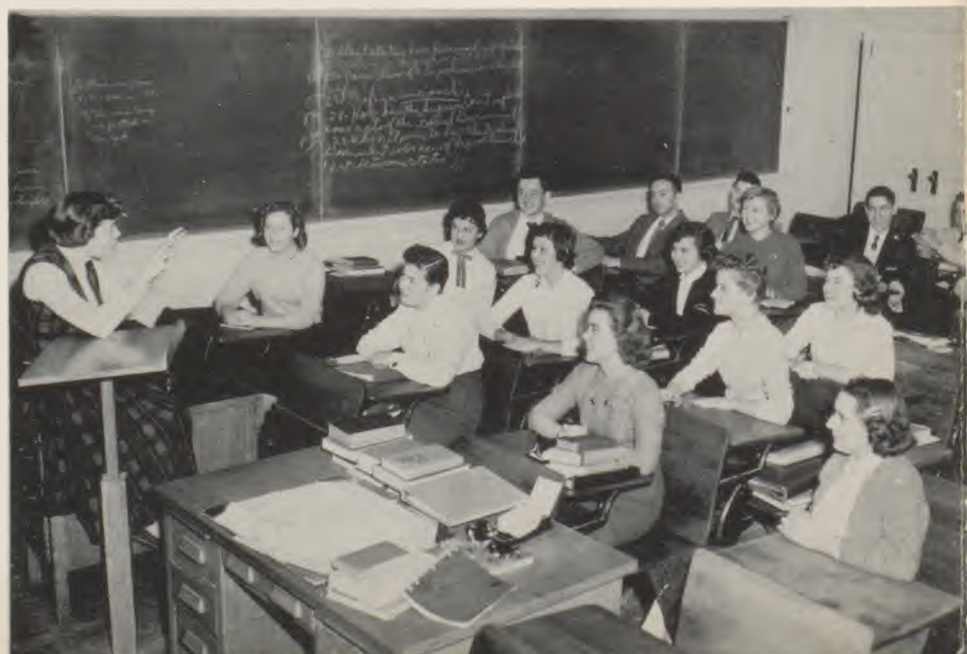

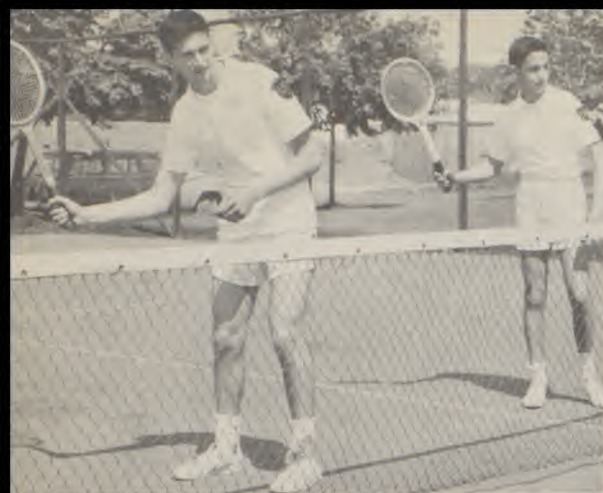

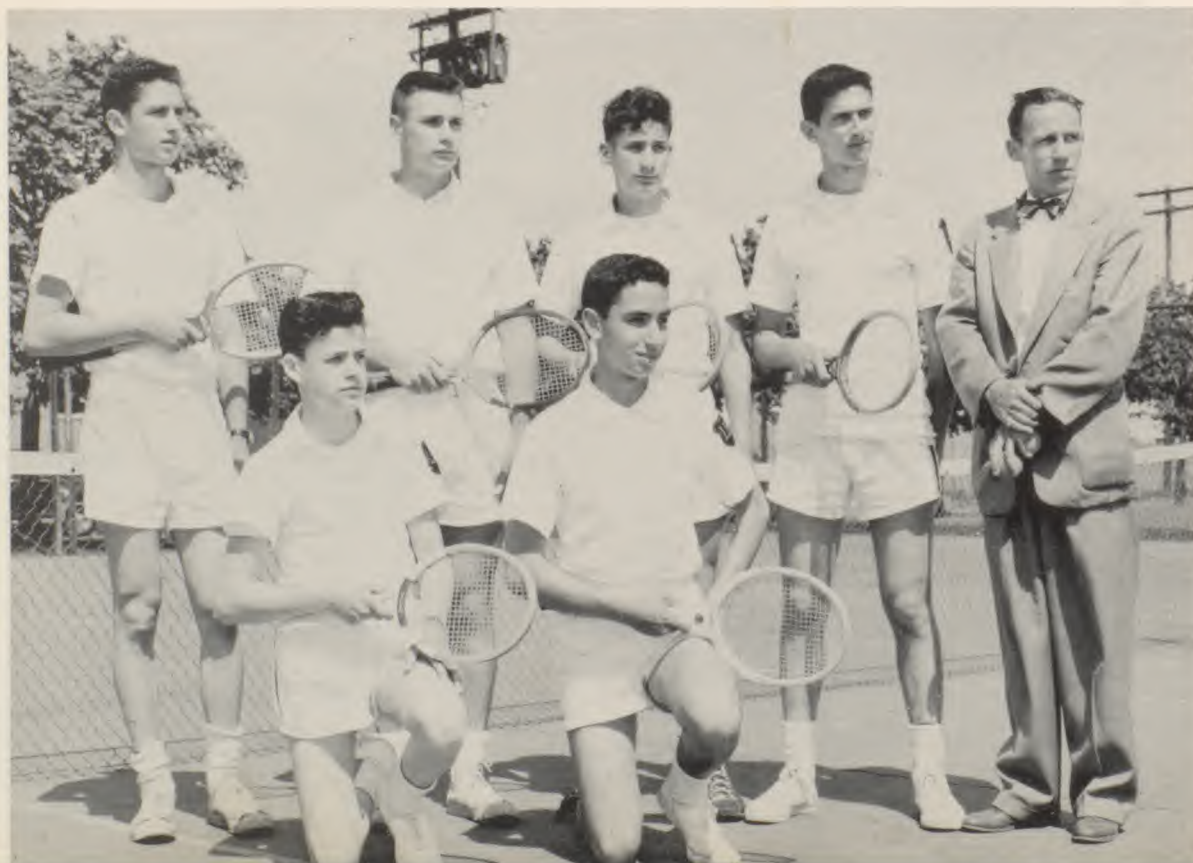

Although posting only a mediocre 3-5-1 season record, the Linden High School varsity football contingent came up with one of the biggest surprises in Union County gridiron annals when they tied highly-touted Union, who had been undefeated in eight previous contests, 6-6 in the Turkey Day classic. 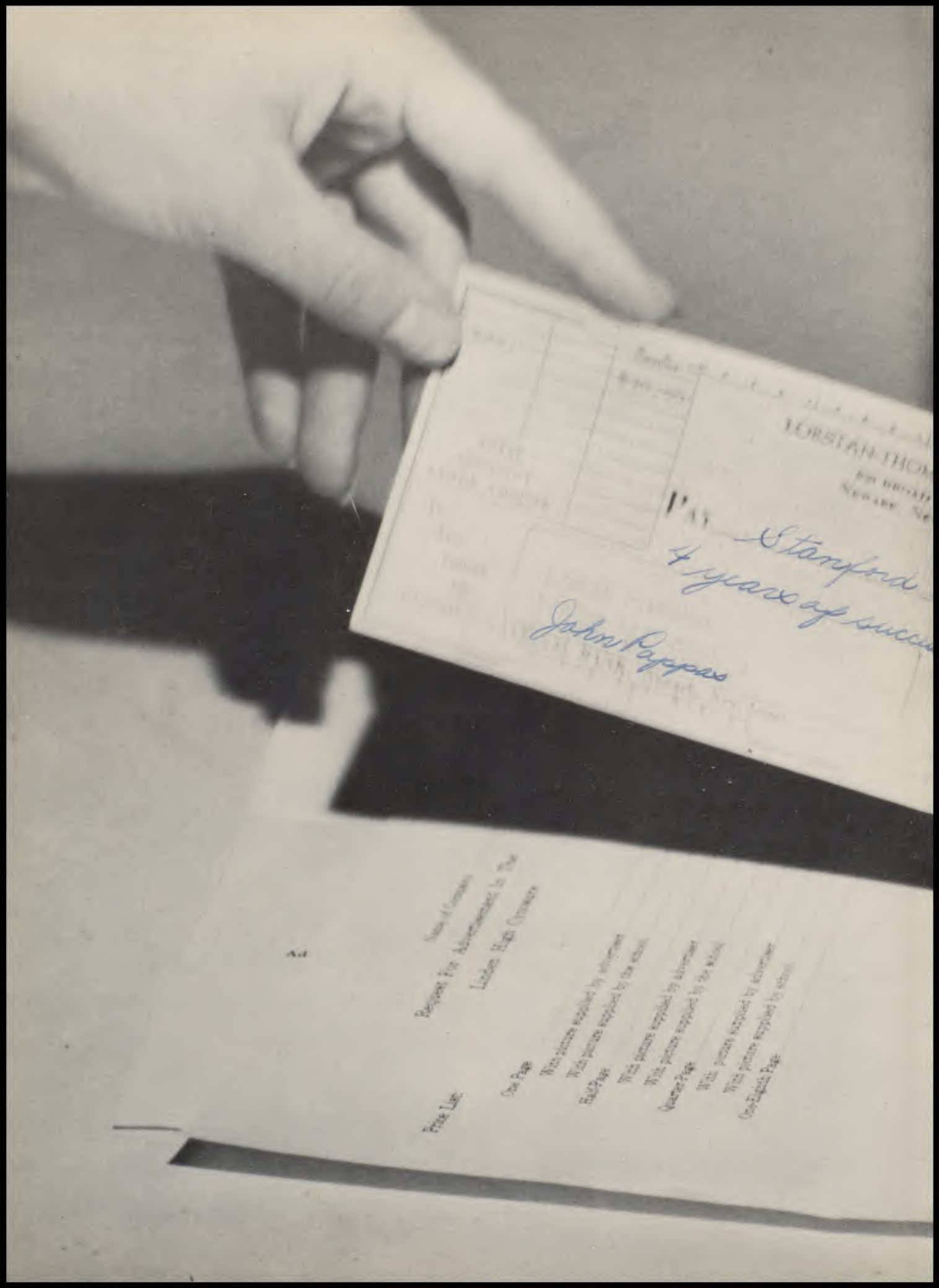

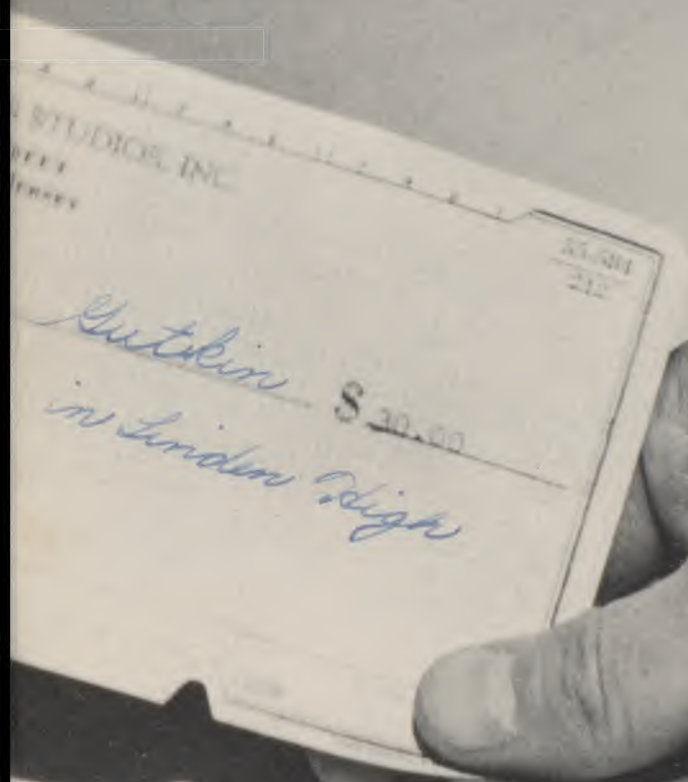

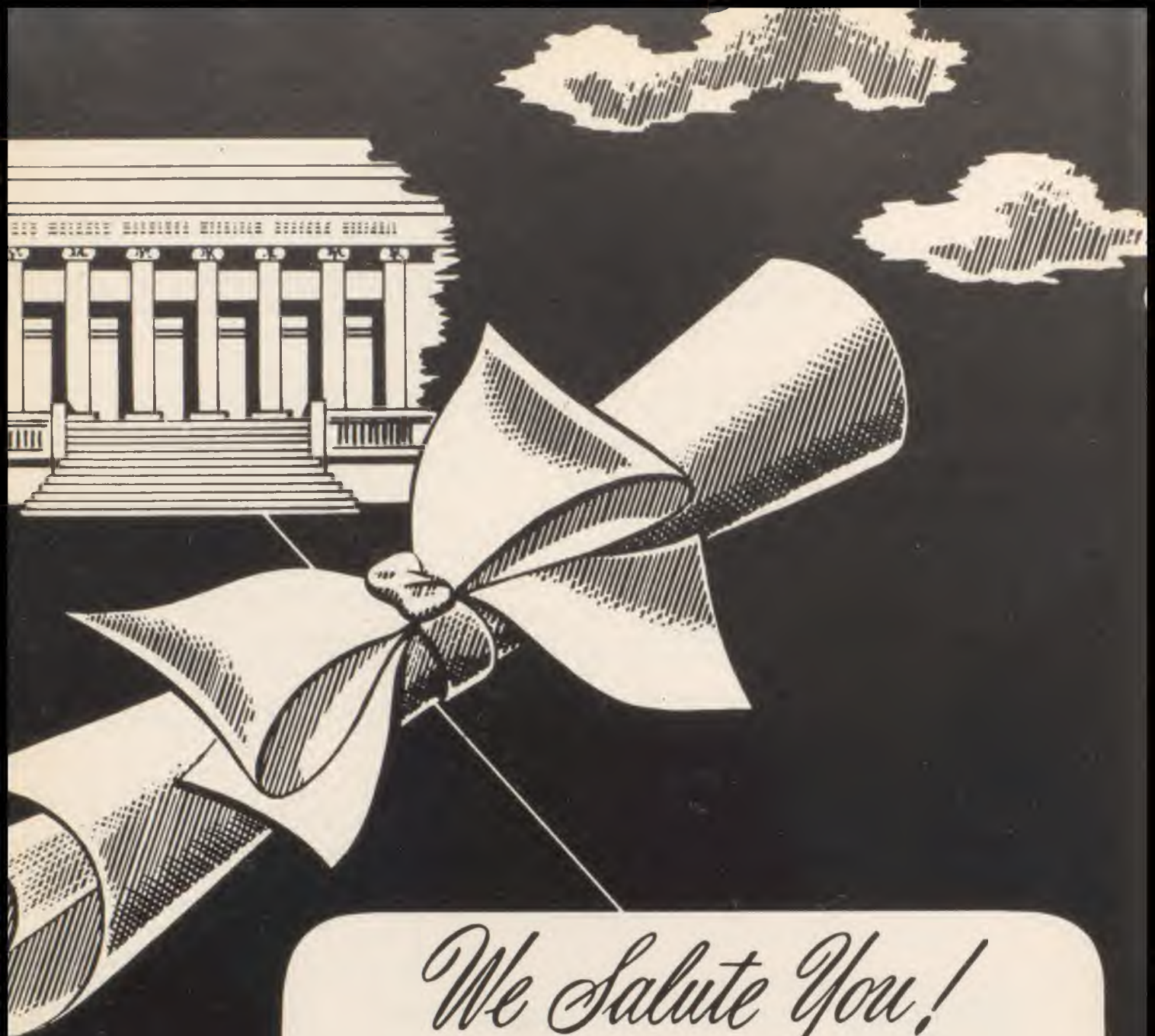
