We, the Linden students of the yearbook staff, are pleased to offer you the 1986 CYNOSURE.

This edition of the Linden High School CYNOSURE was printed by Herff Jones Publishing Company in Gettysburg, Pennsylvania, using the offset lithograph process.

Advised by Mr. Frank Foley, Volume 66 had a press run of 600 copies featuring 224 pages printed in black ink on Bordeaux 80 lb. enamel gloss paper. The endsheets were studio designed in four color, #8617. In addition, four color was used in the Opening and Senior sections of the book. The Divider Pages utilized a 30% cyan screen.

The book's trim size is 9X12 inches and was Smyth sewn, rounded and backed, and bound on 160 point binder's board.

The custom embossed cover design features a gold metallay application to the school mascot, and silkscreening of the spine and title in Rich Gold #15 on Vibra Text Black base material. A crush grain pattern was also applied to the entire cover.

Garamond type in 8 point and 10 point was used throughout the book for captions and body copy. Headlines, subheads, and division pages were set in various point sizes using Garamond and Garamond Italic type faces.
