The Naval Junior Reserve Officer Training Corps is in its second year at Linden High School. The students who take the Naval Science course get instruction in navigation, sea-

manship, leadership, history, weather, and the operation of ships and airplanes. Of the 113 cadets enrolled, approximately 50% are boys and 50% girls. Navy provided uniforms are worn each Wednesday for the entire day. Fridays are devoted to physical fitness with the goal being all boys and girls exceeding the minimum Navy standards.

The NJROTC takes numerous field trips to activities in the local area in order to make classroom instruction more meaningful. Examples of trips this year are a four day experience in basic training at the USCG Training Center at Cape May, map training with the USMC at the Colts Neck Weapons Station, firefighting training, a day with the New Jersey National Guard, and a day with the Army at Fort Dix. The goals of the NJROTC include encouraging good study habits, patriotism, good health procedures and an appreciation for authority in a democratic society.

Cadets can participate in after school competitions against other JROTC high school teams in such activities as track, rifle team, drill team, and color guard. This year Linden hosted the first annual Martin Luther King Jr. North Jersey Drill Team competition on Dr. King's birthday.

The two Naval Science instructors are Commander Jadwin F. Sortore, USN (ret) and Senior Chief Petty Officer Raymond Guernic, USN (ret) who have had 51 years of active duty between them.

Colophon

The 1988 edition of the Linden High School CYNO-SURE was printed by Herff Jones Publishing Company in Gettysburg. Pennsylvania, using the lithographic process.

Advised by Mr. Frank Foley, Volume 68 had a limited press run of 500 copies featuring 224 pages printed in black ink. A 100 lb. premium European high gloss enamel paper slock is used in the first sixteen pages of the book. The remaining pages are 100 lb. Bordeaux gloss enamel. The white Colortext endsheets were school designed and printed in the four-color process. In addition to black ink used throughout, four-color was utilized in the first five signatures.

The book is Smyth-serve in sizteen page signatures, trimmed to 9 z 12 inches, rounded and backed and bounded on 160 point binder s board.

The Visia Custom Embossed cover design features a tip-on of the school mascol, with the title and spine blind embossed, and the theme, tip-on frame, and individual names foil stamped in orange. The base cover material is black Vibra Tex #41075 with a French Straight grain pattern applied.

All captions and body copy are set in eight and ten point Lydian type. Headlines, subheads, and division pages are set in various point sizes and type faces.
