









Advised by Patricia Gergely, Volume 77 has a press run of 400 copies featuring 160 pages printed in black ink. a 110 lb. premium paper was used throughout the book. In addition to black ink, four color process as used in the first three signatures of the book. The book was Smyth sewn in 16 page signatures, trimmed in 8 > X 11, rounded. backed and bound in 160 point binder's board.

The cover was custom designed by Herff Jones artist Ryan Stouch and Ms. Gergely. It is a 3 color design featuring artwork designed by the artist. The yearbook theme and title are featured. Names are foil stamped. The base material is white litho laminated. Captions and body are Americana set in 8 or 10 point. Headlines, subheads, and division pages have type size set in various sizes.
