VACATIONS

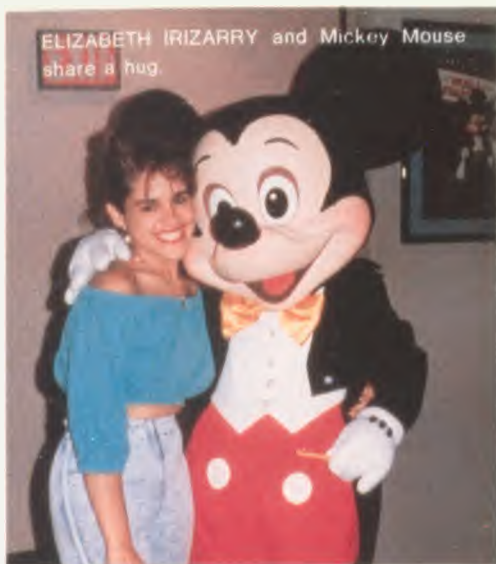

Entire Iraqi air force
reportedly 'decimated'



America's immediate reaction to the military maneuvers of Saddam Hussein in Kuwait was supplying U.S. troops and tanks to neighboring Saudi Arabia. Here the troops await further orders from the U.S.

On August 2, 1991, Iraqi forces invaded their tiny neighbor, Kuwait, in an attempt to reclaim land they say was rightfully theirs. Immediately, the U.S., part of a 28 nation coalition sanctioned by the UN, sent troops and equipment to prevent the Iraqi forces from further advancement and to aid in the liberation of Kuwait. After five and a half months of Iraq's occupation of Kuwait, the amassed allied forces unleashed the first stage of the Gulf War, the air assault. For thirty-eight days, hundreds of thousands of sorties were flown over Iraq and Kuwait which dealt a crippling blow to the Iraqi forces. In the meantime, tens of thousands of Iraqi soldiers surrendered to allied forces and a possible end to the Gulf War was evident. On the thirty-eighth day of the Gulf War, the ground assault was initiated. Three days after the mobilization of the ground forces, Kuwait was liberated and the remaining allied forces in Iraq continued to push the crippled Iraqi Army back. One hundred hours after the start of the ground war, at midnight on February 28, President Bush ordered a cessation of hostilities, an end to the actual fighting. Though the war is over, allied troops will remain in the Middle East to keep the peace and to aid in the reconstruction of Kuwait.

The 1991 edition of the Linden High School CYNOSURE was printed by Herff Jones Publishing Company in Gettysburg, Pennsylvania, using the lithographic process.

Advised by Ms. Patricia Gergely, Volume 71 has a limited press run of 500 copies featuring 224 pages printed in black ink. An 100 lb. premium European high gloss enamel paper stock is used in the first 16 pages of the book. The remaining pages are 80 lbs. Bordeaux gloss enamel. The endsheets are vibracolor #02. In addition to black ink used throughout, four-color was utilized in the first five signatures.

The book is Smyth-sewn in sixteen page signatures, trimmed to 9x12 inches, rounded and backed and bound on 160 point binder's board.

The Custom Lithographed cover was designed by John Sullivan, Herff Jones artist, at our design clinic in May, 1990. The cover is four-color designed featuring the school mascot with the title and date on the spine. The theme statement "Reflections" was stamped on the cover with a F5 orange foil. Individual names are foil stamped in silver. The base material is white litho. It is laminated and embossed with a French Straight Grain Pattern.

All captions and body are set in eight and ten point Helvetica type. Headlines, Subheads, and division pages are set in Helvetica medium in various point sizes.


