The Tigers were seeded fifth and drew the most powerful unseeded team for the first round, Irvington. 1951 TRACK SUMMARY

The 1951 Track Squad won two meets out of six. The Tigers just did not have the material of some of their predecessors, but did turn up with some outstanding individuals. In Roger Schuler and Walter Kozak, Coach Al Nogi had a pair of the top men in their respective departments, but lacked enough depth, especially in the running events, to turn out a winning contingent.

Schuler established the school individual scoring record, breaking the tape for 98 points. Probably the foremost aspect of his success was his versatility. He competed in the 100 and 220 yard dashes, the quarter mile, as well as the broad jump, and was a consistent scorer in each.

Kozak's talent was not as diversified as that of Schuler's, but he nevertheless racked up 63 points. He competed only in the shot-put and discus weight events, but took first in both divisions in every event. In the Union County Track meet Kozak came in second in the shotput with one of his poorer tosses. Schuler also gained honors in this meet, taking third place in the running broad jump. No other member of the local squad was able to score.

The Tigers opened the season with one-sided triumphs over Edison and Hillside, but dropped the last four meets of the campaign, all by comparatively close scores.

A PERSON SHOULD be prepared to take it on the chin, for hard knocks are a part of life. He should congratulate the man who gets the promotion he believes he should have had. Then, when the opportunity for promotion comes to him, he should be prepared to make the most of it.

MANY A MAN OR WOMAN has said, "If I had to do it all over again . . ." But no person was ever able to do that with his life. Time is against it. A graduate, at commencement, can avoid this regret.
