










summer, during school, and in competitions. City Council honored the band for its participation in the Miss America Parade in Atlantic City.





Science staff praised for its excellence.

There is a new "addition" to the science department this year. No, it's not a teacher, but an adult-sized natural bone skeleton named "Horace," who has taken up residence in Mrs. Meril's Room, 215! A natural bone skeleton has a definite advantage over a plastic one. If a bone had been broken in a natural skeleton, it would have been visible in the healing process, which can also be observed.

Besides Horace, the science department has some other new items. All lab oriented sciences have been lengthened to six periods per week. This extra period allows students more time to complete their experiments. Mr. Salzer's Chemistry II is using a college textbook and Mr. Kaplan's applied science class has brand new books. In Mr. Hoffman's Biology I Honors Class an ecological approach is being taken in that science along with its new textbook. A new lab refrigerator has been purchased, also.

The Independent Study Program in Chemistry has been expanded from two senior students to seven. Mr. Salzer, who recently was awarded the "Metropolitan Regional Award" presented by the American Chemical Society, works

with the independent students. Mr. Salzer is working up a series of quantitative analysis experiments with Dr. George Luther, chairman of Chemistry and Physics at Kean College. These experiments will be performed by Independant Studies Students first at Linden High School. The students might then be allowed to verify their data at Kean College's labo-
