BASKETBALL

This year's basketball team did better than any other team of the past five years, as it won ten games and lost six. The Tigers beat Rahway in the opener at the new McManus School behind Giff Weber's 17 points, but went on to lose the next four. Regional led all the way; Plainfield won in the final period, although Linden was ahead at the 3/4 mark. Rico Parenti had 33 points for the Cardinals. The Union game was lost in the final two minutes, while the second Rahway tilt was a very odd affair. Linden was behind 3-2 at the quarter, ahead 11-9 at halftime, tied 16-16 with 8 minutes to go, and still lost by 15! Then followed the longest winning streak of the past several years: six straight victories with an average of 61 points each. A new school scoring record was set in the Edison game as the regulars scored 37 points in 11 minutes. Jefferson then spoiled the string, as did Regional again. The regular season closed with three more wins. Each member of the starting quintet of Giff Weber, Ed Sassone, Al Klett, and the Givens brothers, Rosey and Dutchie, led the scoring at least once. Rosey had the most in one game, 23 against Plainfield, and was high for the season with 191 points in 16 games, followed by "set-shot" Sassone with 150, Weber with 141, Dutchie with 136, and Al Klett with 92.
