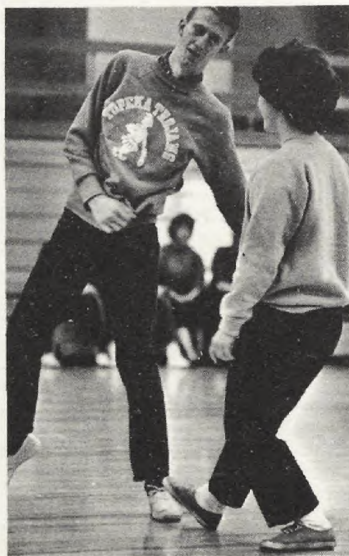

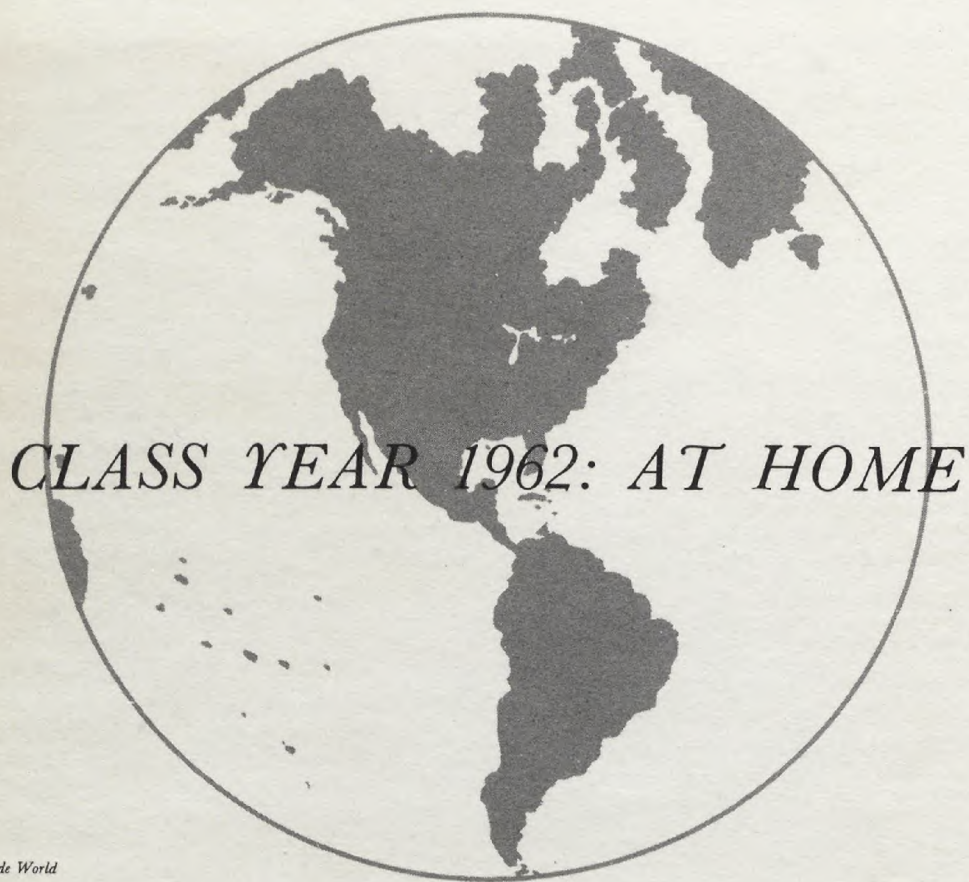

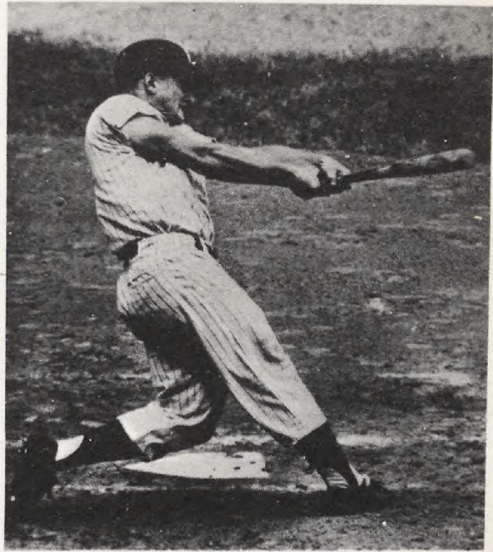

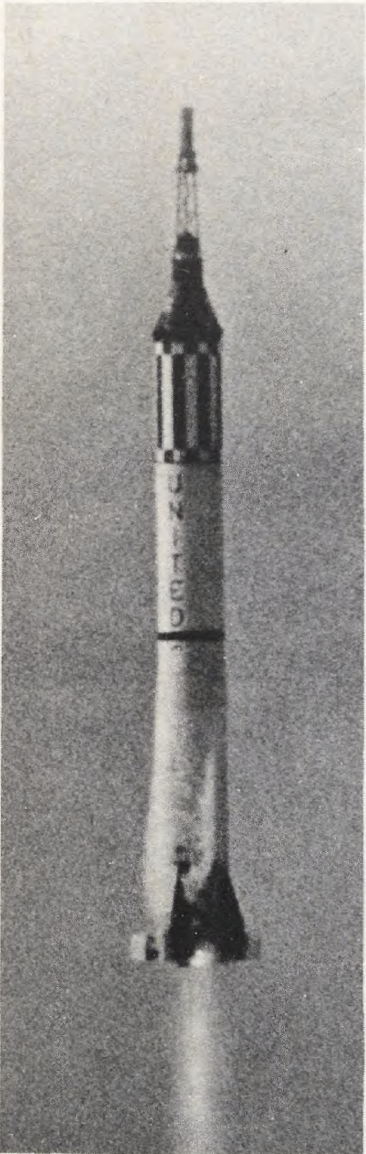

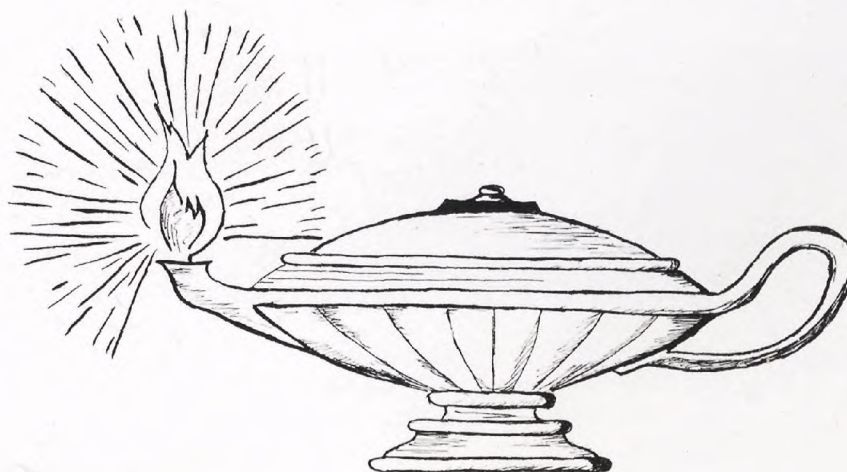
MR. RALPH MAURO

TO THE CLASS OF 1962:

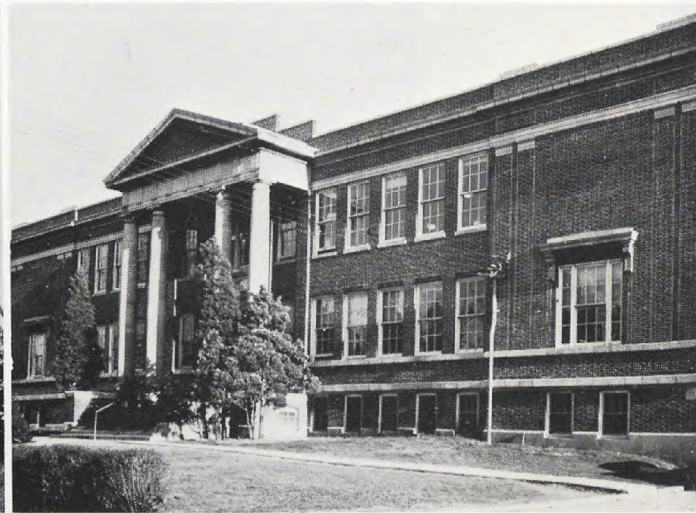

Pictured above is our first high school, now the grammar school used from 1895-1922. The other building, the high school now in use, was occupied by high school students from 1923-1962.



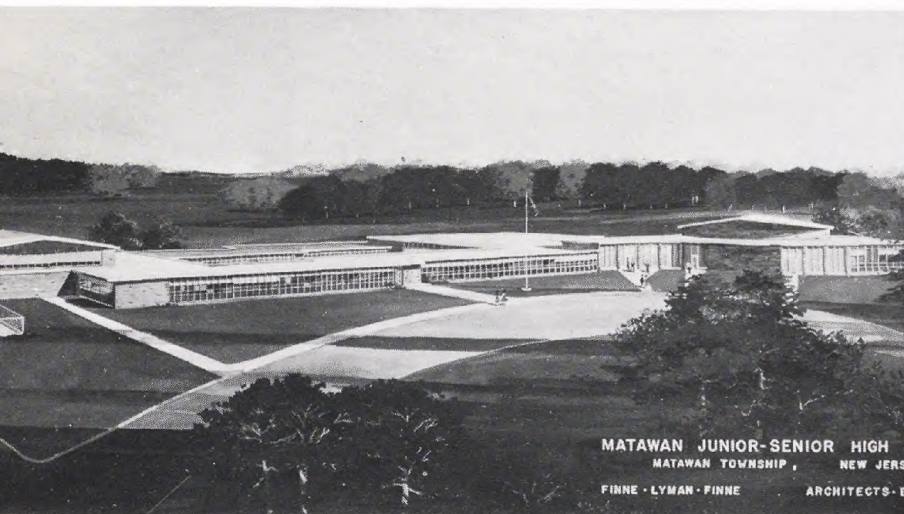
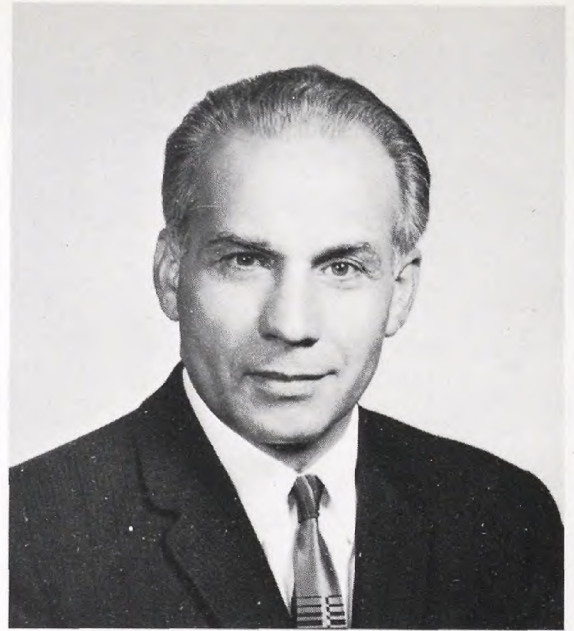

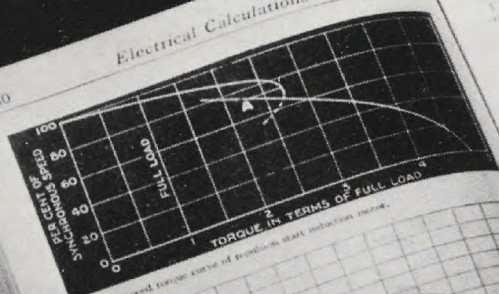


FIG. 67.—Speed torque curve of induction motor.

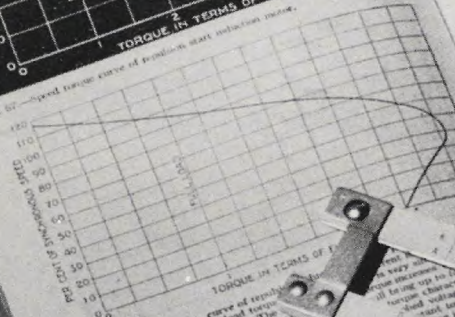


FIG. 68.—Speed torque curve of induction motor. The curve shows the torque developed by the motor at various speeds. The full load torque is indicated by the point where the curve crosses the 100% torque line. The curve also shows the torque developed by the motor at various speeds, including the starting torque and the maximum torque.

The single phase or two phase machines is 1 to 2, for three phase, 1 to 1.5, for six phase, 1 to 1.5 depending upon the kind of connection used for the transformer.

Example. A three phase rotary receiving alternating current at 125 volts will deliver direct current at 250 volts, while a three phase rotary receiving alternating current at 250 volts will deliver direct current at 500 volts.

Motor generator sets. The combination of a motor and a dynamo or alternator is used in preference to rotary converters when it is desirable that the generating element be independent of the a.c. line voltage so that any degree of voltage regulation can be obtained.

Some of these sets are used for frequency changing. The frequency obtained at the slip rings will depend on the speed of rotation, the number of poles for which the changer is wound and the frequency of the supply circuit.

The old formula holds:

$$N = \frac{r.p.m. \times \frac{P}{2}}{60} + \text{line frequency}$$

or excitation frequency.
N = slip ring frequency
P = number of poles

Example. Assume 60 cycle excitation and a 6 pole machine at 1,200 r.p.m. then

$$\frac{1,200 \times 6}{60} + 60 = 120 \text{ cycles.}$$

139. Spirals. (Definition.) The locus of a point that moves about a fixed point, and, at the same time, revolves about the center of the spiral, is called a spiral. 140. Polar equation of a locus. The equation of a locus may often be found with greater ease in polar than in rectangular coordinates. The method is similar to that for finding the equation in rectangular coordinates, and has already been applied to the straight line and the conic sections. (See Arts. 69, 78, 91, 103, 117.)

Example. In Fig. 126, OP is the diameter of a fixed circle. At P a tangent is drawn, while Q and the circle in E . The point T on the line EQ is taken so that $OT = OQ$. Find the equation of the locus of T .

FIG. 126.

Solution. Choose O as pole, OP as polar axis, and let $OT = 2a$. Let the polar coordinates of T be (ρ, θ) . Then since OT is a right angle, $PQ = OR = 2a \cos \theta$. Hence $\rho = OP = OQ = 2a \cos \theta$. This may be transformed to rectangular coordinates and obtain $\rho^2 = 2a \cos \theta$, the equation of the circle of Diodorus derived in article 125. Compare the derivations of the equation by the two methods.
