of the regular season, when Linden, led by Callander and Martis, downed Roselle Park 43-38 to bring the regular season to a close with a record of 8-8.

Linden won its first round game of the County Tournament when Union succumbed to the fast attack of the Tigers 43-33. Westfield, however, matched the Orange and Black most of the way in the second-round game, and in a sudden burst at the end defeated the Linden Cagers 43-37.

The individual scoring crown was taken by Jack Callander, whose 177 points put him 26 points ahead of the number two scorer, George Martis.

Linden High School's nine was one of the top scholastic baseball teams in Northern New Jersey last year. The Little Tigers carried off the North Jersey Section II Group III Championship with a 12-4 record that included victories over some of the best competition in the state.
