


Education is a puzzle. Each new bit of information a student picks up is pieced together so that upon graduation he is prepared to face the world.







The book is Smyth sewn in 16 page signatures, trimmed to $8 \rightarrow x$ 11, rounded, backed and bound on 160 point binder's board.

The custom designed cover was designed by Herff Jones artist Scott Cool and Ms. Gergely. It is a 2 color design featuring a full color photo on a black background. The yearbook theme and title are featured. Names are foil stamped in gold foil. The base material is white litho, laminated. Captions and body are set in Cheltenham set in 8 and 10 point.
