Our three years are rapidly drawing to a close. Shortly we shall find ourselves facing a world with its many uncertainties and problems. It is now up to us to carry on in the tradition of Columbia High School.


COLUMBIA 13, EAST ORANGE 7







Again congratulations are in order for Mr. Hack as he continues to put good teams in the pool.


