The origin of our school seal has an extremely unusual background. In 1950, the school held a student competition to make a design for the school ring. After an extremely difficult decision, a design created by Viola Stenger, a freshman at the time, was selected because of its simple, yet classy, style.

At the time, all school rings were oval in shape. Being a school of new trends, we opted for a round ring. Many companies were contacted, all but one said it could not be done. The one enterprising company was the Balfour Company, which processed the rings at a high price because the stones had to be specially made in Belgium. Since the ring was so unique, the administration decided the design should also be used as the school seal.




