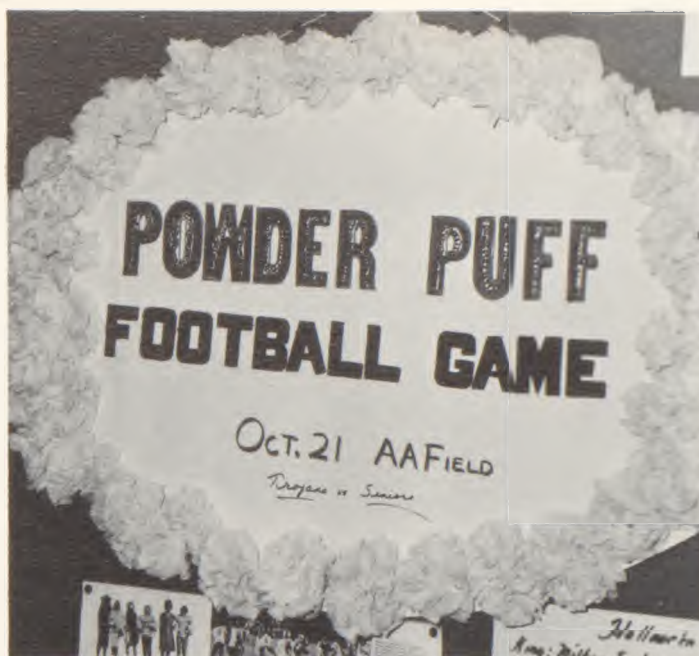

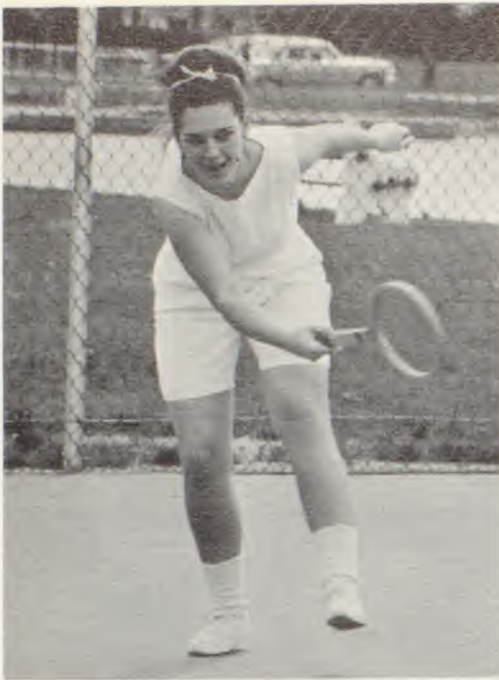

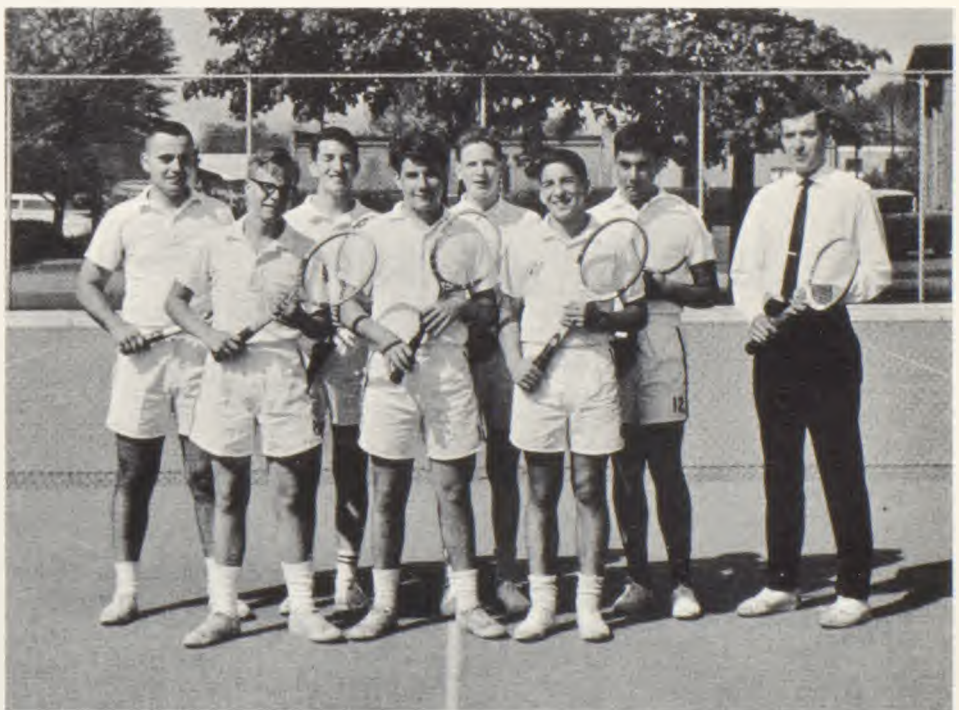

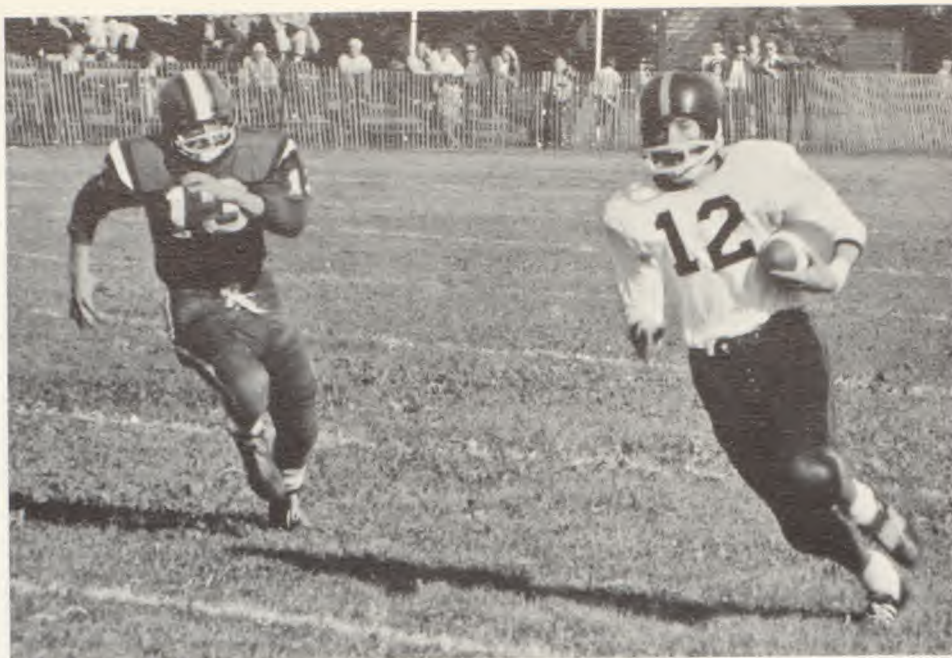

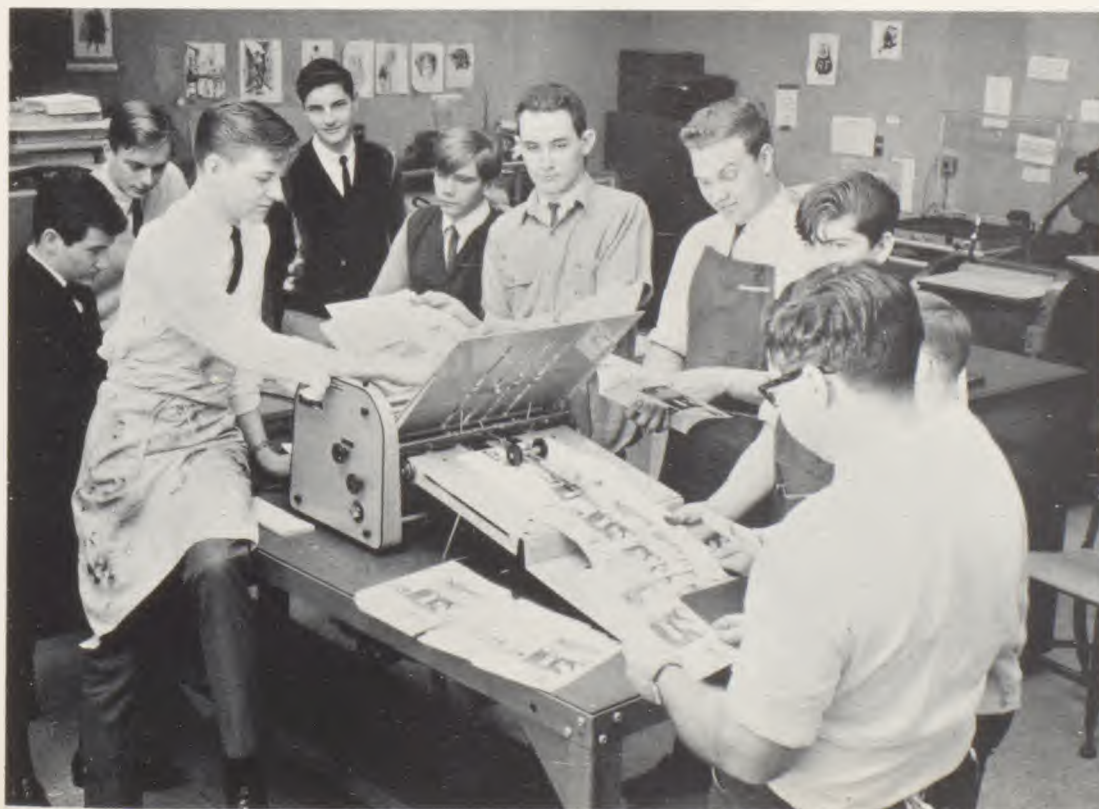
Chronicle gets the story!

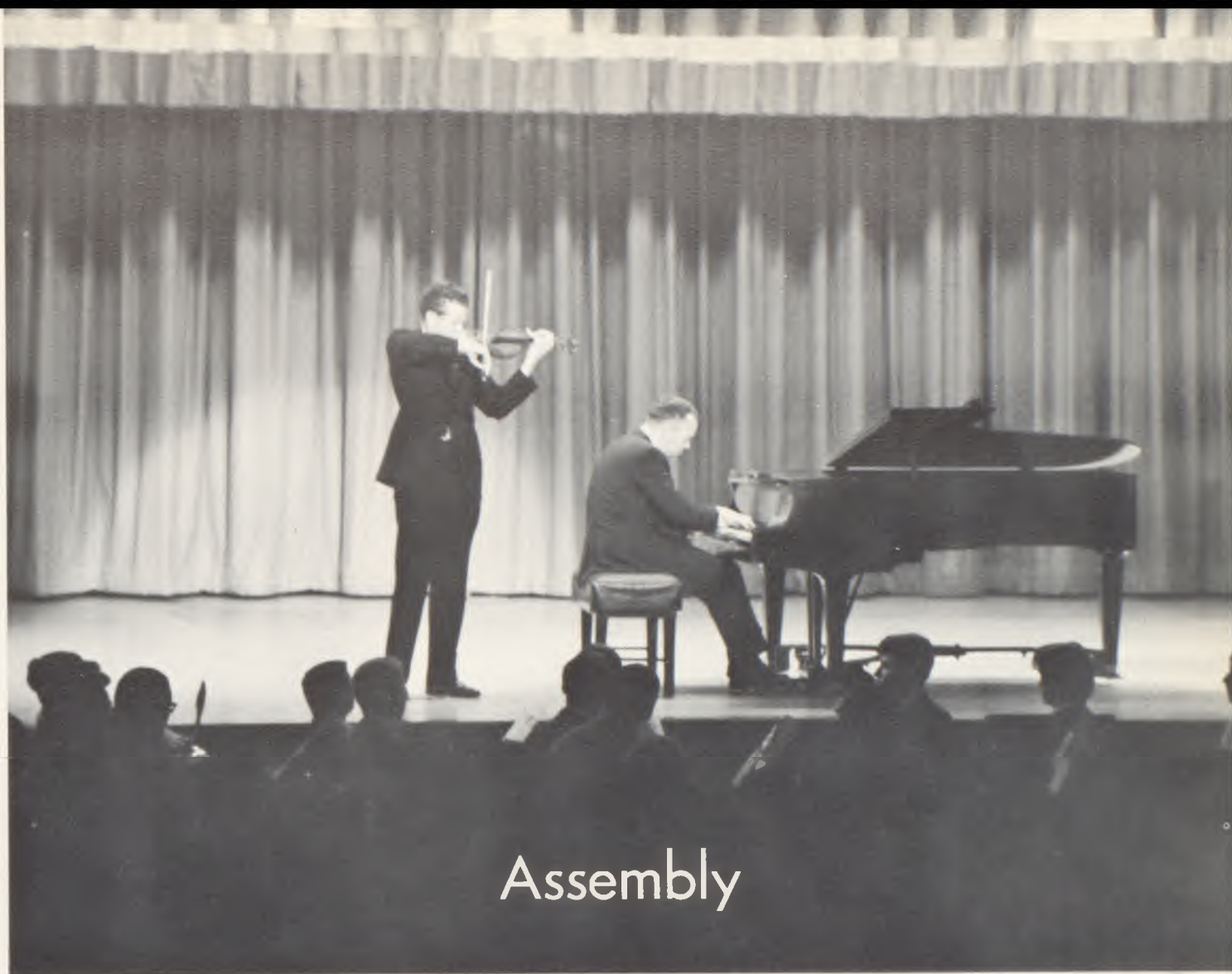

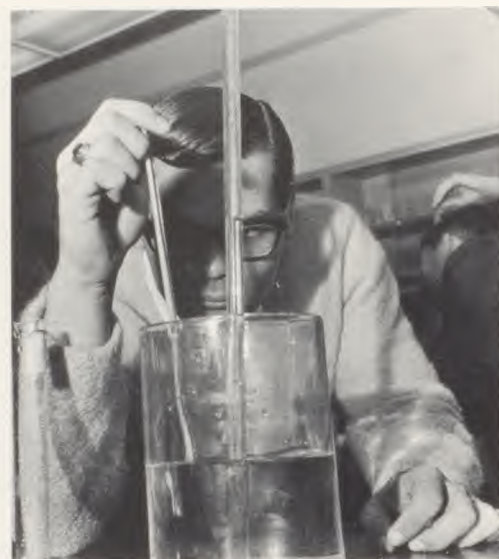

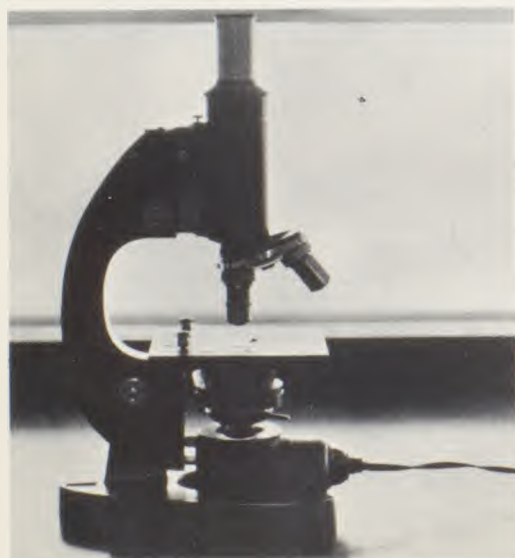
Both groups give their members an opportunity to learn and practice chemistry at their own will and the results are valuable to the student for the development of original and scientific thought.

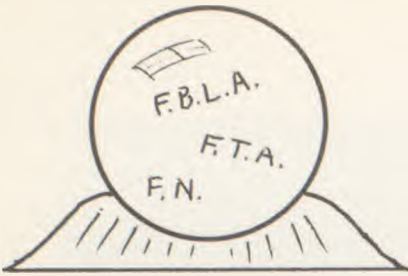

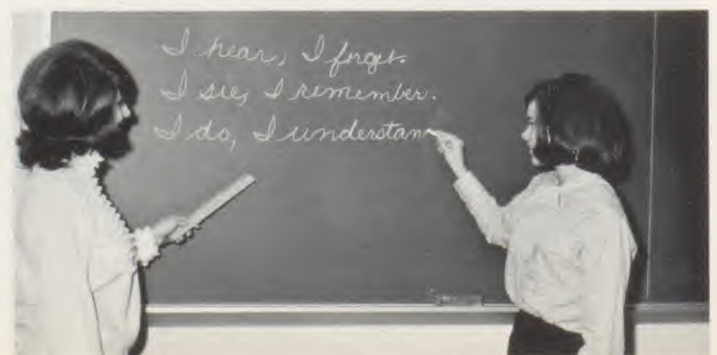

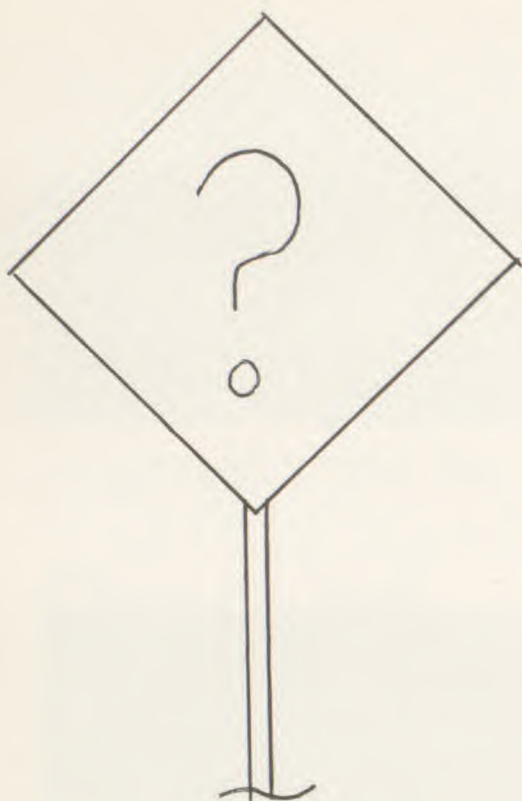

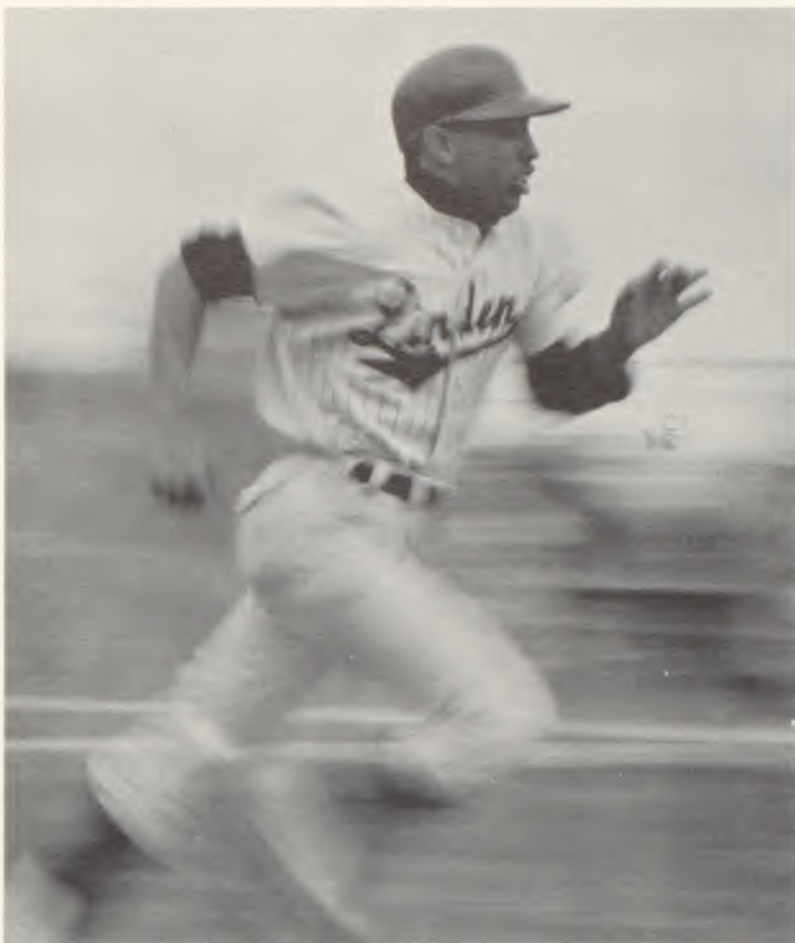

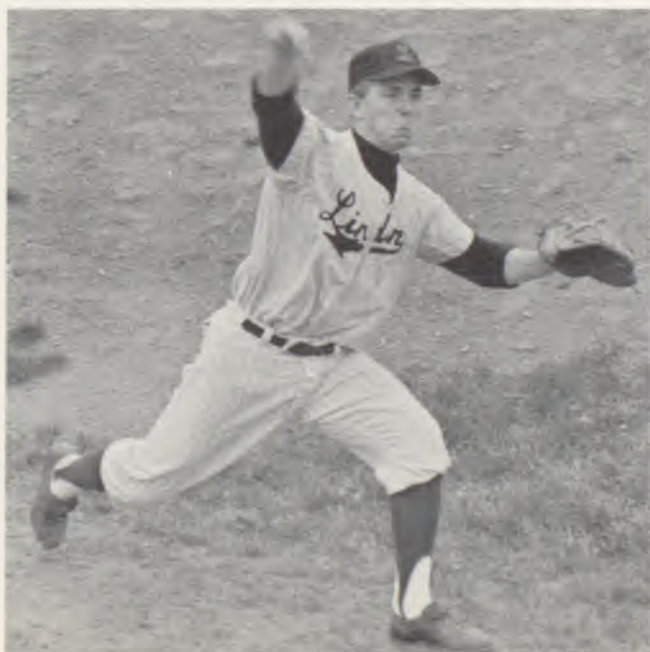

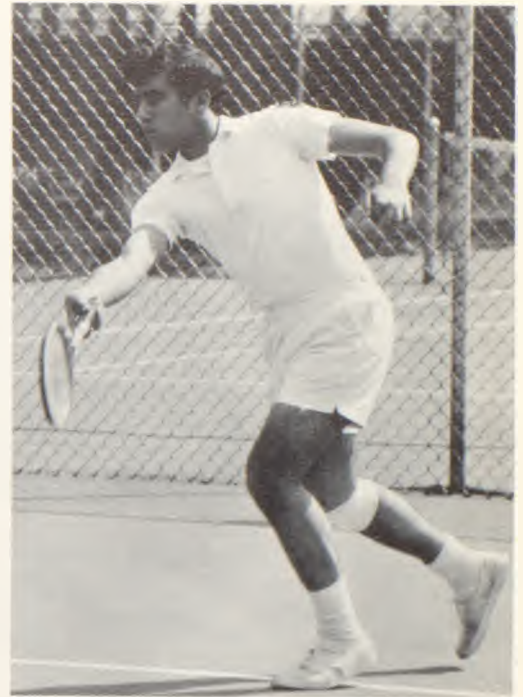

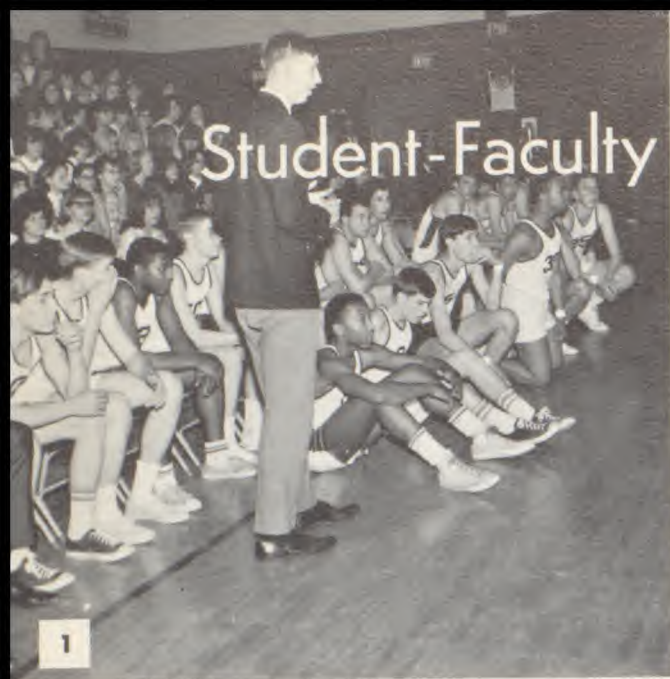
