An Amtrak train hurtled off a bridge into an inky bayou in Saraland, Alabama, early on the morning of September 22, 1993, plunging its sleeping passengers into a nightmare of fire, water and death.

It was the deadliest wreck in Amtrak's 23-year history. But 159 people survived, and some helped other passengers who clung to wreckage from a collapsed section of the bridge in a swamp crawling with alligators and snakes.

The Los Angeles-to-Miami Amtrak train crashed at about 3 AM, about 10 miles north of downtown Mobile. All three engines and four of the eight cars went off the bridge. Two of the cars were passenger cars; one was completely submerged in water about 16 feet deep.

Declaring that "the times are changing," Ruth Bader Ginsburg in 1993 became the second woman to sit on the United States Supreme Court.

At her swearing in ceremony at the White House on August 10, the 60-year-old women's rights pioneer said that "in my lifetime, I expect there will be among federal judicial nominees."





Nancy Kerrigan, the 22-year-old U.S. figure skater who was among the gold medal favorites at the 1994 Winter Olympics, was attacked after practice on January 6, 1994, by a man who hit her on the right leg with a club or metal bar.

Within days an anonymous phone call to authorities pointed to Kerrigan's rival, Tonya Harding, and a few of her entourage.

Harding's ex-husband, Jeff Gillooly, her bodyguard, Shawn Eckardt, and two hired men were arrested.

The Dallas Cowboys won their second straight National Football League championship and the Buffalo Bills earned a sadder spot in sports history by losing their fourth straight Super Bowl.

Dallas defeated the Bills 30-13 on Sunday, January 30, 1994, scoring 24 unanswered points in the second half after trailing 13-6 at halftime.

At 4:13 AM on Monday, January 17, 1994, an earthquake of 6.6 magnitude (Richter scale reading) struck Southern California, claiming 61 lives and leaving damage that may total \$30 billion

Five interstate highways, including the state's major north-south route, and three state highways were closed at several points, crippling transportation.

The 1994 edition of Cynosure was printed by Herff Jones Publishing Company at 525 Boyds School Road, Gettysburg, Pennsylvania using the lithographic process. Advised by Ms. Patricia Gergely, Volume 74 has a press run of 500 copies featuring 231 pages printed in black ink. A 110 lb. premium allegiance paper stock is used for the first 16 pages of the book. The remaining papers are 80 lb. Bordeaux. In addition to black ink, four color process was used in the first three signatures of this book. The books is Smyth-sewn in 16 page signatures trimmed to 9x12 inches, rounded, backed and bound on 160 point binder's board.

The Custom Lithographed cover was designed by Herff Jones artist Ryan Stouch with input from the yearbook staff. The cover is a two color design featuring the yearbook theme and logo with the title and date on the spine. Names are foil stamped in silver foil. The base material is white litho, laminated. Captions and body are set in Helvetka type set in 8 and 10 point. Headlines, Subheads and Division pages are set in various type sizes.
