Basketball

With a small nucleus of lettermen from last year's squad, coach Al Jakucs molded a pretty good outfit. What is even better, only five men of the twelve-man team of this year will be graduated in 1950. The Tigers won only seven games and dropped ten. This was good, especially when you consider that the Tigers averaged about five feet eleven inches per man. Pete Kinsella and Jim Salinger, six feet one, and six feet, respectively, were the tallest men on the squad. The only real highlight of the season, aside from beating an undefeated Rahway team, was the fine playing of Bill Krauss. Billy, who had a steady average of 13.3 points per game, played stellar ball all year, and became the fourth highest scorer in Linden High School history, with 222 points. This broke the record for the last ten years and overshadowed the 206 points made by Larry Kinsella in 1946-47. As far as the schedule went, Linden lost two straight before winning a game.
