The Columbia High School Mathletes compete in various mathematical competitions, both national and regional. Contests generally range in type from the bi-monthly thirty-minute tests, which are taken before school, to all-day affairs. AHSME (previously called the MAA) is the most highly attended contest, taken this year by more than two hundred Columbia students.
