









PREFACE

One topic on the tongues of every student and teacher was the fact that Linden High School would be evaluated this year. The whole school prepared for the twenty-two evaluators who would stay at our school for three days in March. There was much work to do, but every faculty member and student carried out his job splendidly. We have taken this evaluation as our theme for the 1956 *Cynosure* and have tried to show what the evaluation will be based on.

The Cooperative Study of Secondary-School Standards was organized in 1933; it recommended that a secondary school be appraised by a self-evaluation first. Then, this self-evaluation is checked by a visiting committee composed of experienced and well-prepared professional workers in the field of education.

The 1956 Cynosure attempts to be a true yearbook — a book of the school year 1955-1956. Its contents are divided into four sections. Each section contains material which will be judged and evaluated by these educators. Starting with the faculty and continuing with the seniors and underclasses, we examine the records of these individuals. Then we check on the sports program and extracurricular activities.

It is our hope that this yearbook will be used in years to come to relive and re-evaluate memories of pleasant days and friendships in Linden High School.

With the fine playing of All-County and All-State Rich Sojka, the little Tigers produced another championship team. Linden, which had to share the crown with Summit last year, received the undisputed group III, section II state championship this year. Linden placed Joe Laucius, Stan Pokrywka, Ray Stagich, and Fred Luongo on All-County and All-State teams. Fred was one of the two juniors to place on the All-State first team.

In one of their two defeats, Linden suffered a 7-6 loss to Long Branch, one of the State's undefeated teams. Producing the largest output of points by a Linden High football team in ten years, Linden romped over Hillside 41-13.

Limiting their opponents to only 46 points, the Tigers had the best defensive record in the county and the second best in the state. In the total output of points, Sojka was third in the county with 70 markers. It was the first time in Linden High history that a football team has won two successive state championships.
