Born in Shrewsbury, a small town in New Jersey, Miss Lang chose her life's work in the eighth grade. She attended Trenton State College and then went to New York University and Columbia University for further studies in the field of education. A rural school in the outskirts of Freehold, New Jersey, marked the beginning of her career. Not long after this, the Carteret Public School System hired her as an elementary school teacher. In 1926 Miss Lang came to Linden to teach the first continuation school class. This class consisted of students who began working before the age of sixteen and were therefore required to attend classes a stated number of hours a week until reaching that age at which state law allowed them to terminate their schooling. When continuation classes were no longer necessary, Miss Lang became first a Social Studies Teacher and then a guidance counselor.

Guidance has been the most rewarding and enjoyable facet of her career. This beneficent duty was not removed with her appointment as Assistant Principal; rather, more responsibilities added to it.

Throughout her career, she has performed her duties with capability and understanding. Because of this, the members of the **Cynosure** Editorial Staff dedicate this page to Miss Josephine Lang on the completion of a successful career.
