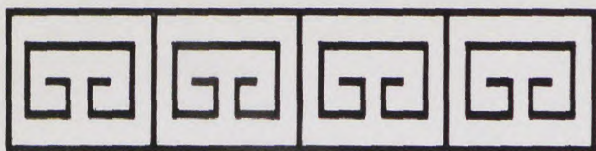


FOREWORD

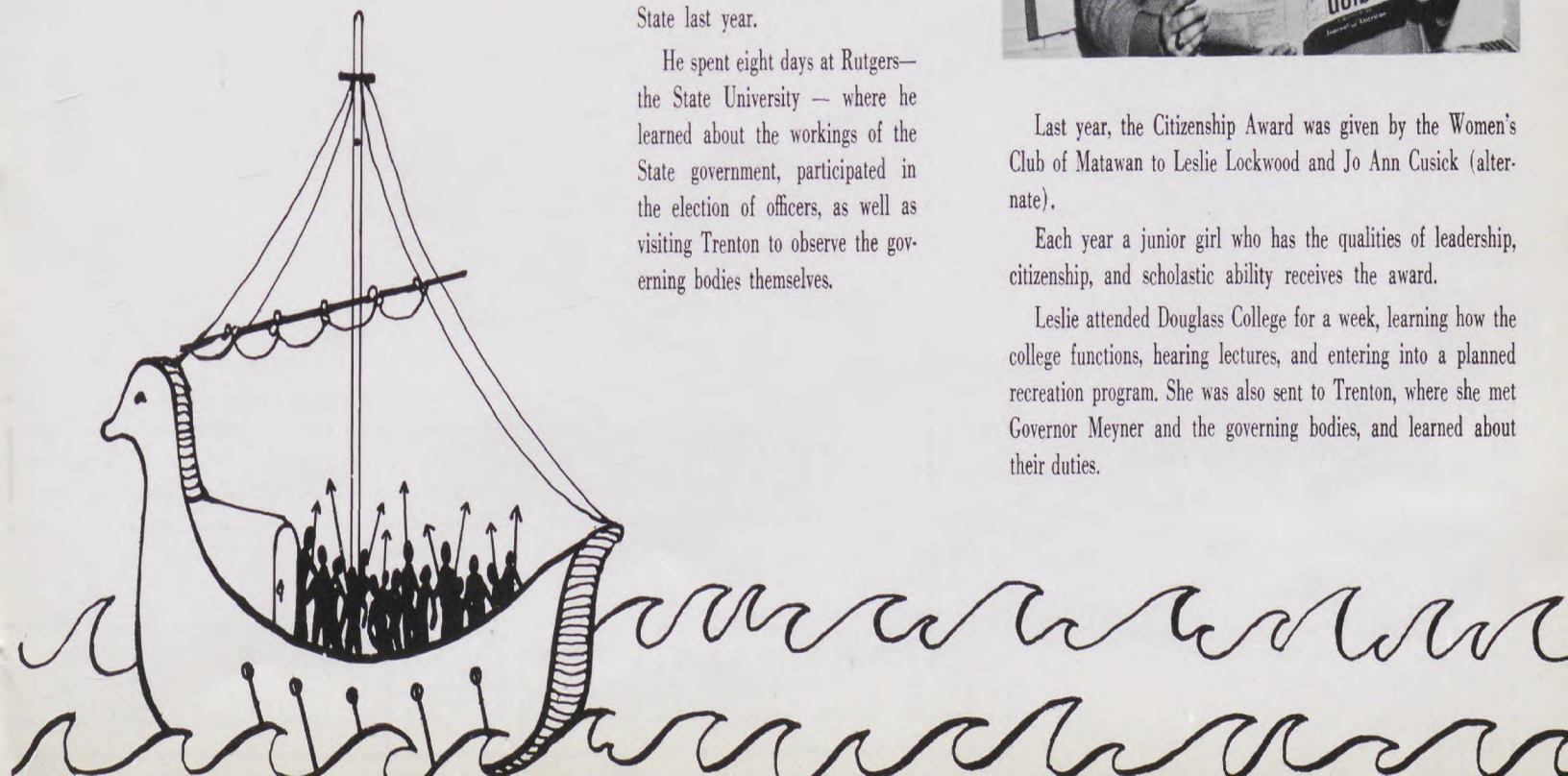
