A Message From Mr. Crehan . . .

Our aims in this war have been stated in many ways by many persons. The statements vary in character from the concise Atlantic Charter to detailed descriptions of a post-war world organization. Expressed or implied in all of them, however, the thought persists that there must not be another war, that there must be devised a practical plan for a lasting world peace.

There have been many attempts during the centuries to eliminate the crime of war, or to diminish its frequency. They have ranged from the Pax Romana to the League of Nations. All such attempts have so far failed.

Moreover, our American plan of political isolation has not kept even us at peace. We have seen in 1917 and again in 1941 that we are inextricably bound up in the affairs of the world, that we cannot remain at peace while the rest of the world is at war. We should know now that peace as well as war is indivisible.

Despite the failure of our past national policy to keep us at peace, and of all attempts to organize the world for permanent peace, the search must go on. The end of this war will give us another chance, perhaps our last, to build a peaceful world.

What responsibility will you, the members of the class of 1944, have for the solution of this problem?

You have the obligation to inform yourselves about the problems of world peace, to study the plans that have been made in the past, and to learn why they failed. You must understand the factors economic, technological, social, racial, political, psychological—which operate to place practical limitations on international action. You must develop a sympathetic and receptive understanding of other peoples. You must discover what the United States can do to help build a just and lasting peace. For "blood and tears shall be the inheritance of that people who neglect to learn and to teach . . . that it is necessary for men to live at peace if they want to live at all."

khaki. Now the challenge is to us. We, the graduating class of 1944, must give of our best in defense of our high principles, for we are America's citizens of tomorrow.

We look back, some of us with nostalgia, some with regret for wasted opportunity, some with a feeling of accomplishment, upon our three years at Columbia. And these are the things we remember.

We were sophomores when the United States entered the war. Since then, the members of our class have been witnesses and active participants in a great many innovations brought about in a necessary effort to adapt us to a war-time world. There were, of course, changes in curricula; new subjects were introduced preparatory to our active participation in the war. Special emphasis was placed upon mathematics and the sciences, as preparation for our imminent induction into the armed services.

of a physical education program consisting of five classes a week.

Its six divisions—General, Community Service, Production, Land, Sea, and Air—were organized as a preparation for military service and as an aid to the war effort. Through the General Division of the Victory Corps was launched the memorable bond drive of 1942, which raised \$115,000.

In recent years, one of our most vivid recollections of high school days will be Columbia's football games. Who can ever forget those thrilling Saturday afternoons at Underhill Field, or who can forget our traditional Thanksgiving games with West Orange? This year, it is true, our victories were few. The stars of last year's team had been graduated or had entered the armed services, leaving Columbia a new, untrained team. Although we lost the majority of this year's games, the team improved remarkably as the season progressed, and always displayed a brilliant spirit.

CAMOUFLAGE CLUB

The Camouflage Club, begun last year to assist anyone interested, discusses the art of camouflage at its monthly meetings, and its members learn how to apply their knowledge on models. The club also urges its members to try their own ideas and, if possible, add to what is already known about this comparatively new war science.

Camouflagers learn that there is no black magic about camouflage and by their own efforts discover that it is a combination of hard work, imagination, and common sense. On small models and sketches of troops, military works, or supplies, members learn to trick the observer by camouflage. Three fundamental practices are (1) to hide the object, by using material or artificial structure that blends with the background; (2) to blend background with pattern, texture, tone, and color in order to make it indistinguishable from landscape; (3) to deceive the eye with decoys and dummies that distract attention from vital points.

VICTORY CORPS

The High School Victory Corps was suggested by the Office of Education in Washington, D. C., as a means through which the pupils in all the high schools of the land may identify themselves with the war effort. Each school is completely free to work out its own program, and here at Columbia the Victory Corps is administered by a Victory Corps Committee composed of the Director, the teacher sponsors of the five special divisions of the Victory Corps, and seven pupils. Sophomores can qualify for general membership only, but juniors and seniors may qualify for one of the five special service divisions, after they have first fulfilled the requirements for the general membership. The Victory Corps started here at Columbia with 343 charter members.

The Victory Corps is now in its second year. Throughout its existence it has served as a reservoir

of help to all community and school wartime emergency projects. Members have aided substantially in two scrap drives in Maplewood and four in South Orange. The Community Service Division has supplied clerical help to various defense agencies in the two communities. The Corps has set up a central committee to co-ordinate all the wartime activities of the school.

The Corps participated in the U. S. Treasury Schools at War Treasure Drive, February 14 to 18, in which one hundred incomplete stamp books were uncovered to help swell the total sum raised in the Fourth War Bond Drive.

The Community Service Division sells War Savings Stamps regularly while the Sea Service Division sells bonds.

The Production Service Division is sponsoring a weekly course in agriculture for those boys and girls who plan to do patriotic work on farms this spring and summer.

Displaying a spirit and determination that overcame inexperience, Columbia's eleven finished its 1943 football season with a hard-fought scoreless tie with the traditional turkey-day rival, West Orange. Following an exciting triumph over East Orange, this game concluded a season of two victories, six defeats, and one tie.

After suffering their first defeat at the hands of Kearny in twenty years, by a score of 20-6, the Cougars came back at full strength to trip Plainfield, 12-0. Paced by the speed and deception of two good backs, Morristown's strong team blasted the home forces, 30-6. A week later, a last-minute pass for a tally brought a disillusioned crowd surging to its feet in the Orange tussle, but the unsuccessful extra point attempt gave the Cougars their third loss, 7-6. Following a 21-0 defeat at the hands of Westfield, Columbia came back to battle a Montclair team, on a muddy, rain-soaked gridiron, and lost only through two long Mountie scoring thrusts in the second period. New Brunswick crushed the Cougars, 24-0.

No individual star has emerged from the season, but many potentially good players seem to be lacking only experience and the improvement that comes with it. Only eight members of the squad will be lost by graduation.

A few sparkling plays will be remembered from the season of '43; the brilliantly executed quarterback sneak against Plainfield, the last minute pass against Orange, and the two scores against East Orange, but what will really live is the spirit of an out-classed, out-played eleven, which fought through a discouraging season and came up to a magnificent conclusion.

There is little to say, however, about wonderful plays, newspaper writeups, or colorful runs and passes. There can be no flaming adjectives injected in this article about crushing scores or brilliant blocking or excellent kicking. But there is a measure stick, one and one only, by which the team can be compared to former gridiron aggregations. That measurement is spirit, and it can be safely recorded that the 1943 eleven lived up to that standard throughout its rough schedule. That is a tribute which no one can discolor or dispute; that tribute, alone, should shine forth from the thirty-six players who were the team of ²43!

SENIOR PROPHECY

J., one day, because all nine major candidates were scheduled to give speeches there; and I decided to find out if any Columbia graduates still lived in the vicinity. I soon discovered that Barry Hutchings and Bill Clingan are well-known chemical engineers and are carrying on some research for the government on account of the discovery of a deposit of uranium ore in Maplewood.

The city of Orange, not to be out-done by Boston, now has its own symphony orchestra, under the able direction of Don Satterfield, and appropriately called "The Orange Pops."

Returning to the train just as the last speech was over, I noticed many new passengers boarding it. Among them I recognized Beverly Jones and Milly Kunz who were on leave from the State Mental Hospital (where they are employed as psychiatrists!). As usual, Beverly started talking; and I soon learned that Jack Drury and Dick Witzig are still trying to organize a Cougar Alumni Dance with everyone attending; and that Ferd Gaukstern and Nancy Macdonald, former Junior Night stars, are now in Hollywood with the Bob Olwine Telecast.
