The 1992 edition of the Linen High School CYNOSURE was printed by Herff Jones Publishing Company in Gettysburg, Pennsylvania, using the lithographic process.

Advised by Mrs. Bernodette Camponale, Volume 72 has a press run of 300 copies featuring 224 pages printed in black ink. An 100 lb. premium Europeon high gloss enamel paper stack is used in the first 16 pages of the book. The remaining pages are 80 lbs. Bordeaux gloss enamel. In addition, to black ink used throughout, fourcolor was utilized in the first five signatures.

The book is Smyth-sewn in sixteen page signatures, trimmed to 9×12 inches, rounded and backed and bound on 160 point binder's board.

The Custom Lithographed cover was designed by John Sullivan, Herff Jones artist. The cover is three-color designed featuring the yearbook theme and logo, with the title and date on the spine. Individual names are foil stamped. The base material is white litho. It is laminated and embossed with a French Straight Grain Pattern.

All captions and body are set in eight and ten point Roman
