Explaining the Theme



A door represents an entrance or an exit, depending upon one's point of view, and, similarly, graduation from high school signifies a beginning or an end. In the senior section of this year-book, Christopher Morley's essay, "On Doors", is reprinted. It was this essay that inspired the theme for the 1964 Cynosure.

Because a yearbook is for underclassmen as well as seniors, it must be explained that doors have a meaning for everyone. Some people only halfopen doors, others boldly throw them open, while still others slam doors behind them. In Linden High School, many new doors are opened to its students. Throughout this yearbook, the many doors found in a school are shown. From the imposing portal at the front of the building to the little door on the janitors' closet, each has a meaning of its own.

Some doors are used so often that one takes them for granted and never notices them. Other doors lead to rooms and places no student has ever seen. But there is one door that has been opened to all the students, and, upon graduating, each sudent must decide whether this door is an entrance or an exit. It is called the door of knowledge.





"In serving the students, the students serve themselves" could very well be the motto of the student council, for it represents the collective effort of every student to improve his school. In having the student council serve us as they do in so many ways, we the students, serve our alma mater and the many good causes to which it is dedicated. The members of the council must be thanked by every pupil for their untiring efforts in improving the school, gauging and acting on majority opinion, and doing their best to make the council an effective organization we can be proud of.

Every year the council: establishes the service league that has become the communications and nerve system of our ever-expanding high school; revises the handbook to provide valuable information about the school and curricula for new students; revises the constitution to keep Linden in pace with the times; sponsors pep rallies to cheer our teams to victory; organizes the annual orientation day program to allow prospective sophomores the chance to become acquainted with L.H.S.; and awards an annual college scholarship to a deserving student. Many of these activities are being extended and many more are being successfully undertaken by the council.

But in serving the students of Linden High School devotedly, they have done much more than could ever be recorded here. The Student Council has accurately represented the opinions of our students and has striven to make our school a better and more interesting place in which to learn.



The General Council represents the apinions of all the Students and is responsible for the passage or veto of all legislation.

Just as it is every American citizen's duty to know about the form of his community government, it is necessary for every student to be familiar with his school government, for he is actually a citizen of an academic community. The student council is purposely designed to allow for the maximum of students' participation and in this way truly represent the students' attitudes. To do this, one representative and one alternate represent this homeroom in the General Council. It is this representative's duty to report back to his homeroom the decisions and activities of the General Council and to post the notes of each meeting on the room's bulletin board.

Once every year, elections are held in which every student votes for the four officers of the Student Council: the president, vice-president, treasurer, and secretary. Prospective legislation is suggested by students, discussed by the executive committee, sent to the general council for a vote, and is either voted down or passed and put into effect by the members representing the student body.

Every member of Linden High School is a member of the Student Council and is invited to suggest new legislation, attend meetings, and criticize constructively that which has been done in the past. Only through full student cooperation can the Student Council become an organization truly representative of all students.





Science

Mr. Hoffman, faculty sponsor of the Chromosome Club, soon to be called Future Scientists of America Club, feels that projects should serve two purposes. They should extend the student's grasp of the subject and should encourage the growth of the scientific attitude. To these ends, the members of the Future Scientists have concluded some very interesting and stimulating projects in such diverse fields as bacteriology, physiology, botany, protozoology, hematology, and biochemistry. The members choose whichever project area they like best and start to work.

The club organization meets formally the first and third Wednesdays of every month, but the researchers can work on their projects and get advice from Mr. Hoffman any day after school. Passing by room 201A on any day, you will probably notice most of the eight members, if not all, hard at work on their projects. With them, too, will be Mr. Hoffman, counseling, correcting, advising, and aiding the student explorers.

Individual effort and thought are the things which, according to Mr. Salzer, determine the real value of any science project. Because of this, the chemistry club, under the sponsorship of Mr. Salzer, extends to the student the opportunity to work independently on a project of his own choice. To a large degree, the student is also able to select his own methods of attack and research. Combined with this freedom, however, is the experienced advice of Mr. Salzer, who extends this unique opportunity of individual research to anyone with self-initiative and scientific curiosity.


There are no formal meetings, as such, and the club operates informally without elected officers or strict meeting times. Students can pursue their projects anytime after school and are often seen busily at work.

Above all, Mr. Salzer wishes to instill in the students the realization that science is an attitude that is applied for the solution of the problems confronting man. Members of the club apply the method themselves for the solution of such problems as the proof of the law of definite proportions, the concentration of hydrogen peroxide and its decomposition rate, oxidation and reduction of copper, molecular weights of organic compounds, diffusion rates of amonium hydroxide and hydrochloric acid, properties of silver compounds which form precipitates, and the number of atoms in a molecule of hydrogen.

In an atmosphere of relaxation and stimulation, the student learns the most important lessons of science for himself. Often, only through repeated failures does the researcher grasp the rudiments of scientific research: methods, attitude, and courage.

Both from the spirit of individual freedom, and the abundance of good advice, the experimenters progress to a fuller understanding of the scientific attitude and its remifications, and a greater appreciation of the scientific accomplishments of the past and present.






