

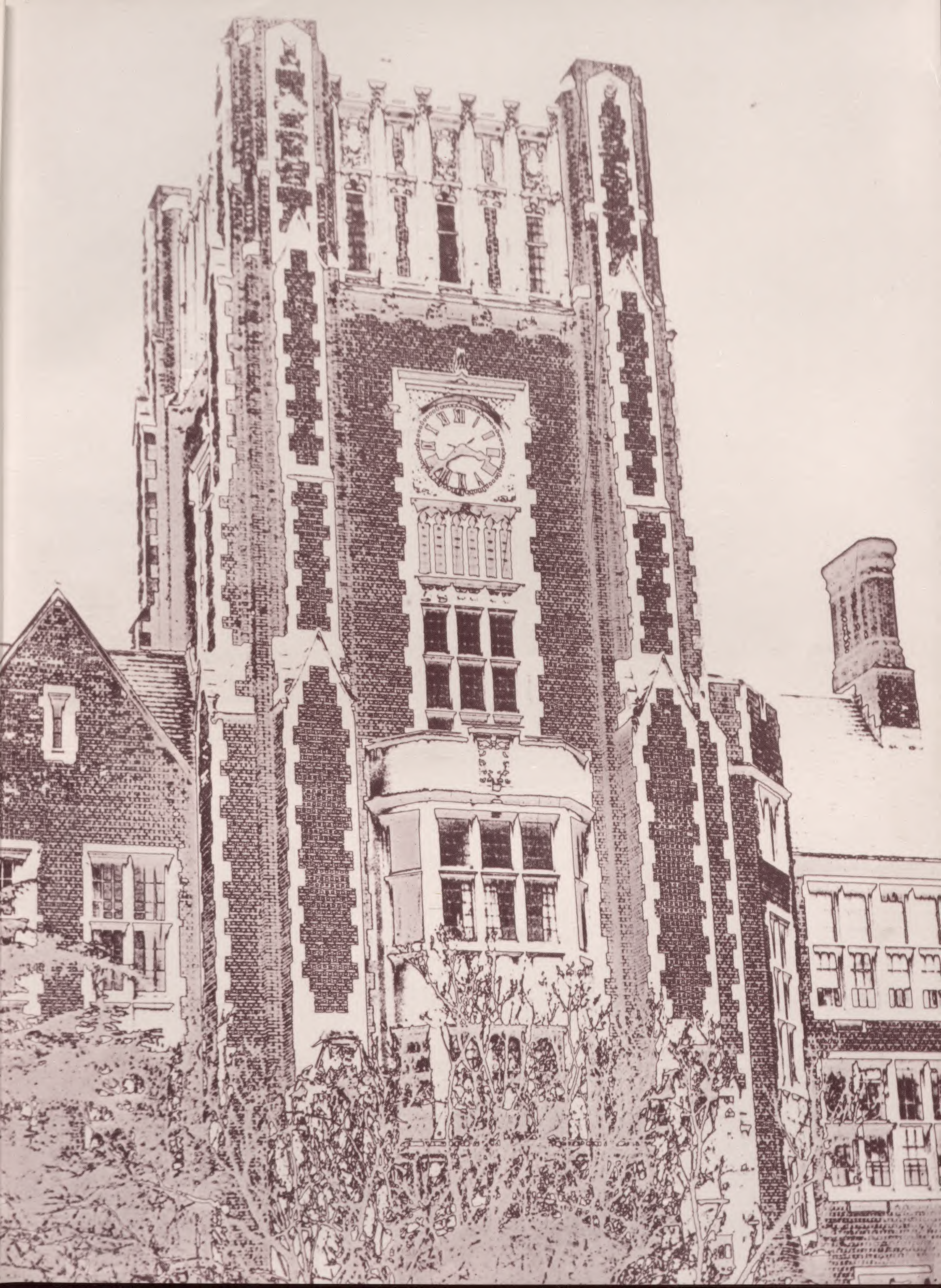

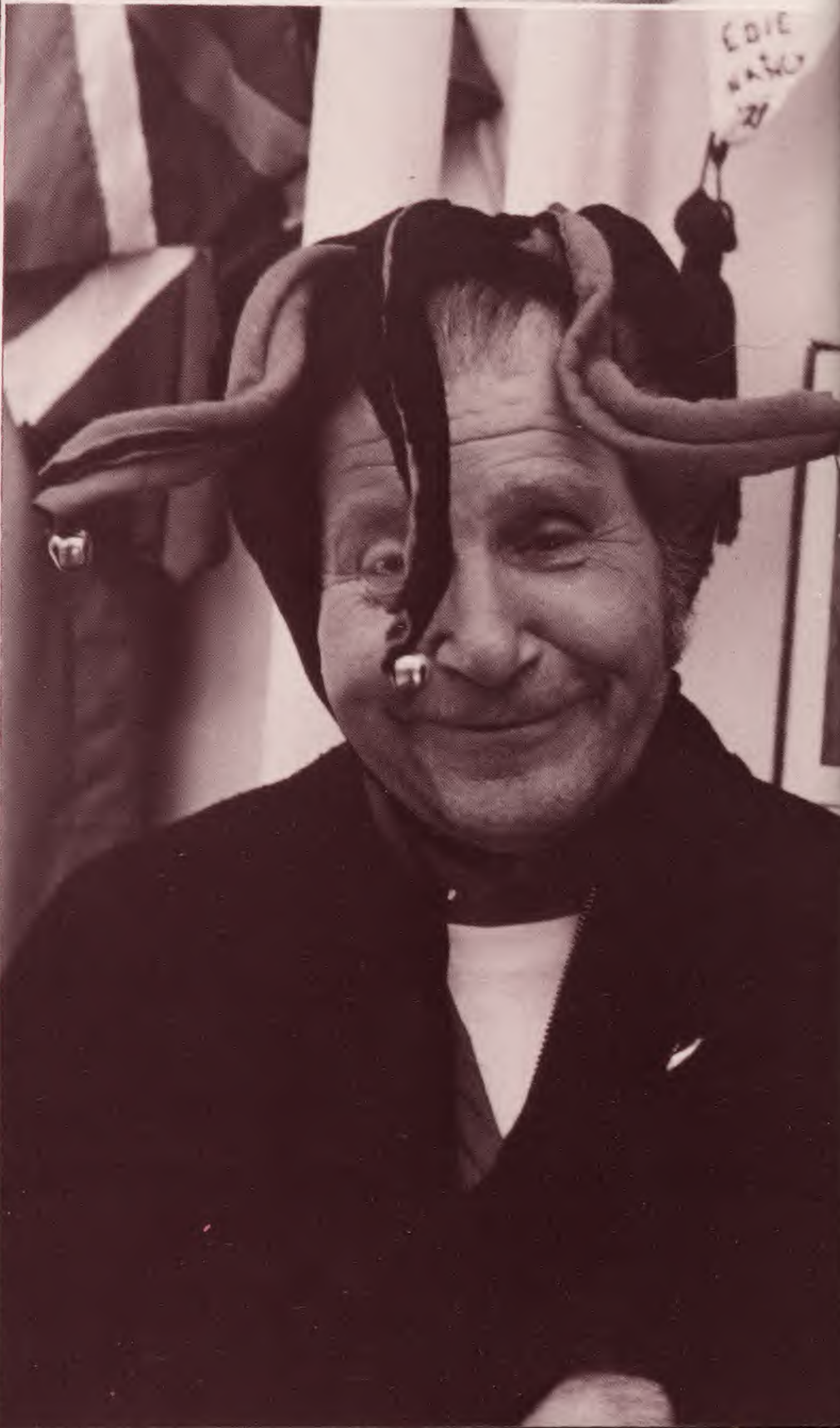

The way we were. We will never be the same again.



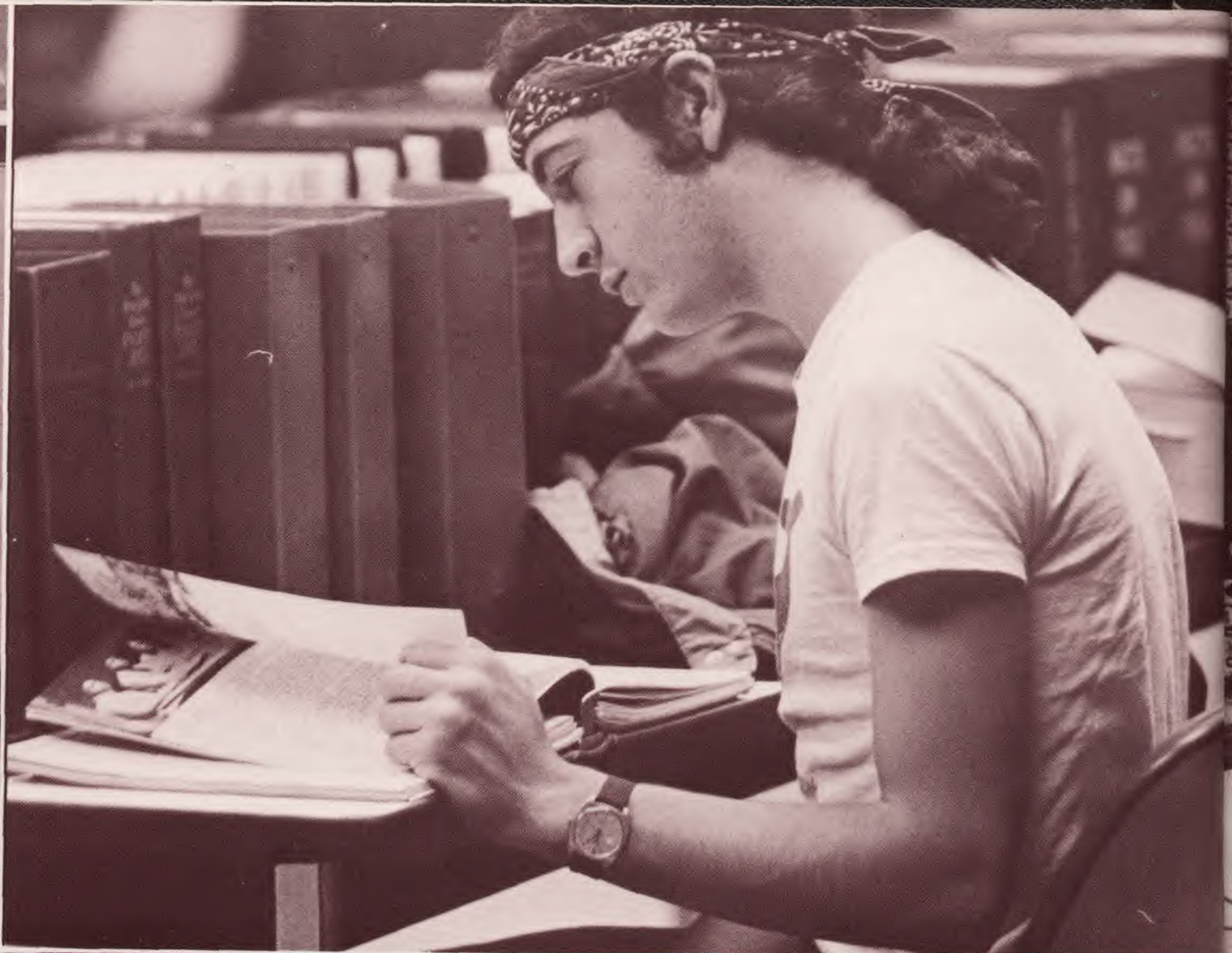
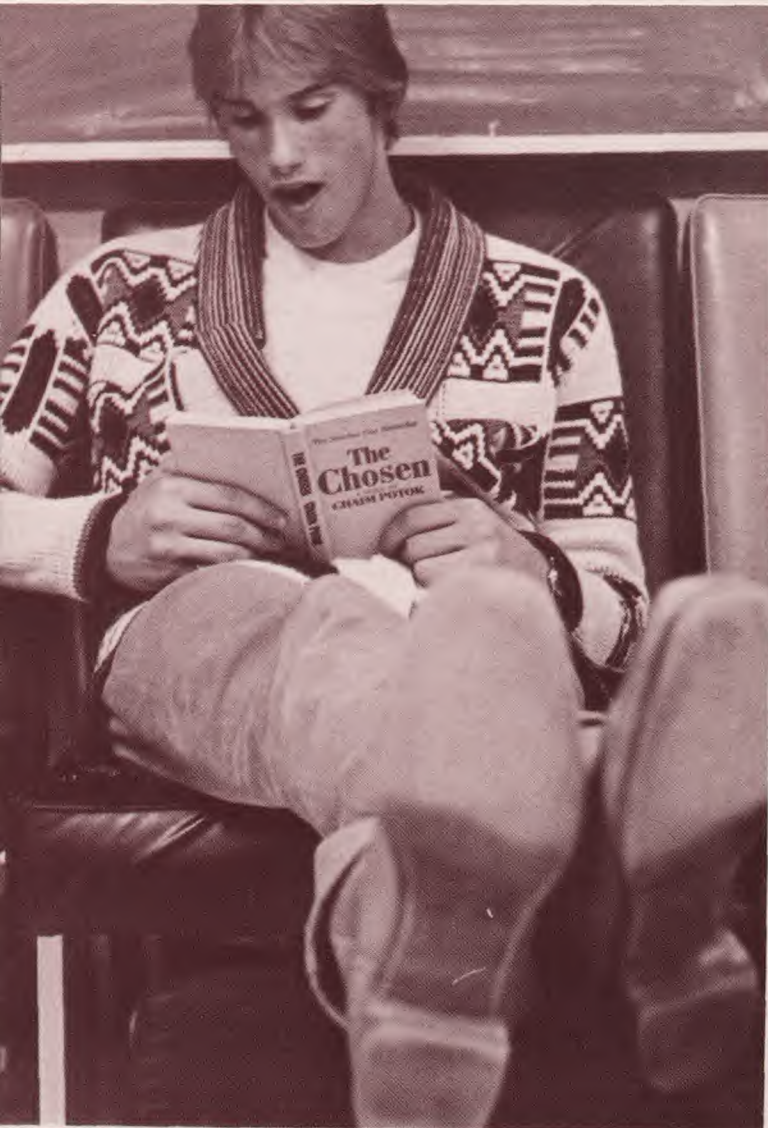

December, 1975-Dr. Max Shaw, superintendent of schools for South Orange-Maplewood, proposes a budget of approximately \$15,286,000 for the 1976-77 school year.

February, 1976-The Board of Education slashes Shaw's budget by \$611,224 to \$14,675,000. Of that sum, approximately \$340,000 had been included in anticipation of state action on funding of the teacher pension plan. Thus, no cuts in services or personnel resulted from the cut to \$14.9 million. However, the remaining cut (approximately \$300,000) resulted in cuts of personnel in the district. (see accompanying box).

March 4, 1976-The Board of School Estimate meets to set the level of local taxes to be raised for education in South Orange-Maplewood next year. They postpone decision past the legal deadline.

March 16, 1976-The Board of School Estimate, BSE, approves the raising of only \$12,282,410 in local taxes for 1976-77.

March 16, 1976-The Board of Education announces its intention of appealing the board of School Estimate's decision to the State Commissioner of Education.

May 5, 1976-Students of Columbia High School stage a rally in Memorial Park to demand full funding of the \$14,675,000 budget.

May 6, 1976-The State Senate begins discussion on the subject of a state income tax. Decision on state aid to the district must await their decision.

Late May, 1976-The State Commissioner of Education begins consideration of the Board of Education's appeal.

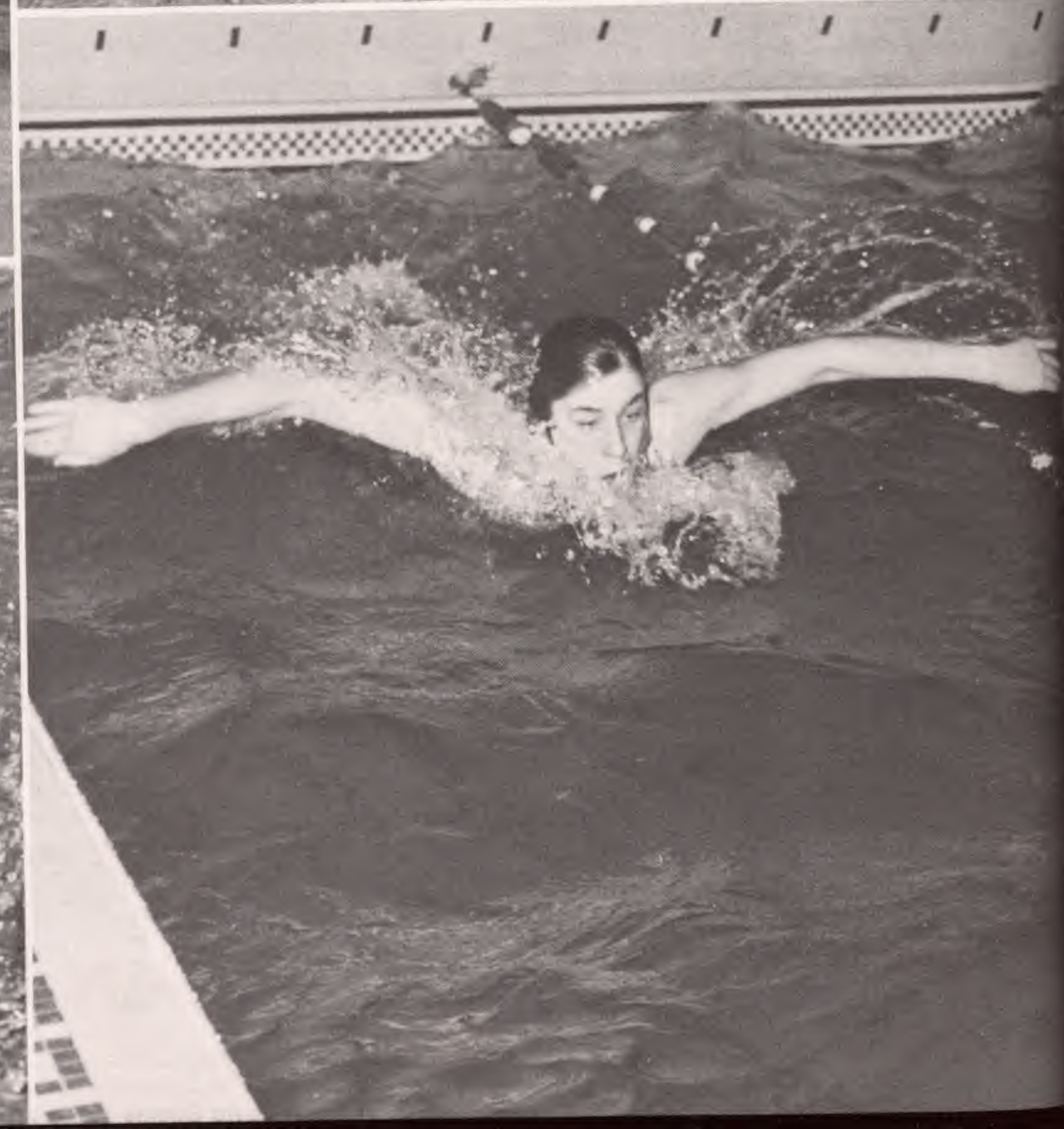
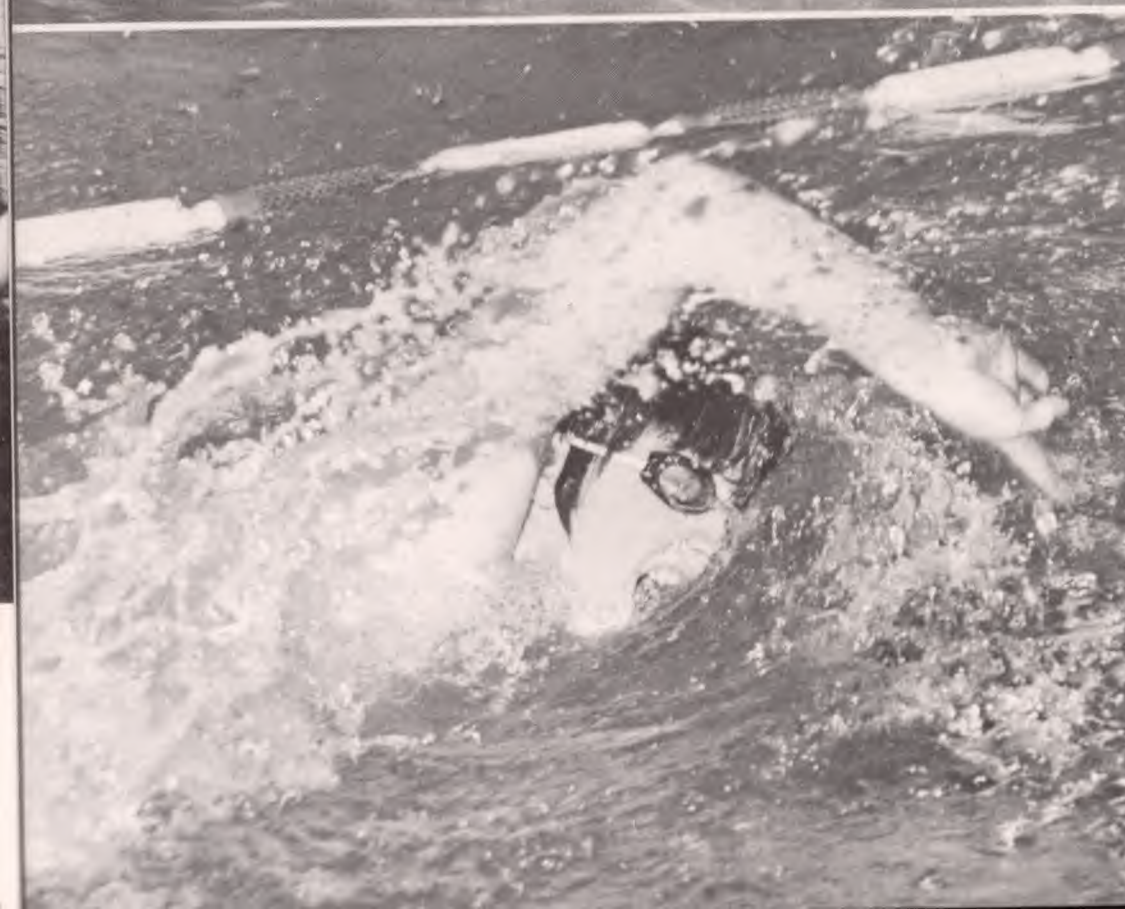
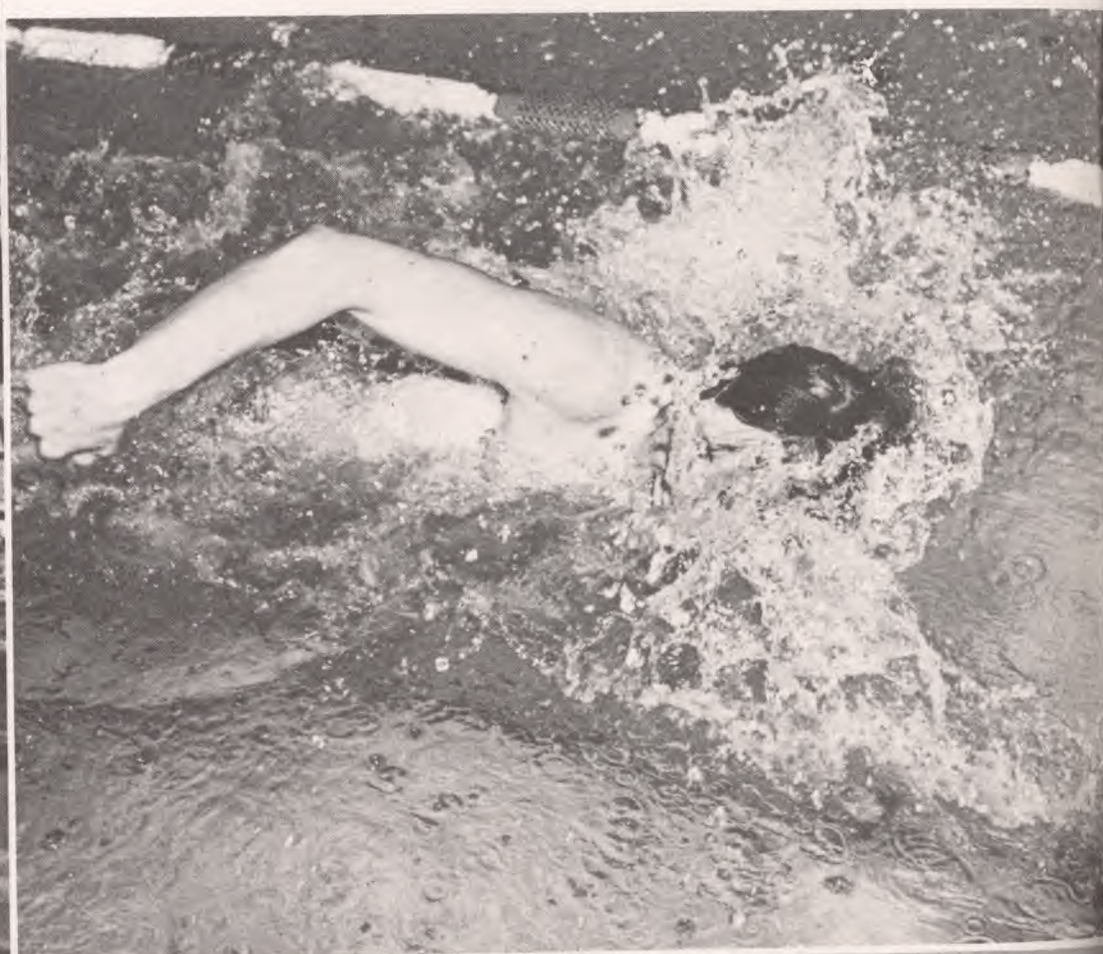


Girls Basketball (1976-1977)

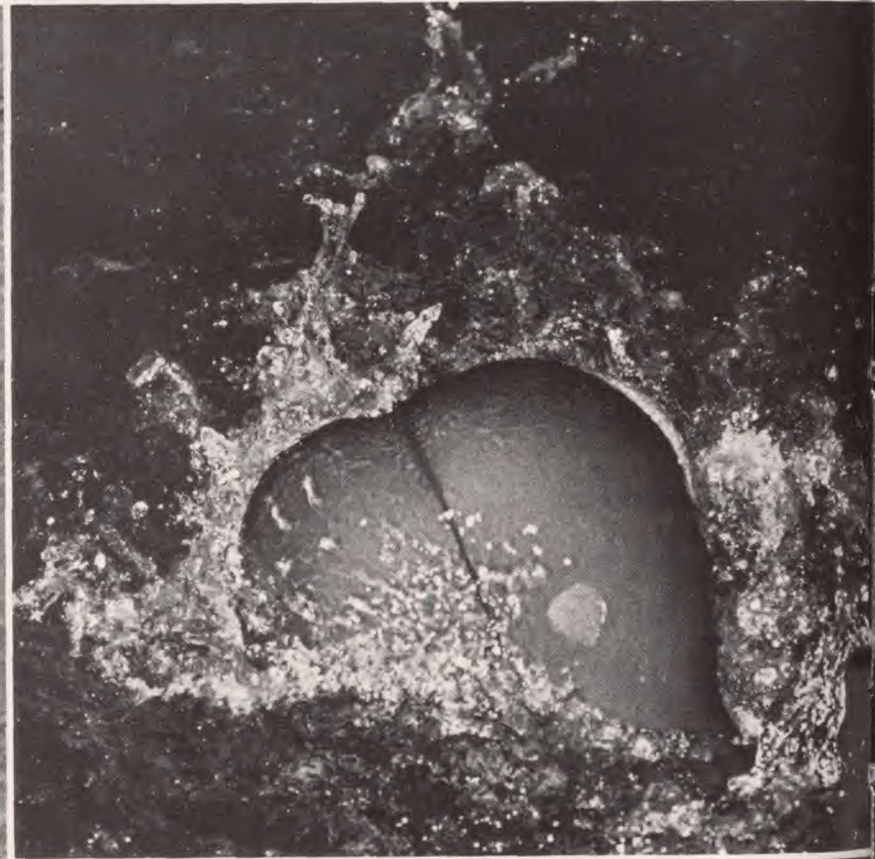
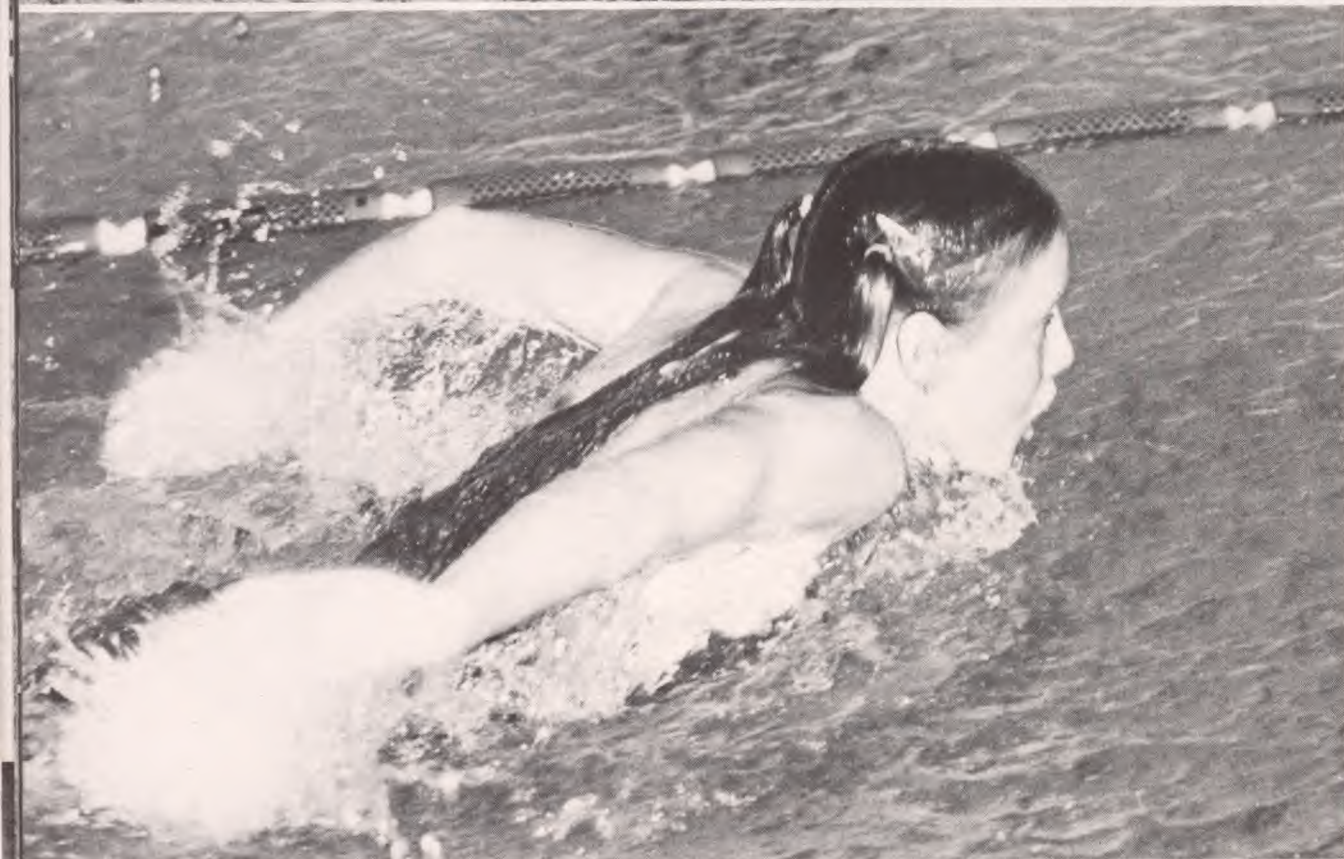


Boys Swimming

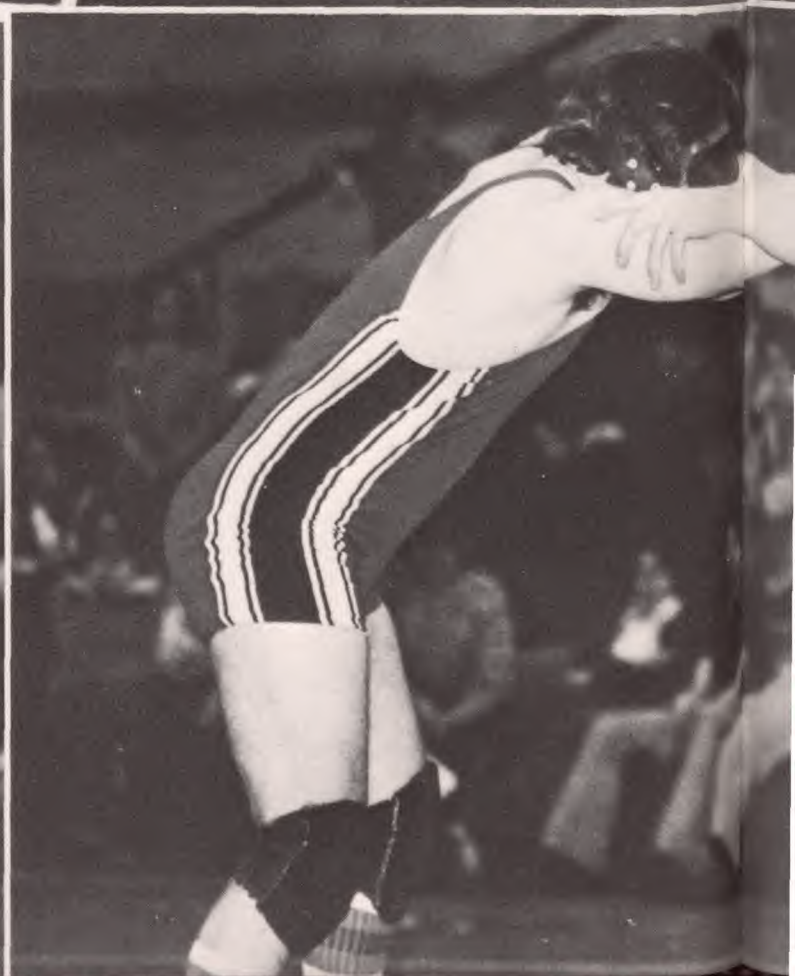
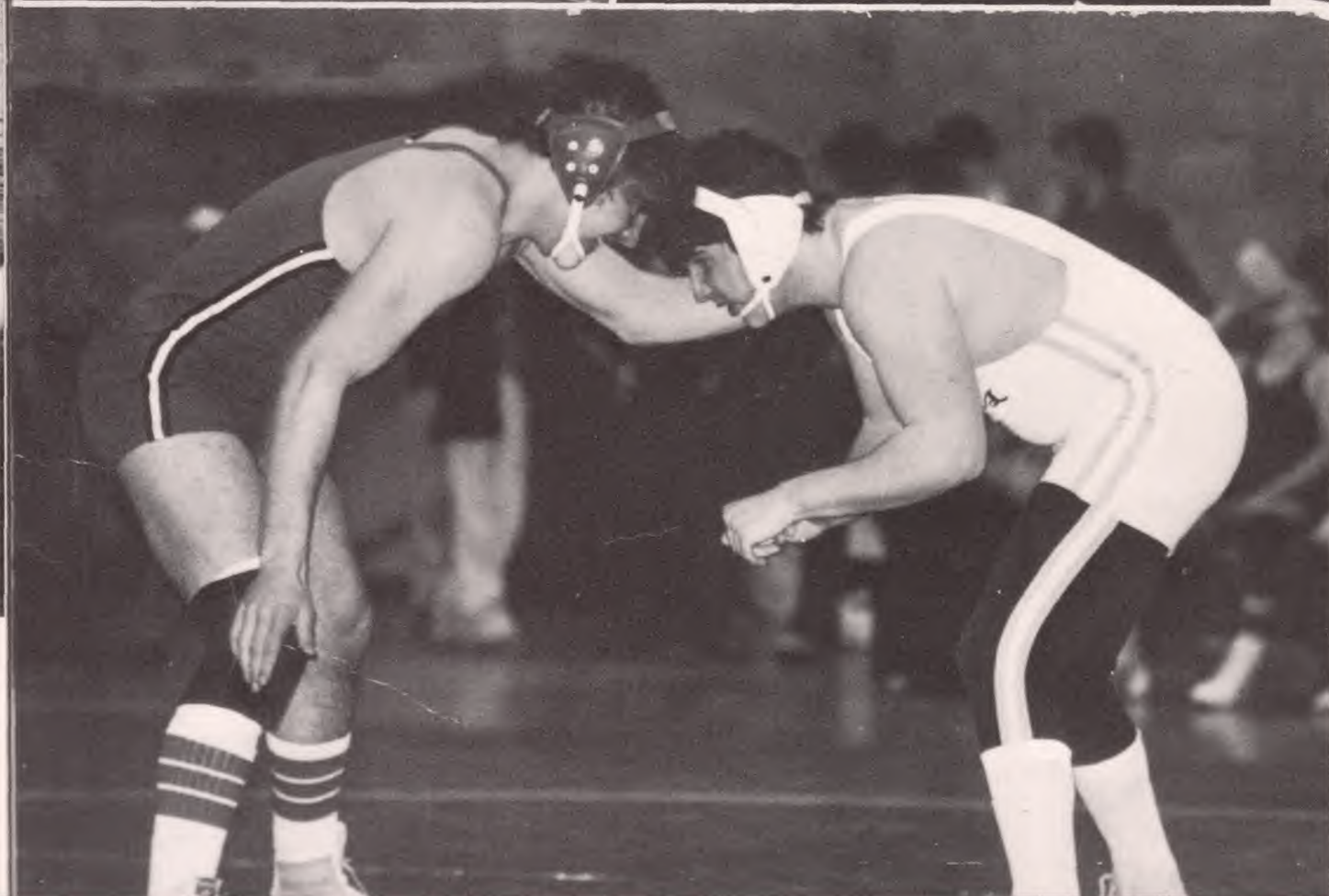
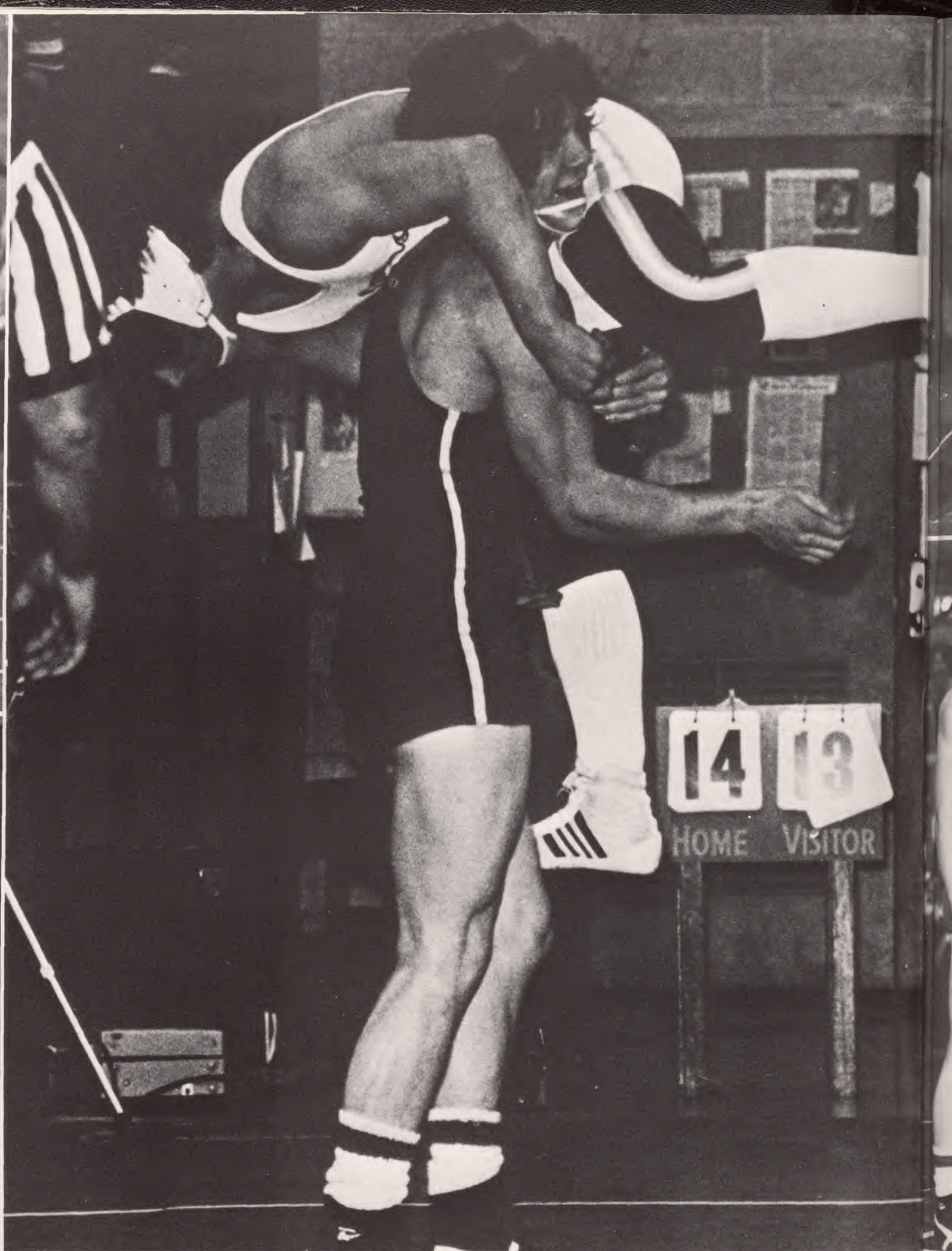
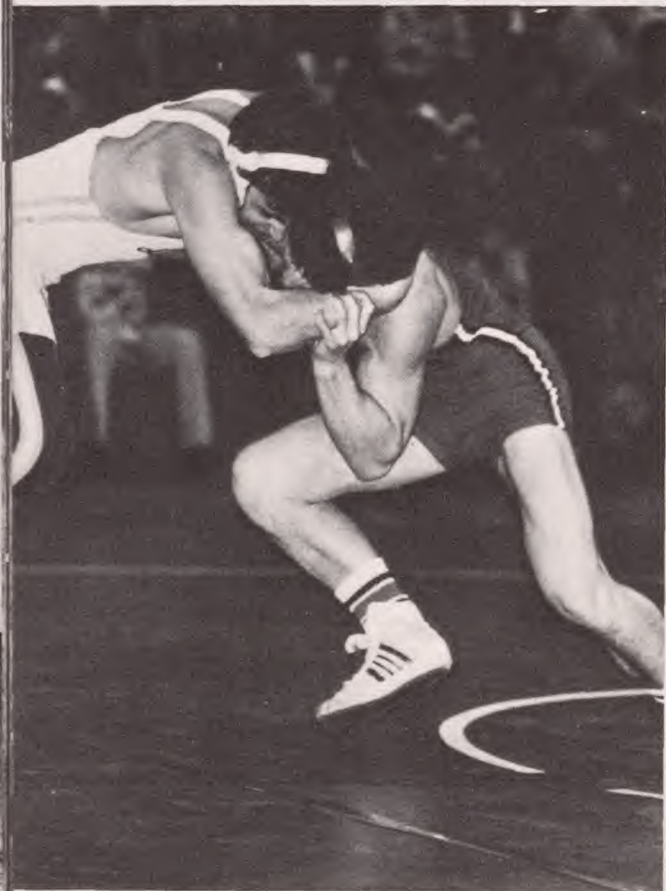
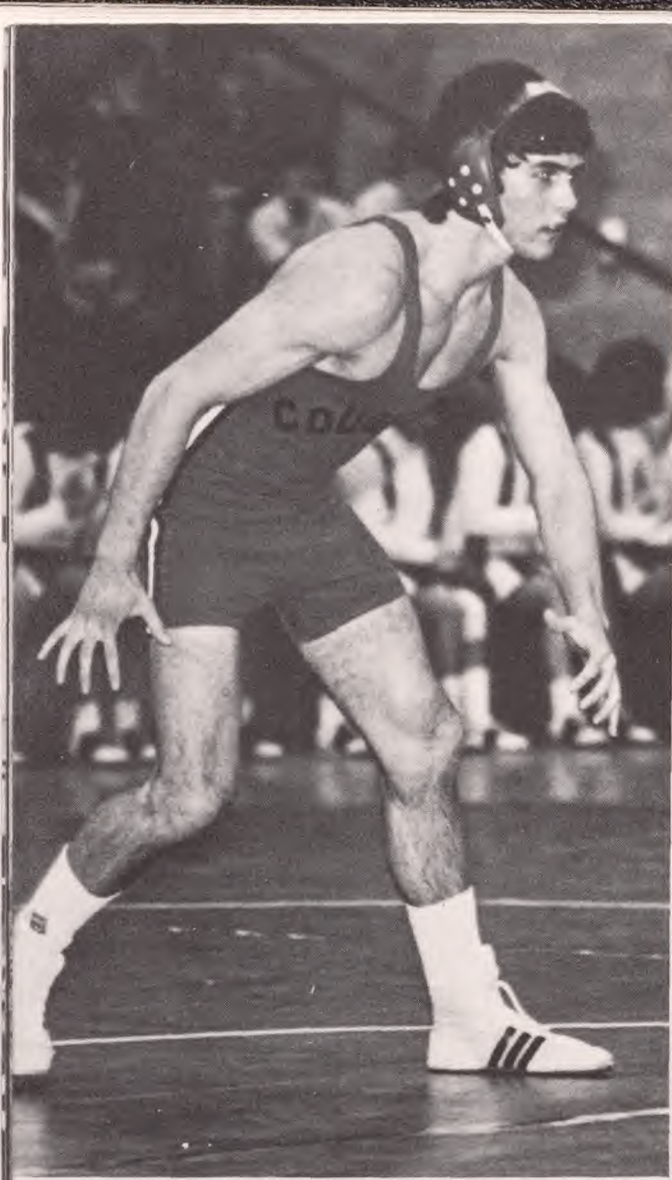


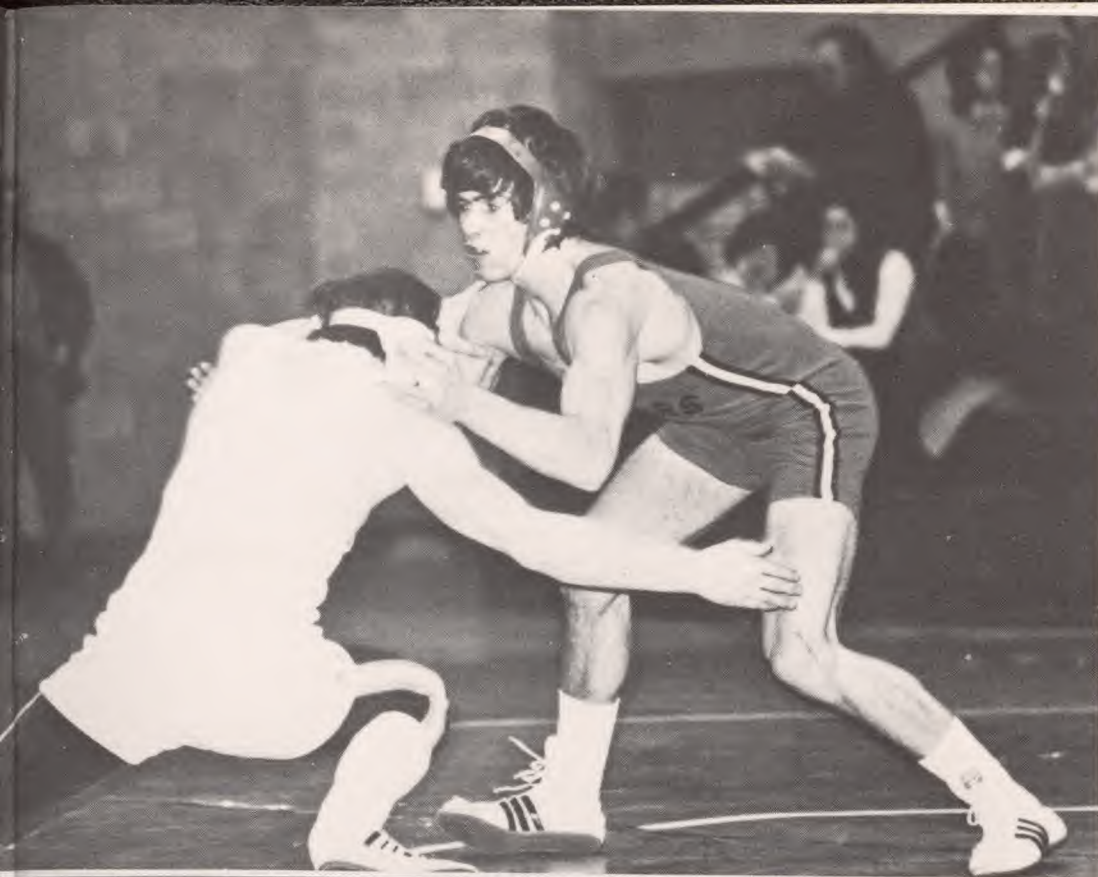
Girls Varsity Swimming

Varsity Wrestling (1976-1977)

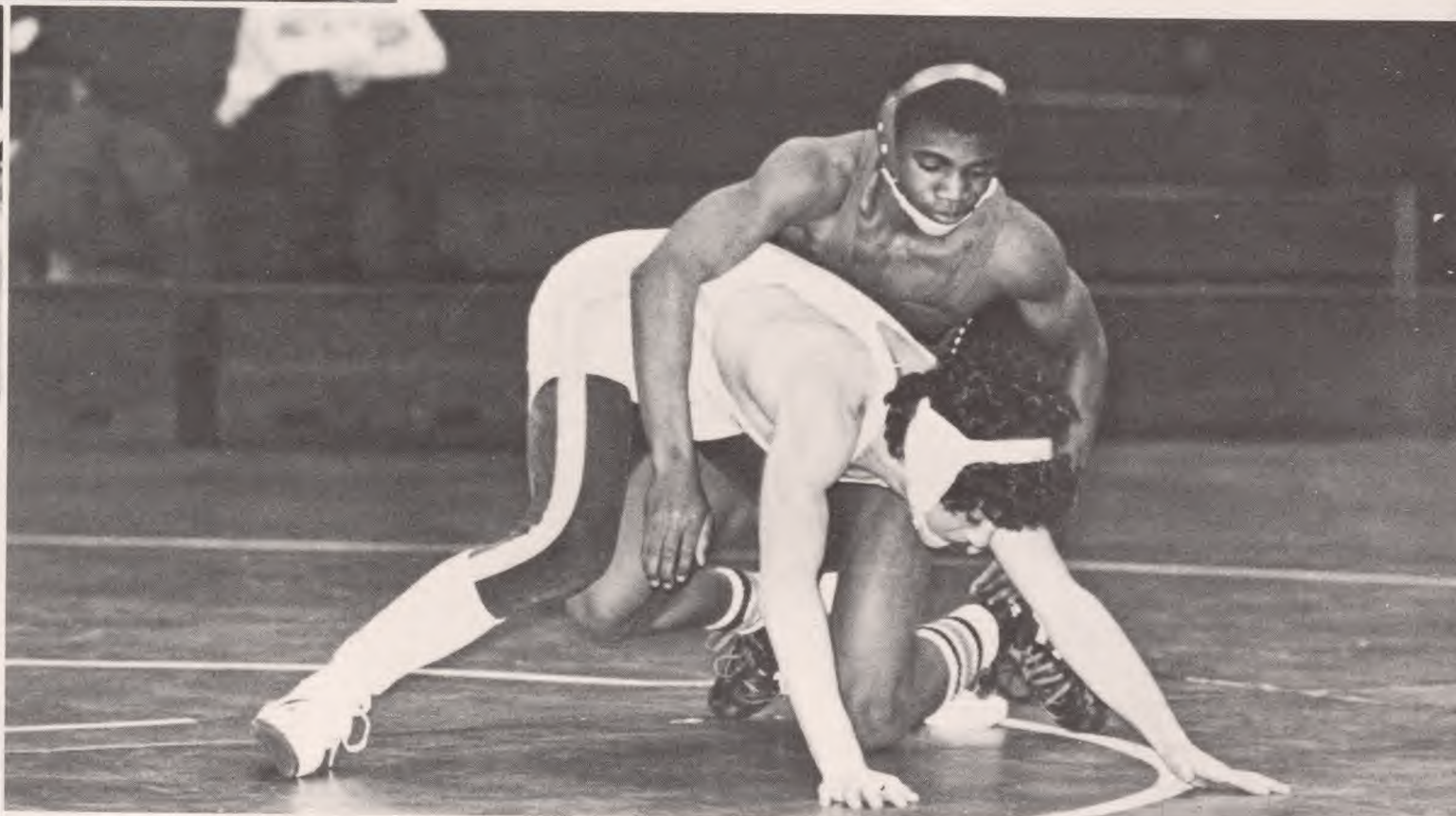

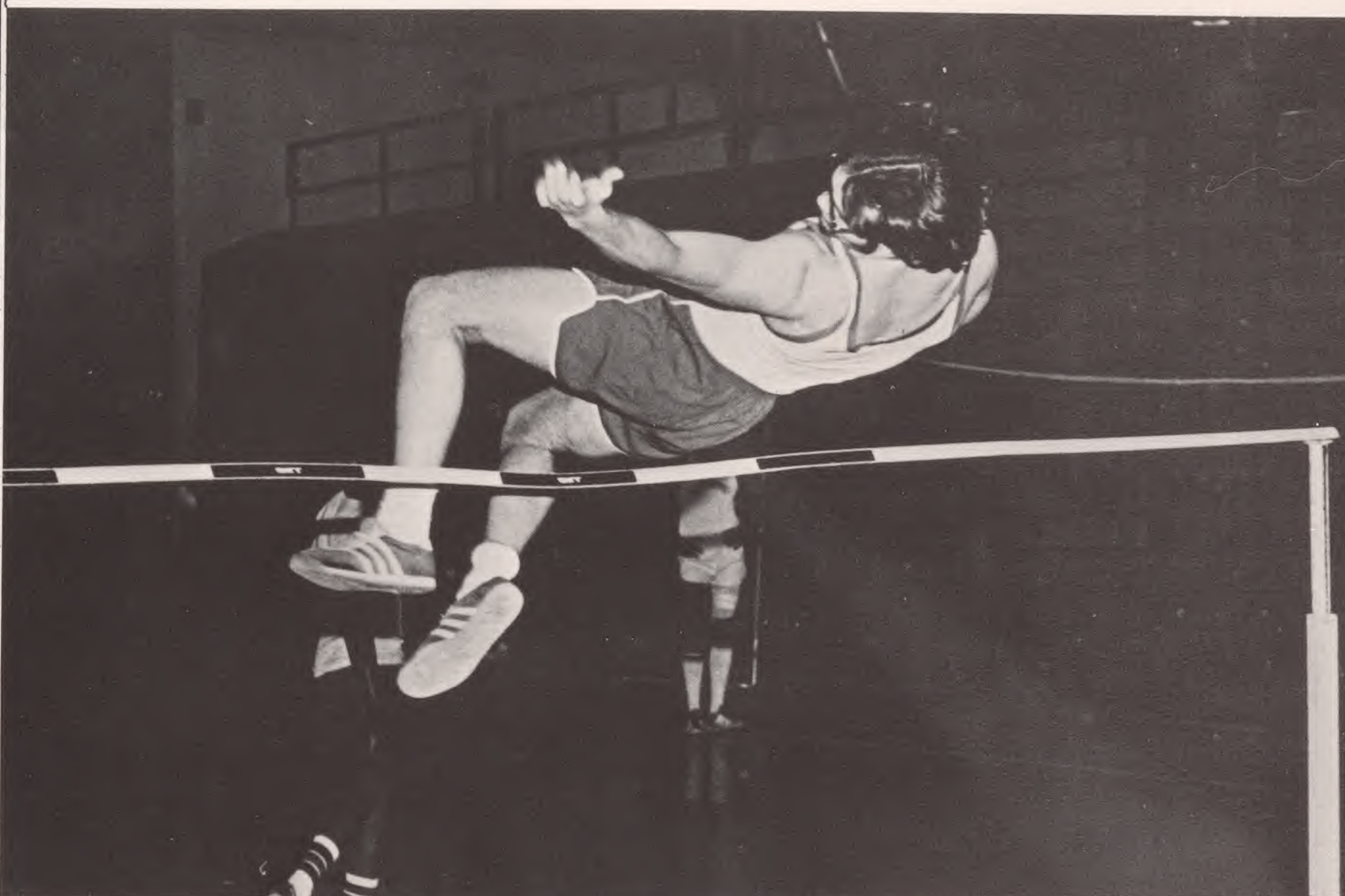

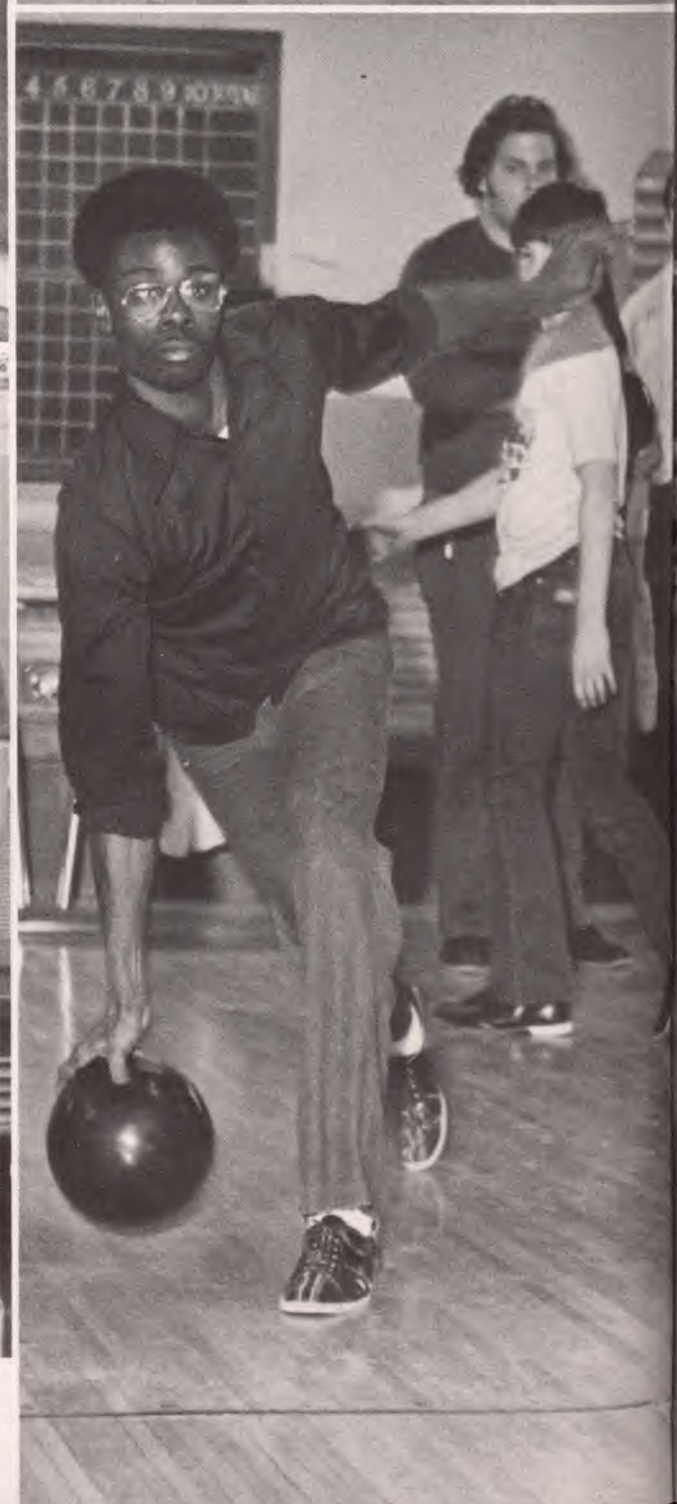
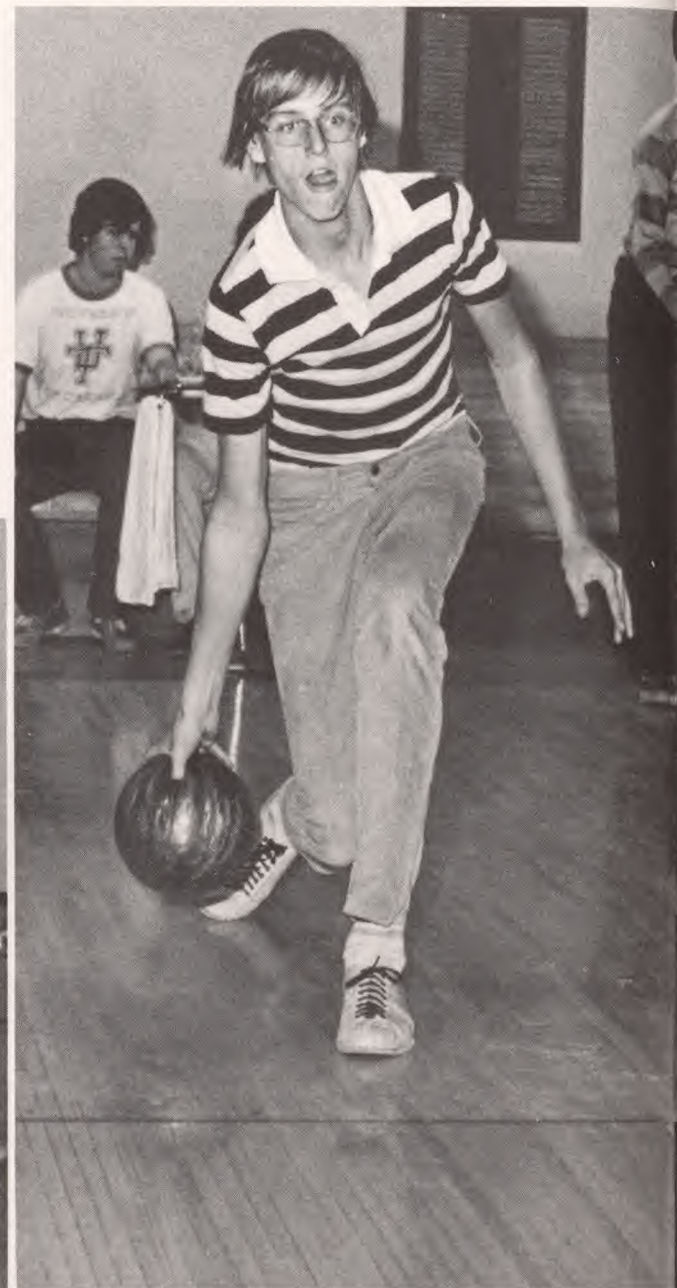
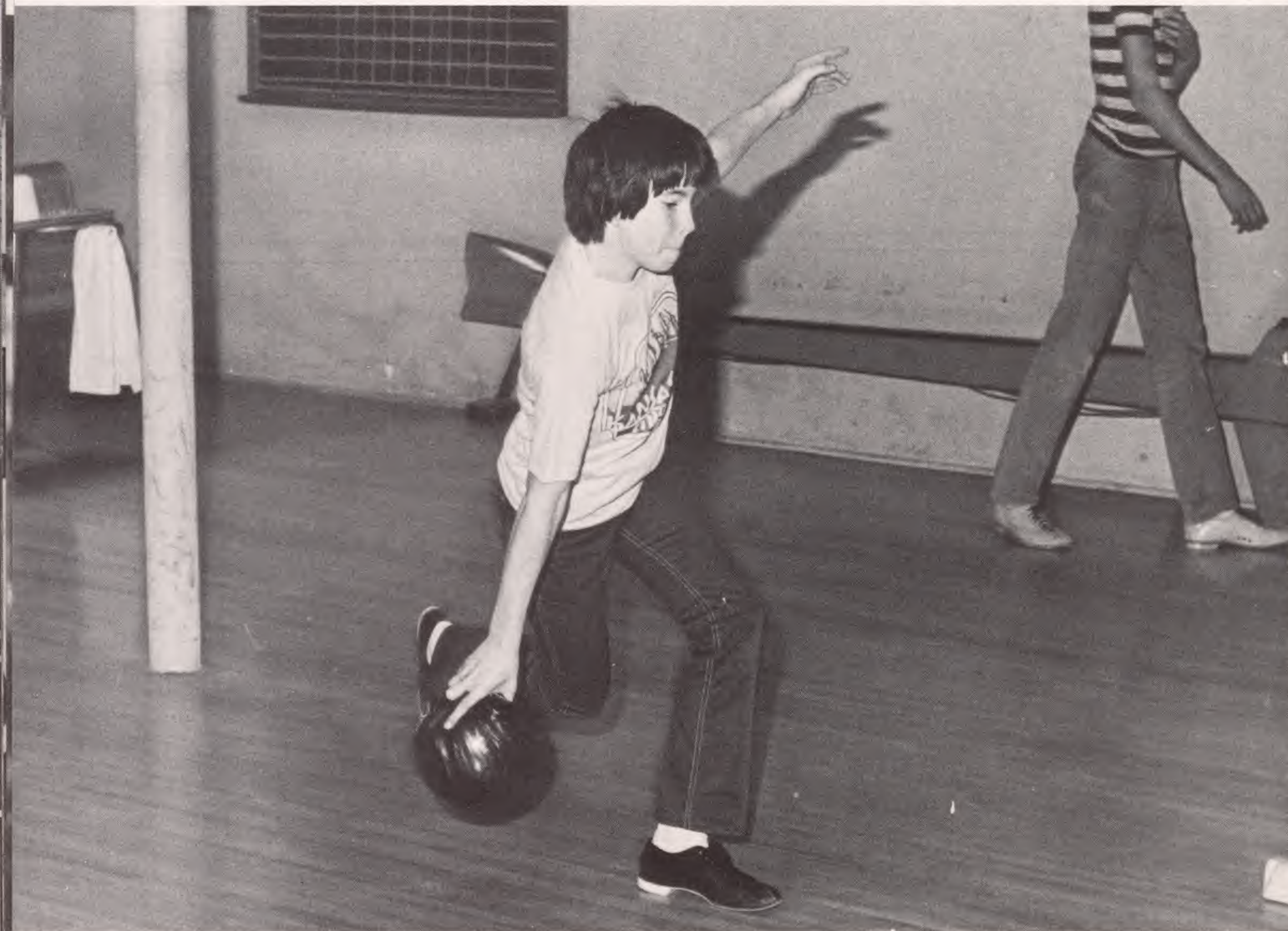


Indoor Track

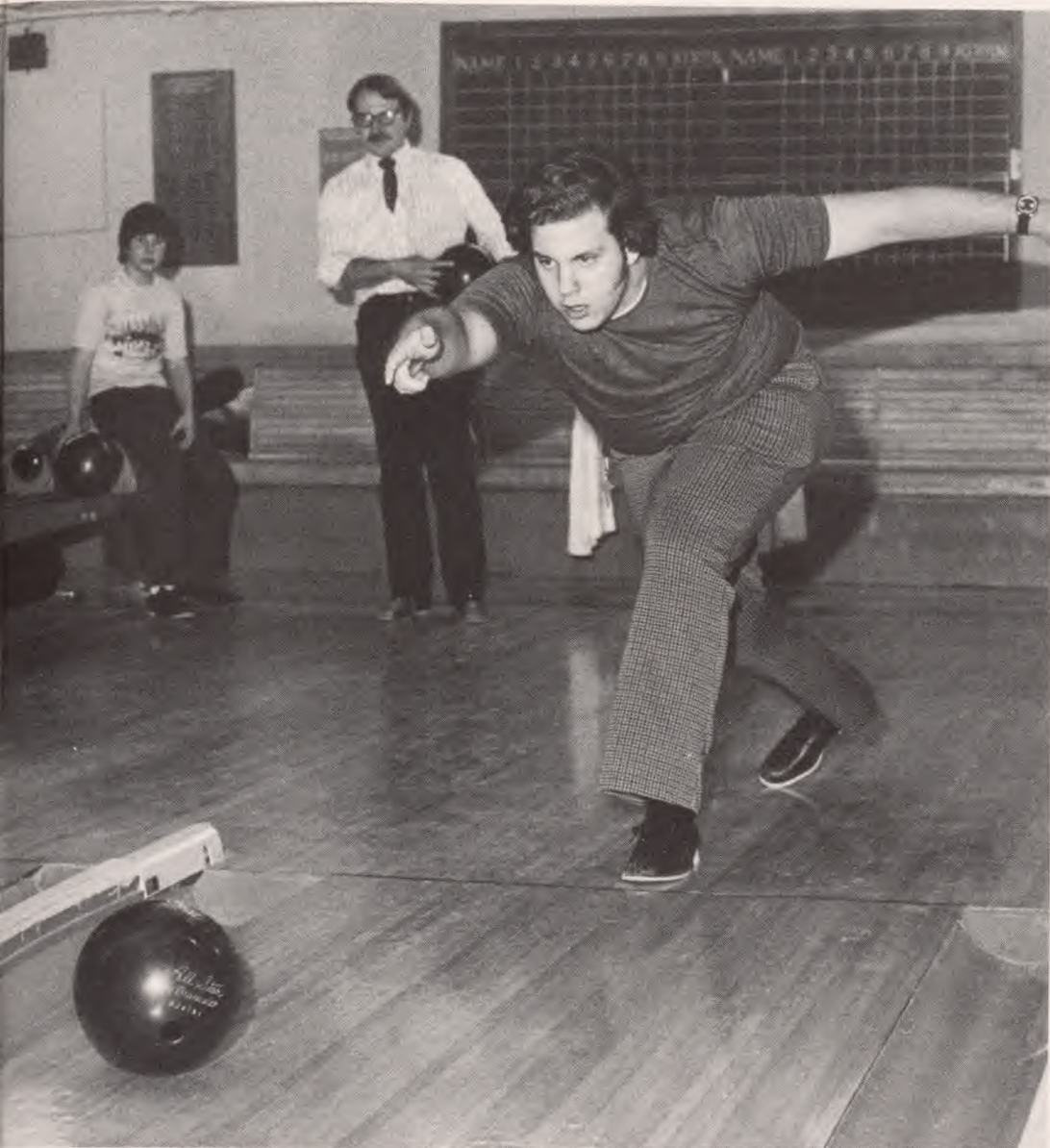
The Indoor Track team had one of its strongest seasons in 1976-77. The year saw many firsts' for the boy's and girl's teams.

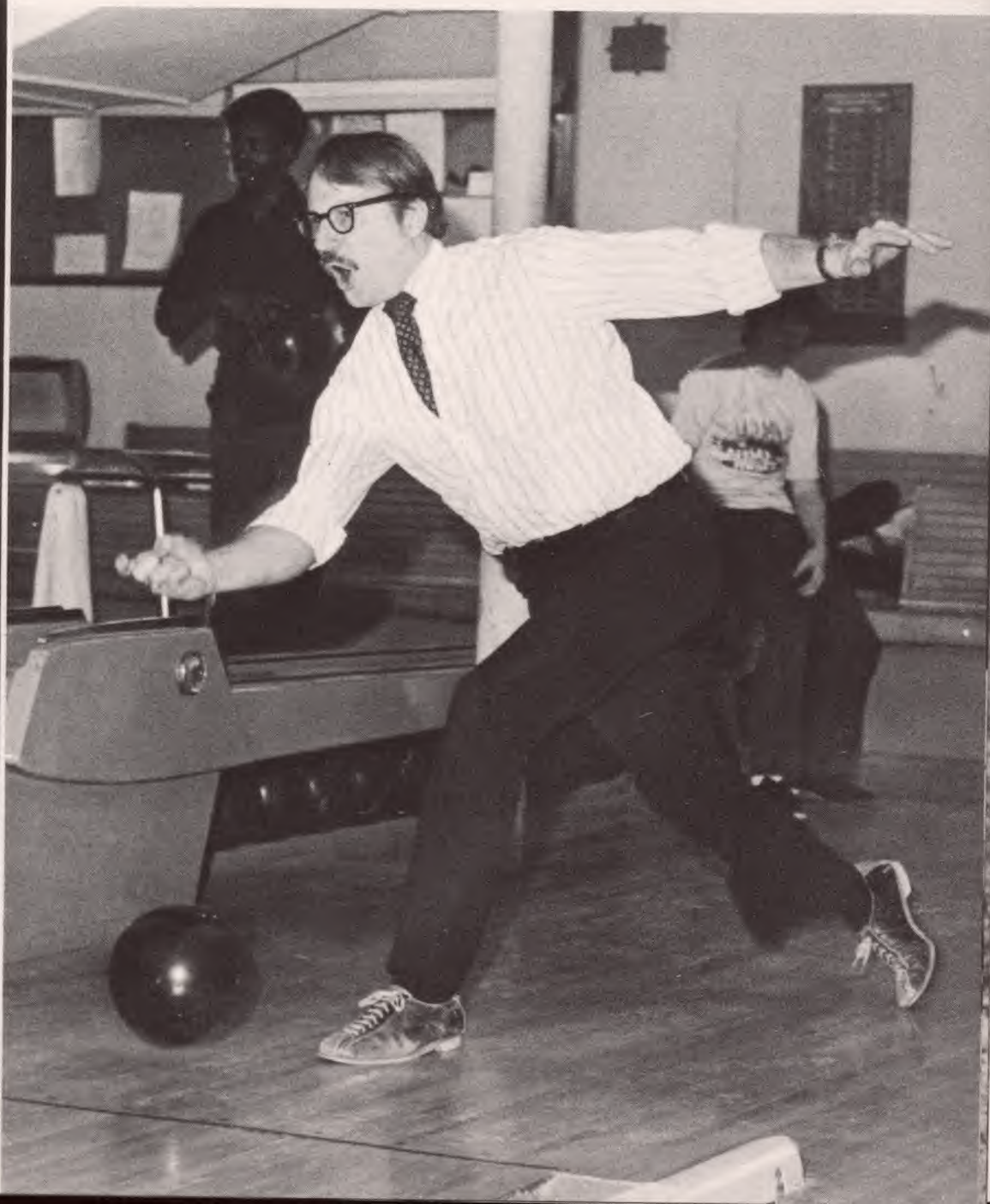
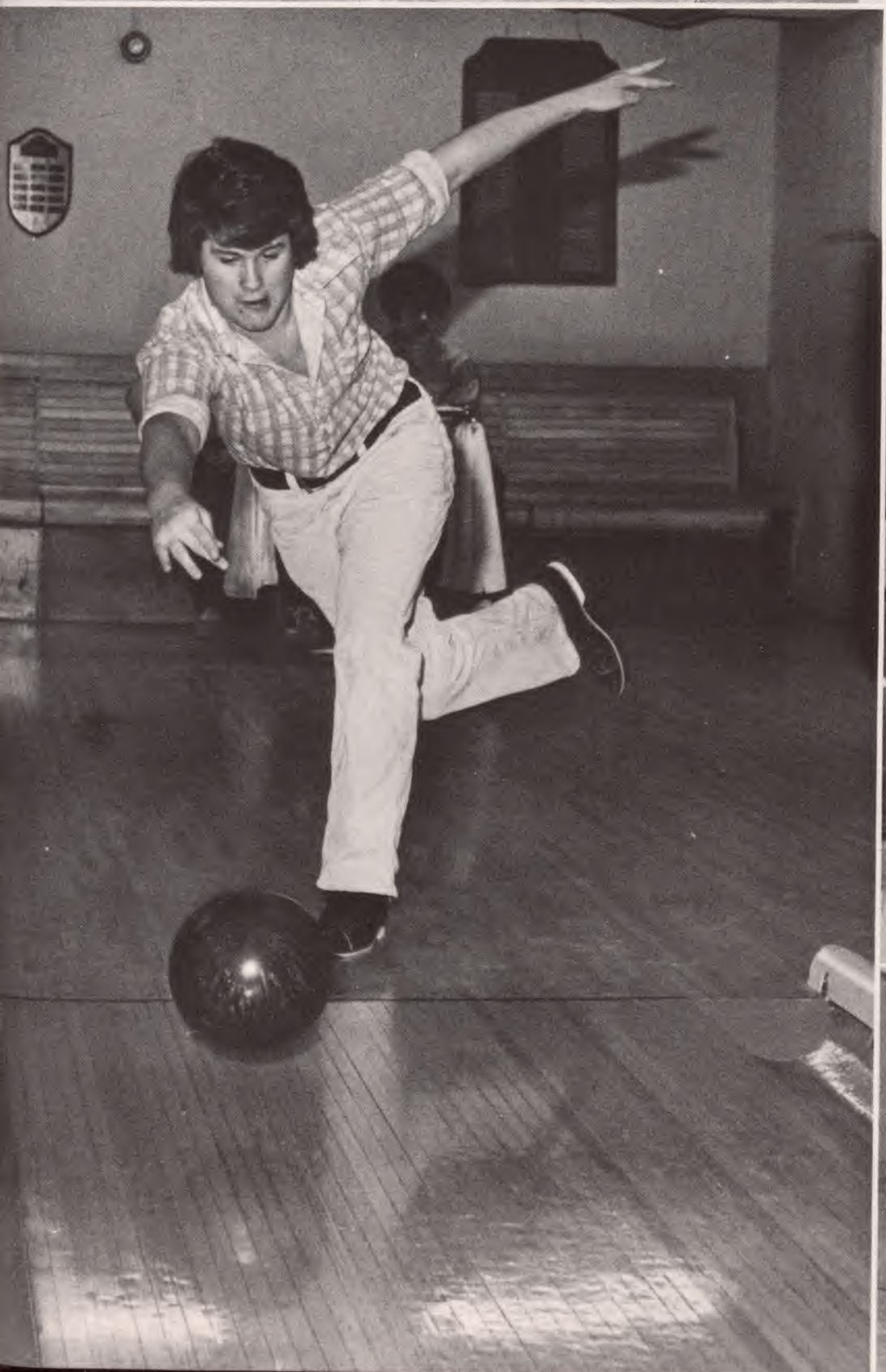

Look for the team to win more and more in the coming years.

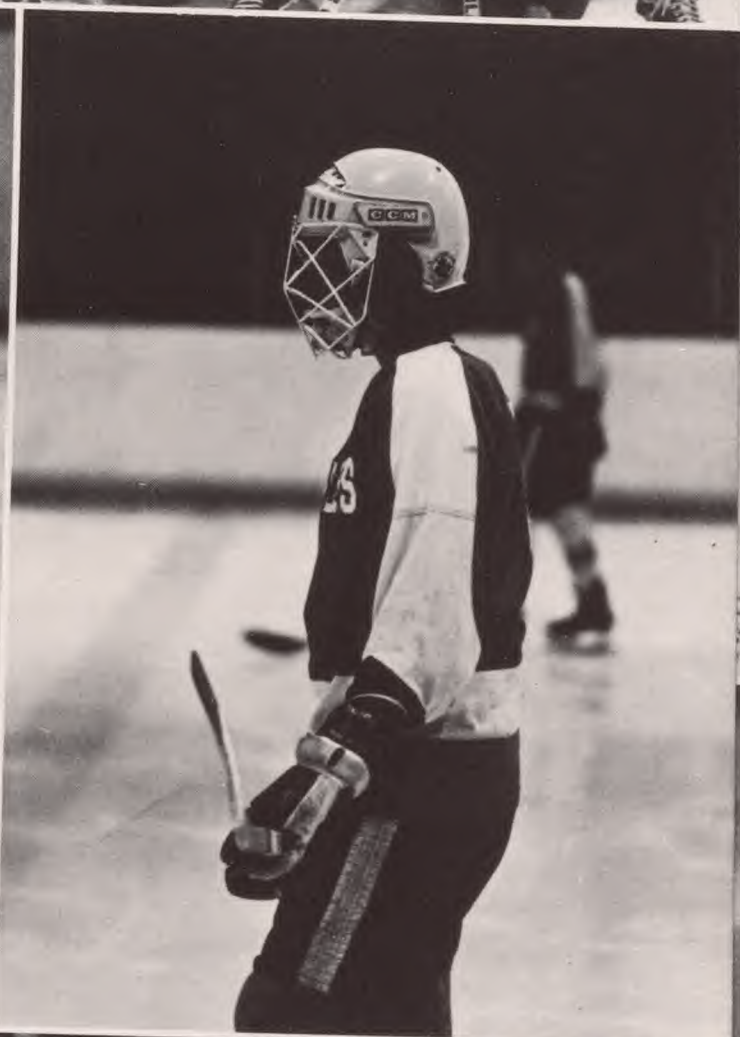


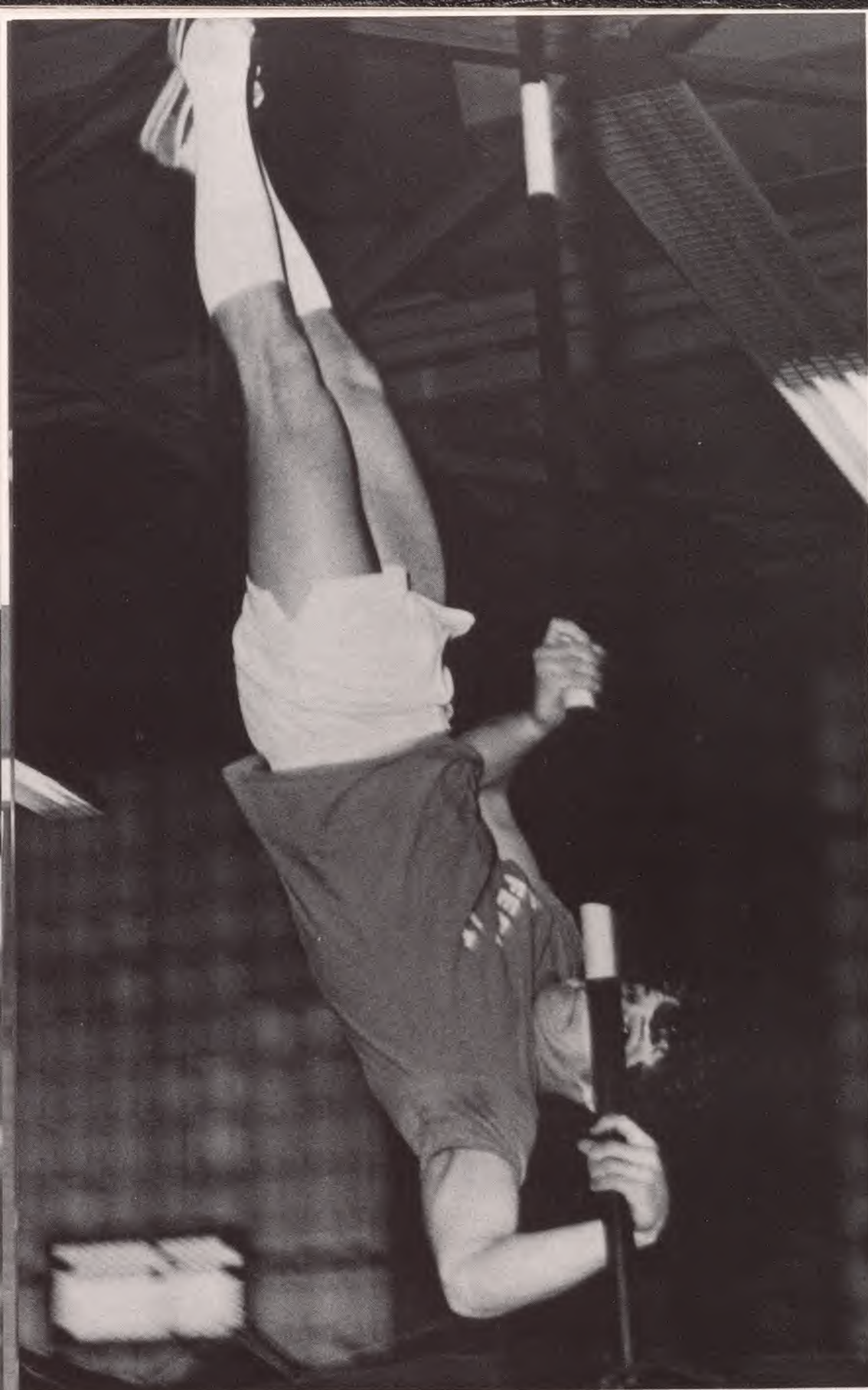
HOCKEY TEAM

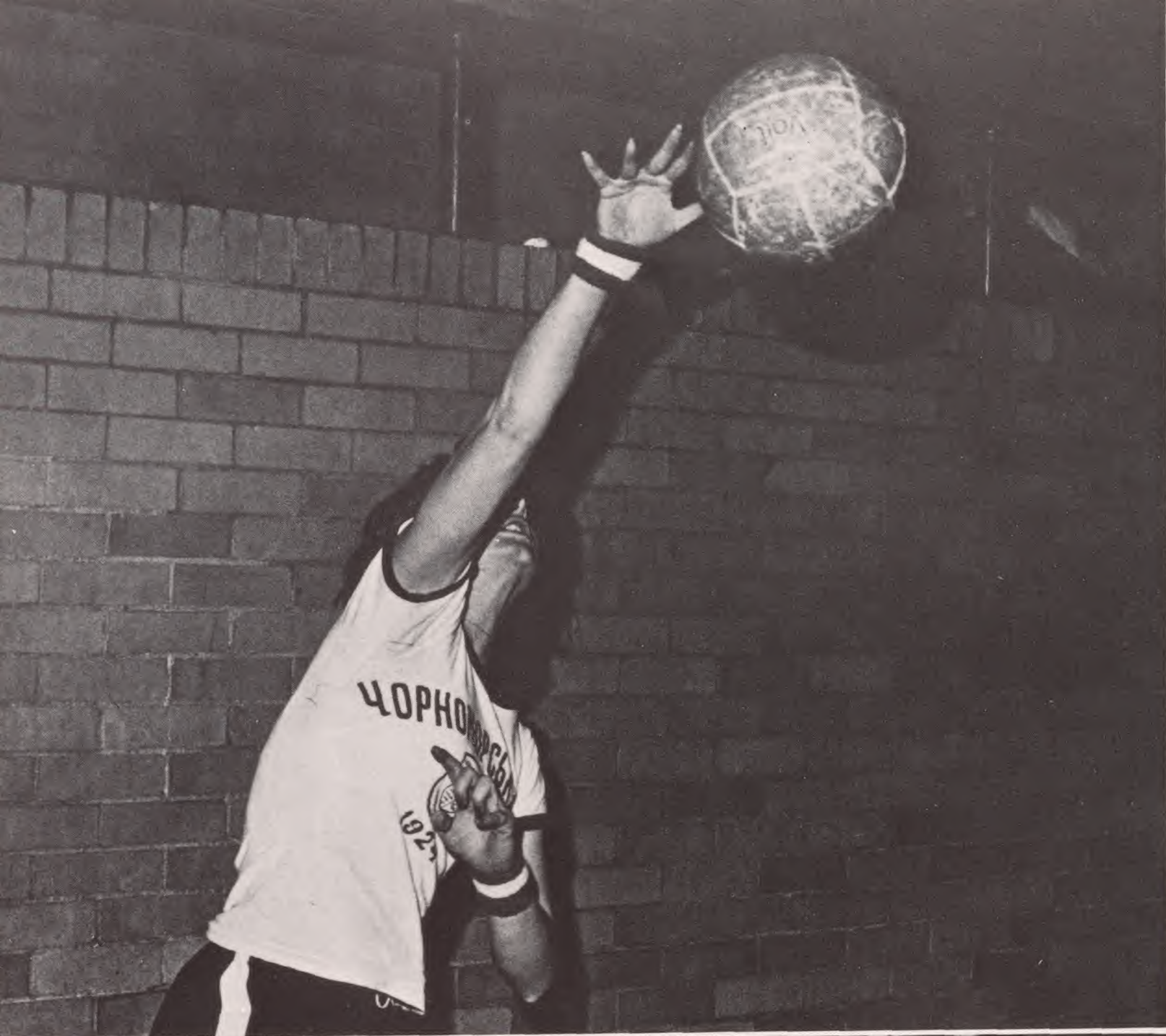




Baseball

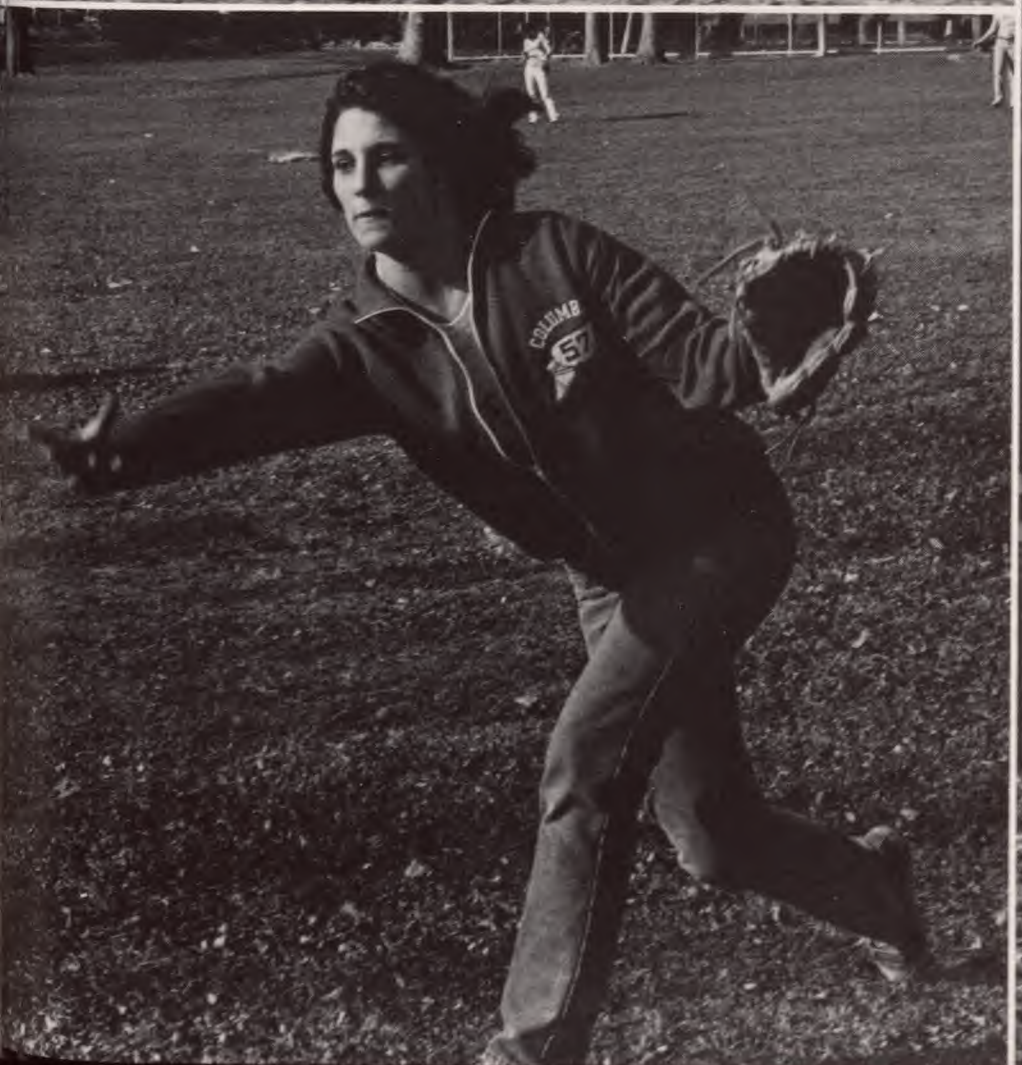
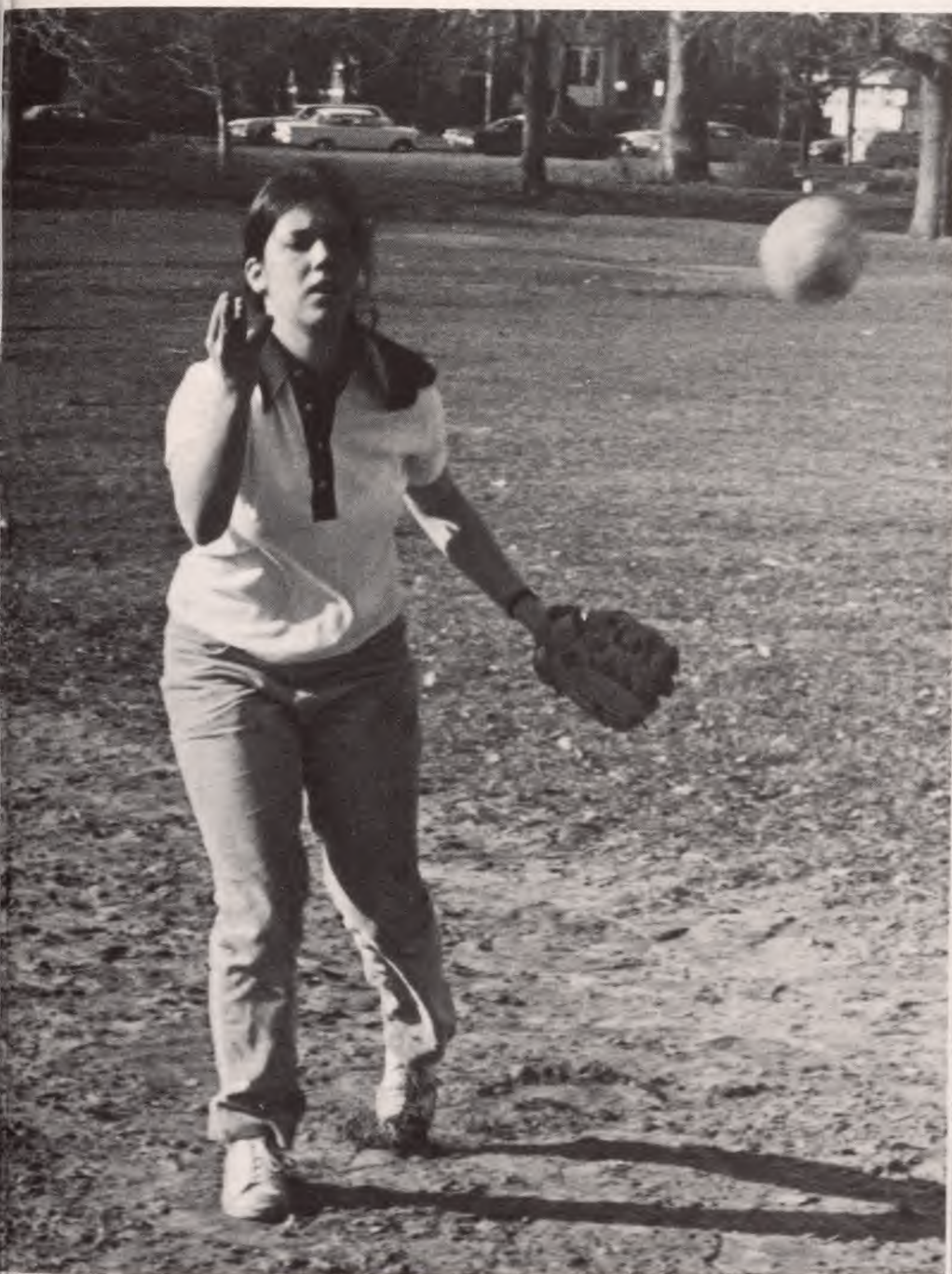
Girls Volleyball Team

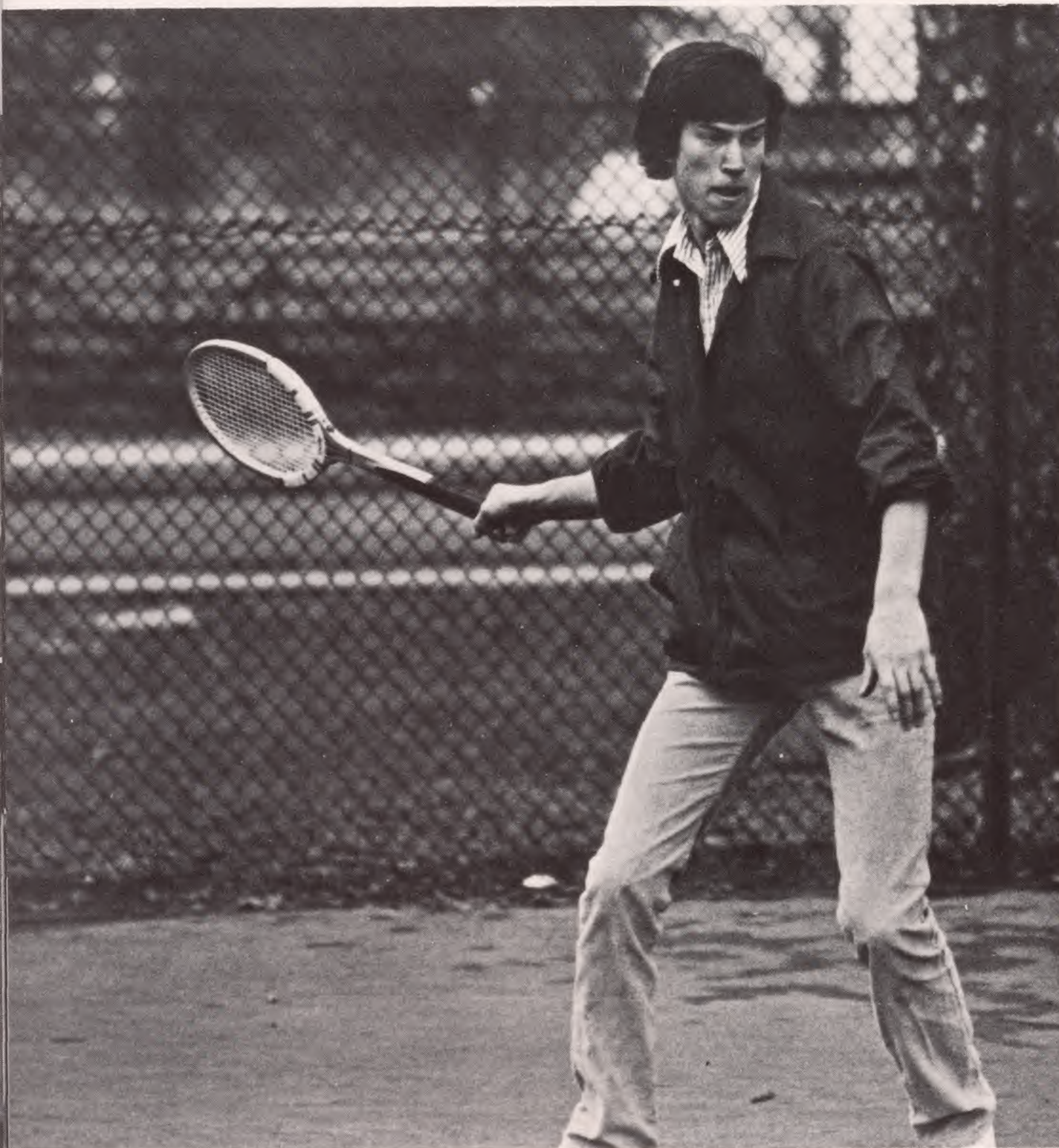


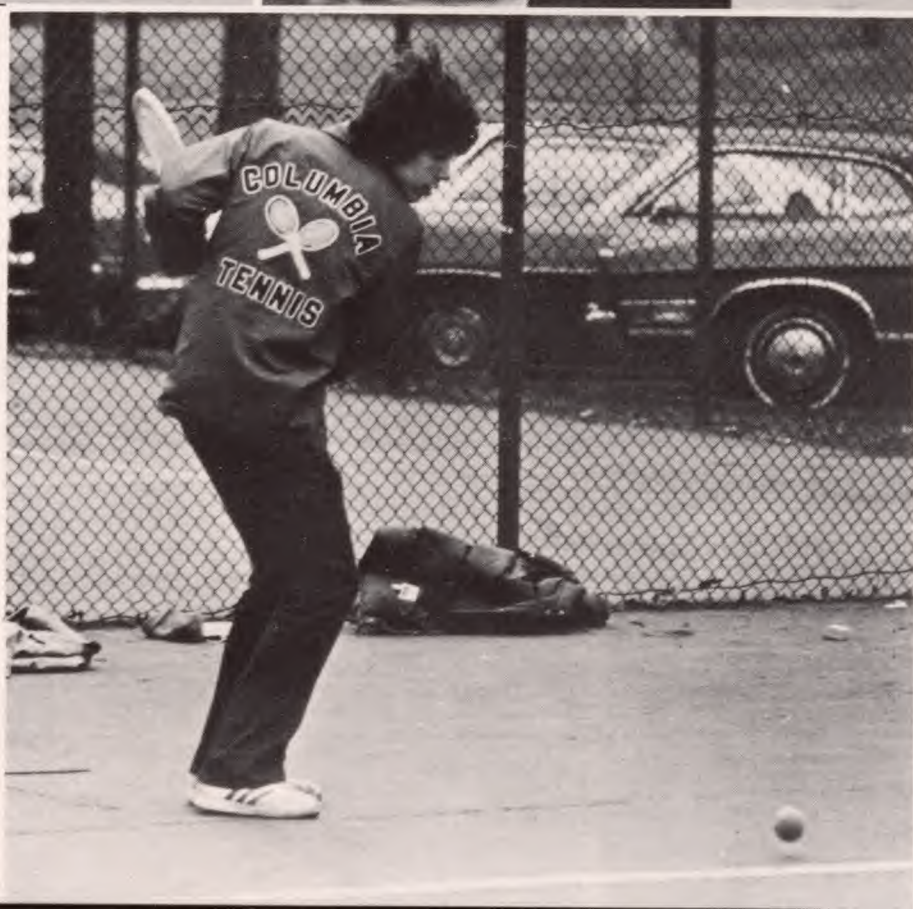
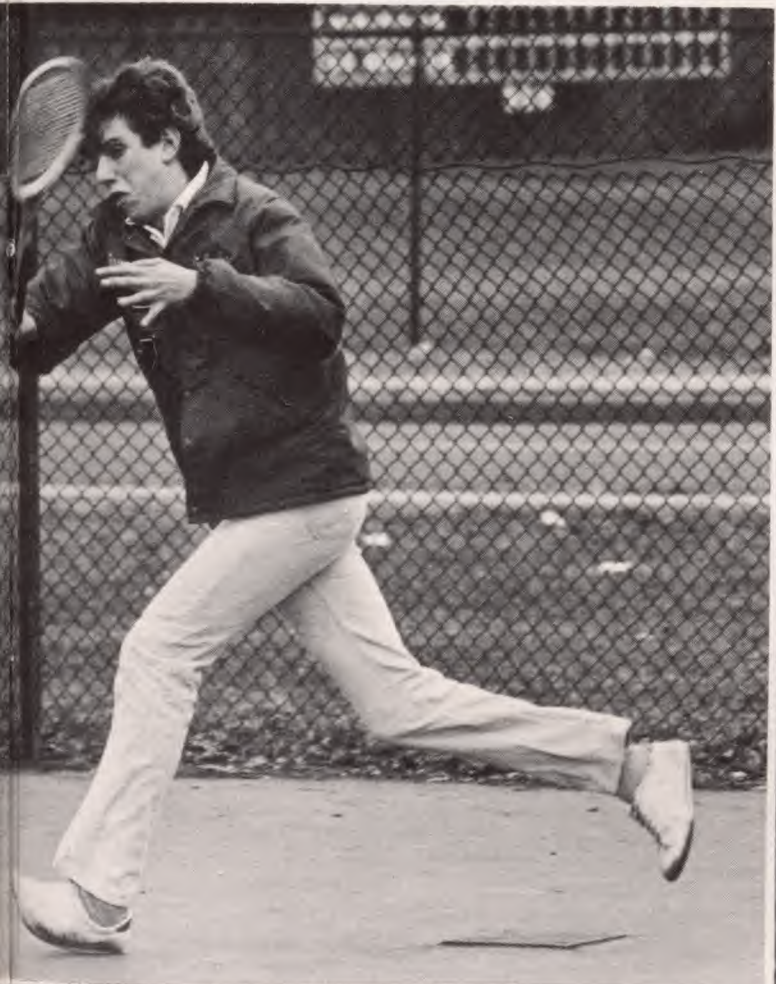


Tennis

Coached by Mr. Irwin Genzer, this year's team once again set its eyes on the Big Ten championship and the County championship. They even spoke frequently about the State championships.

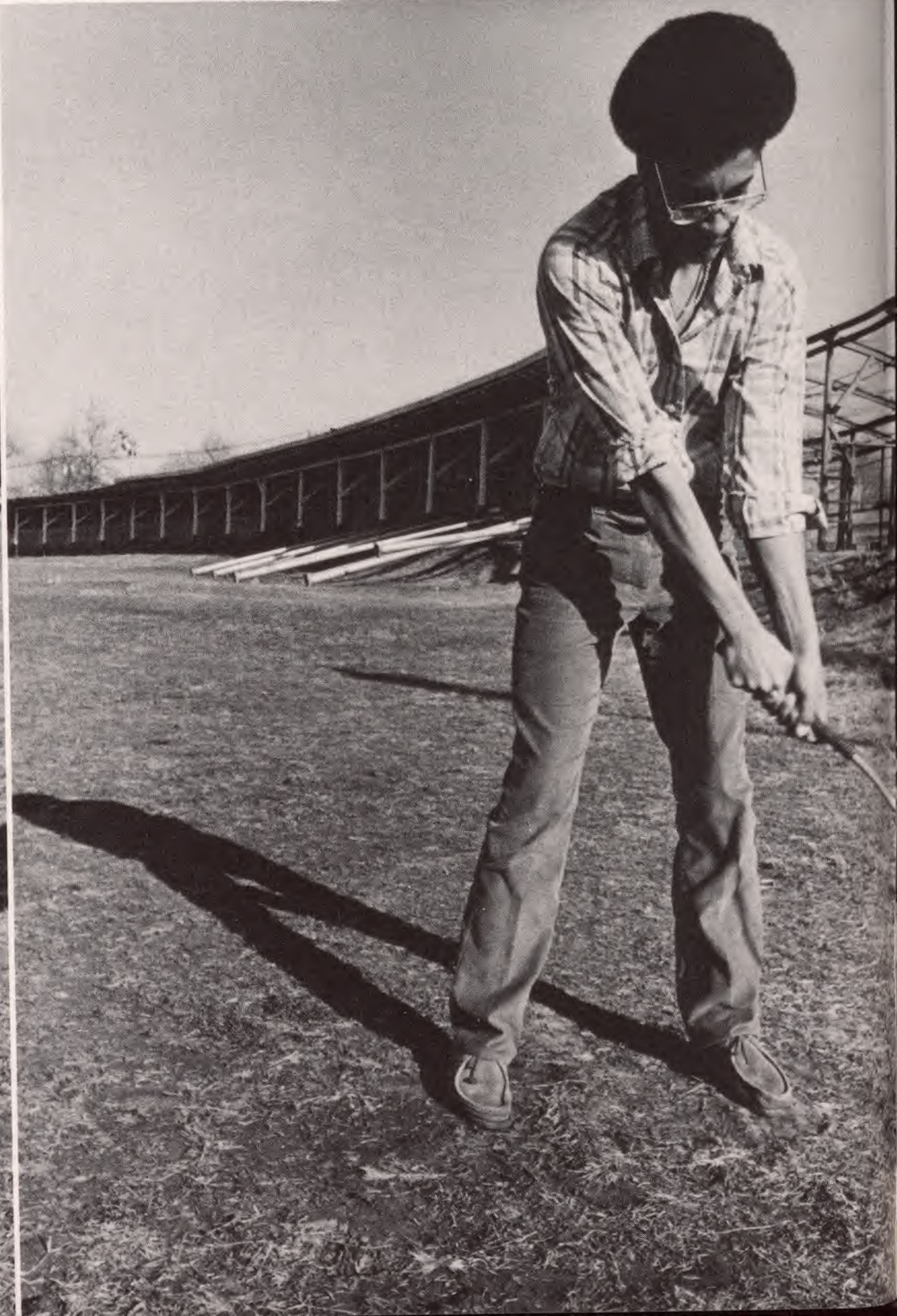
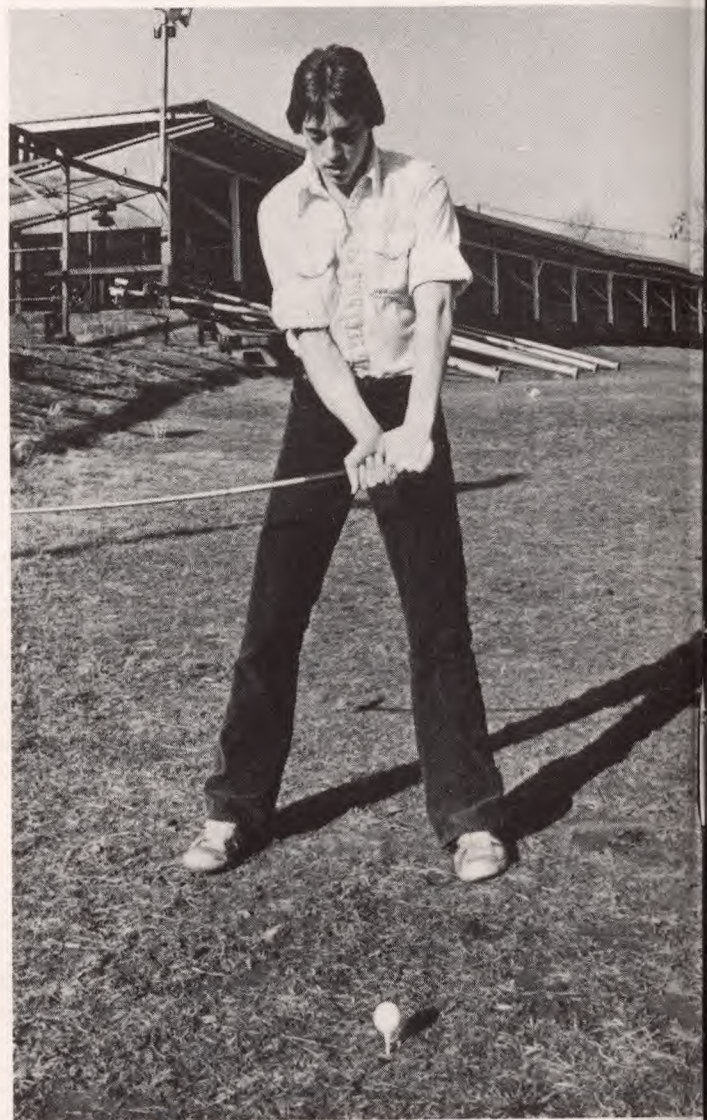


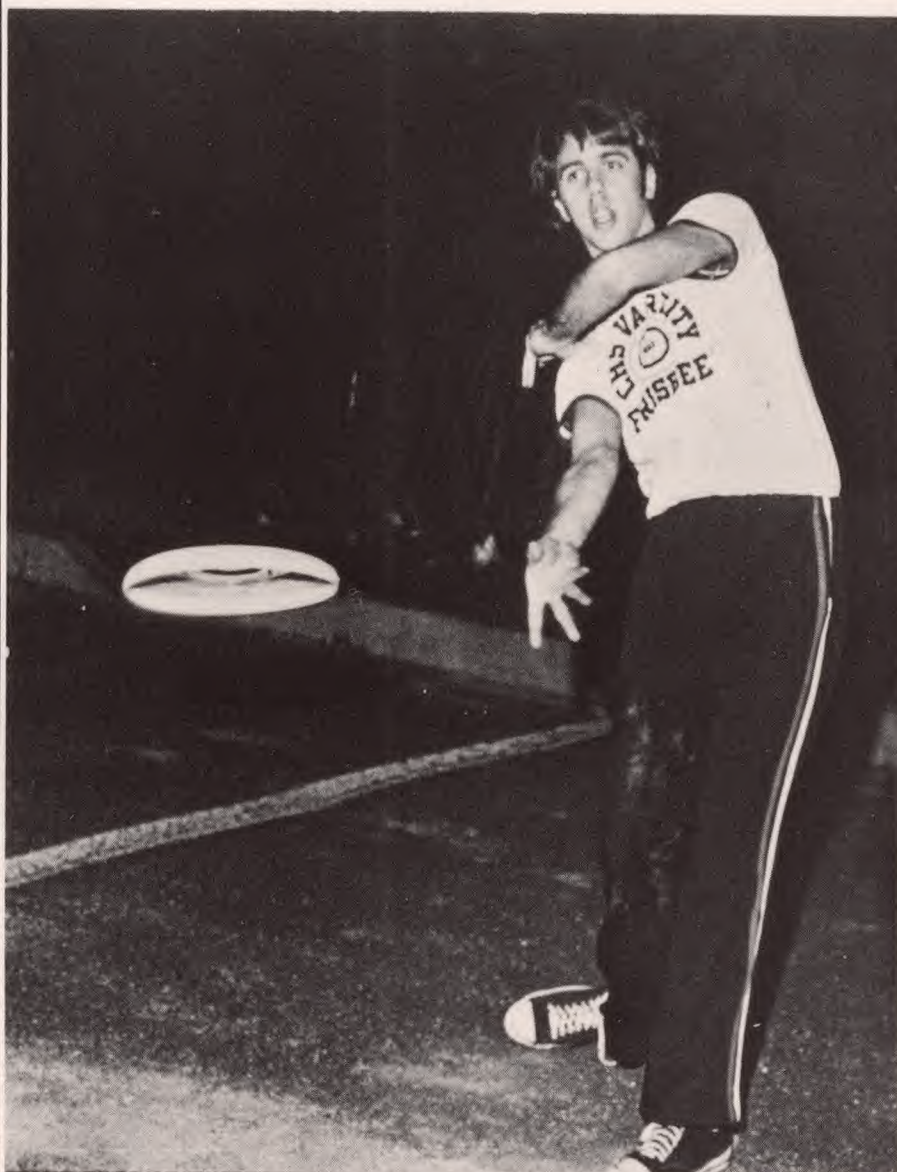




Golf

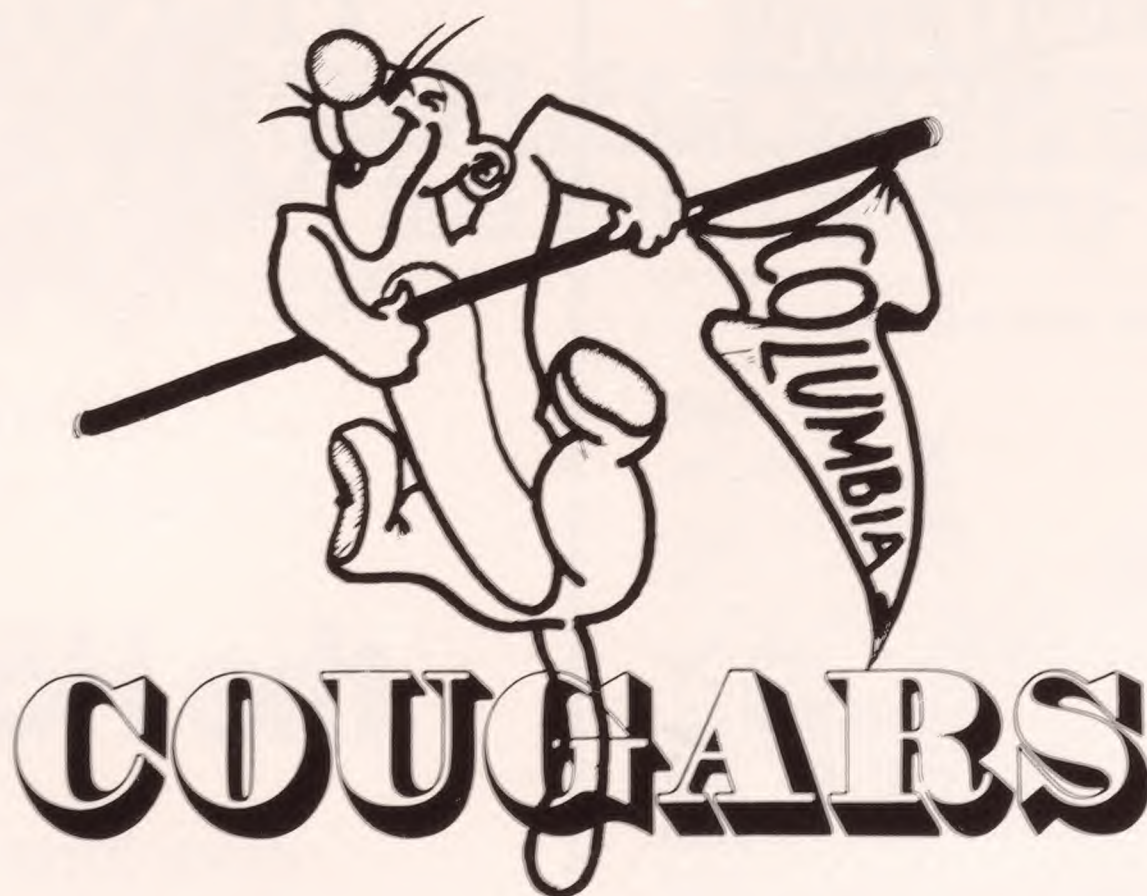

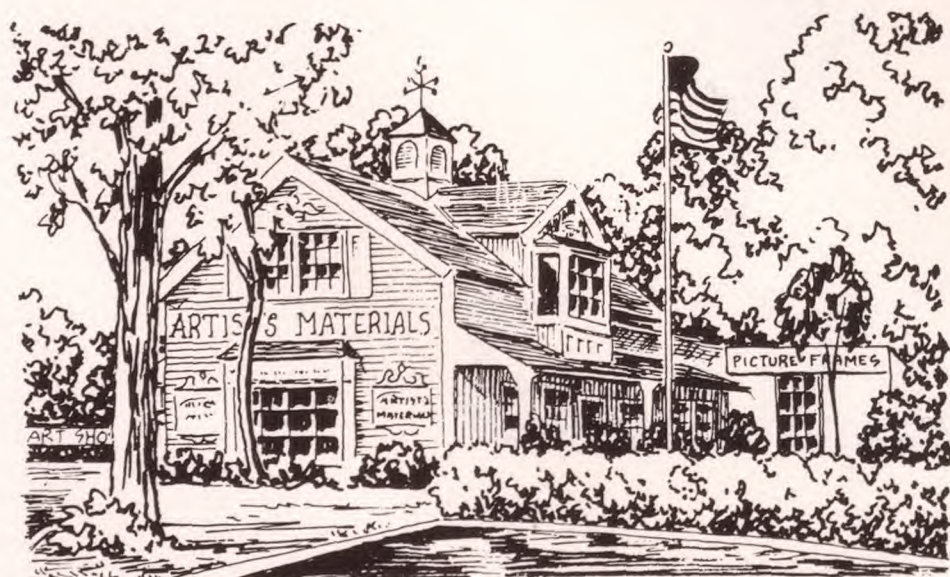

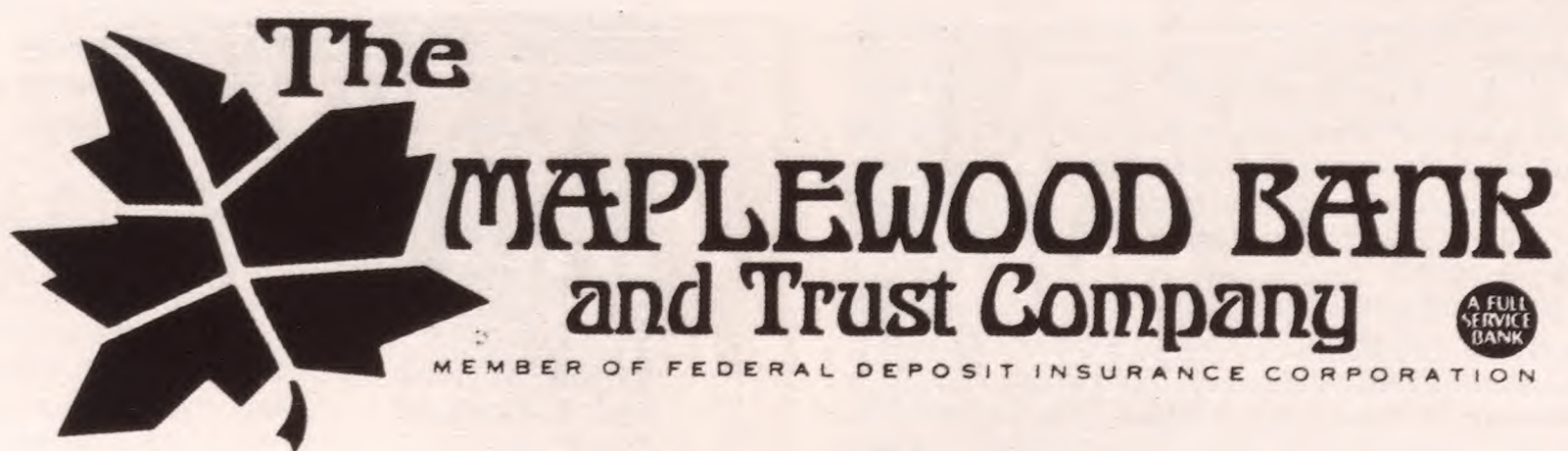
