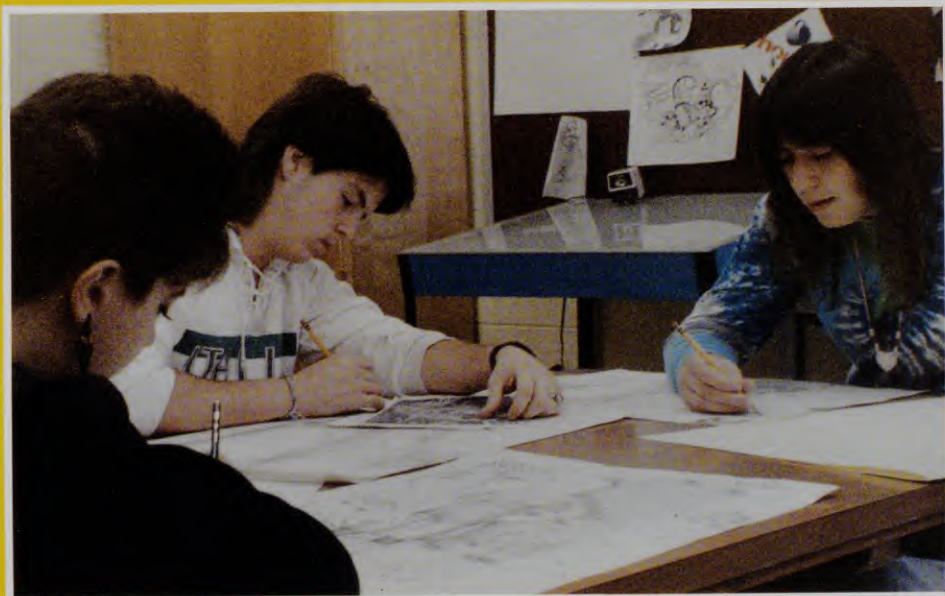

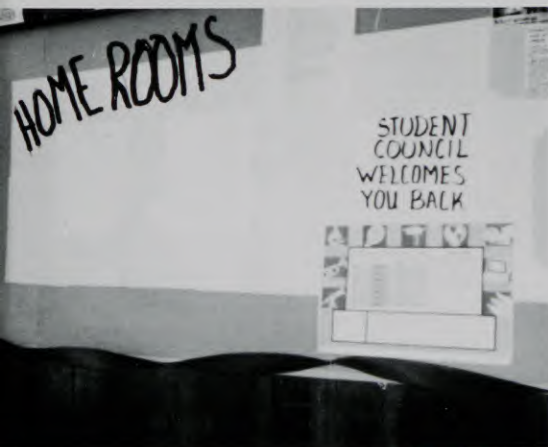

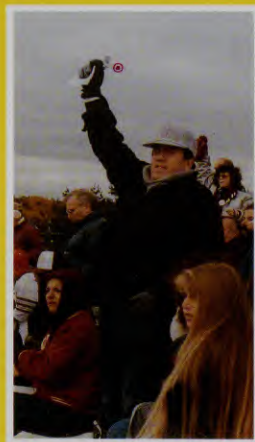
Your attention wanders from the game being played on the field, to the rallying

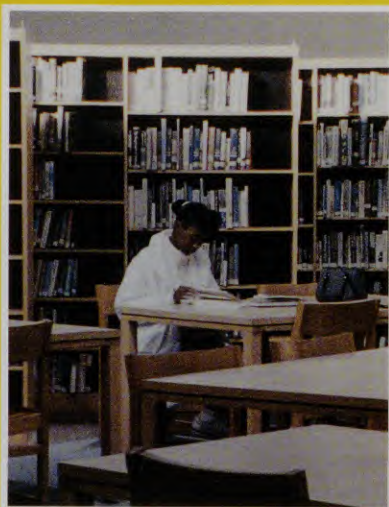
These changes have helped to raise student's spirit and enthusiasm for the school. They have definitely been an improvement for Matawan Regional.

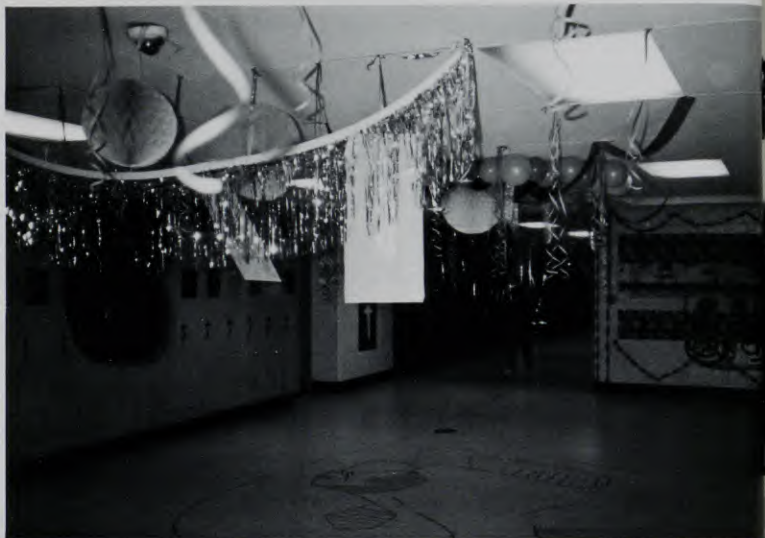

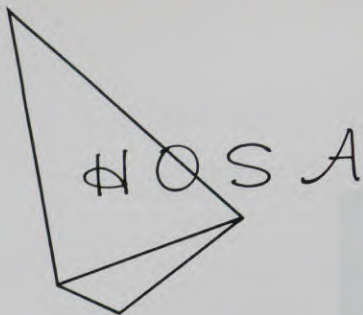

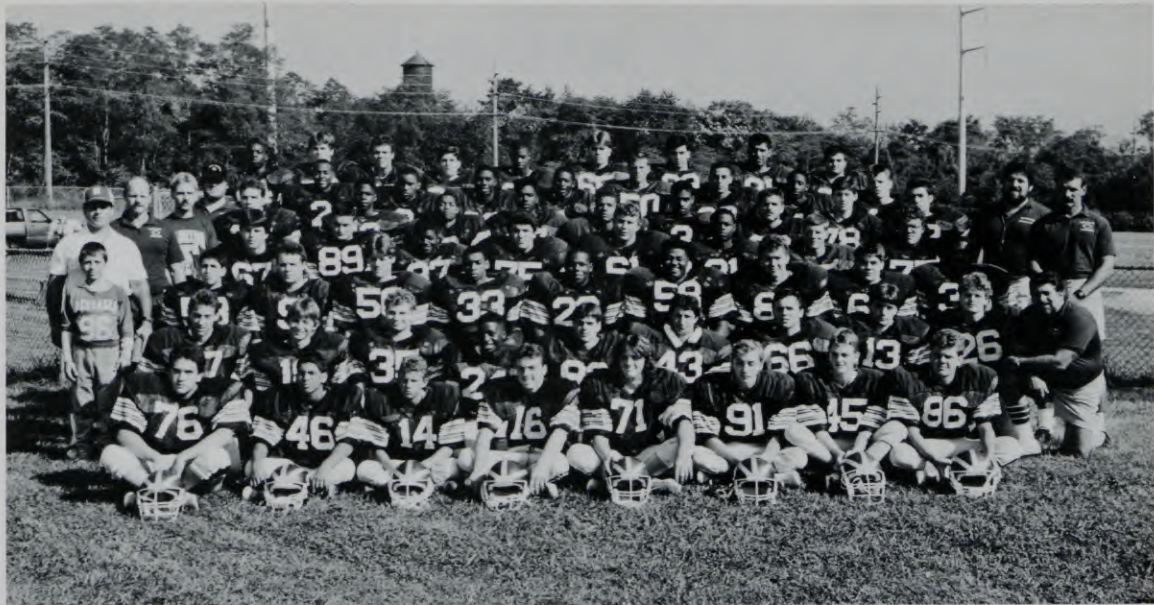
game for the state title the Huskies overwhelmed Franklin (also undefeated) with a score of 14-6. This ended a tremendous season under Head Coach Joe Martucci.

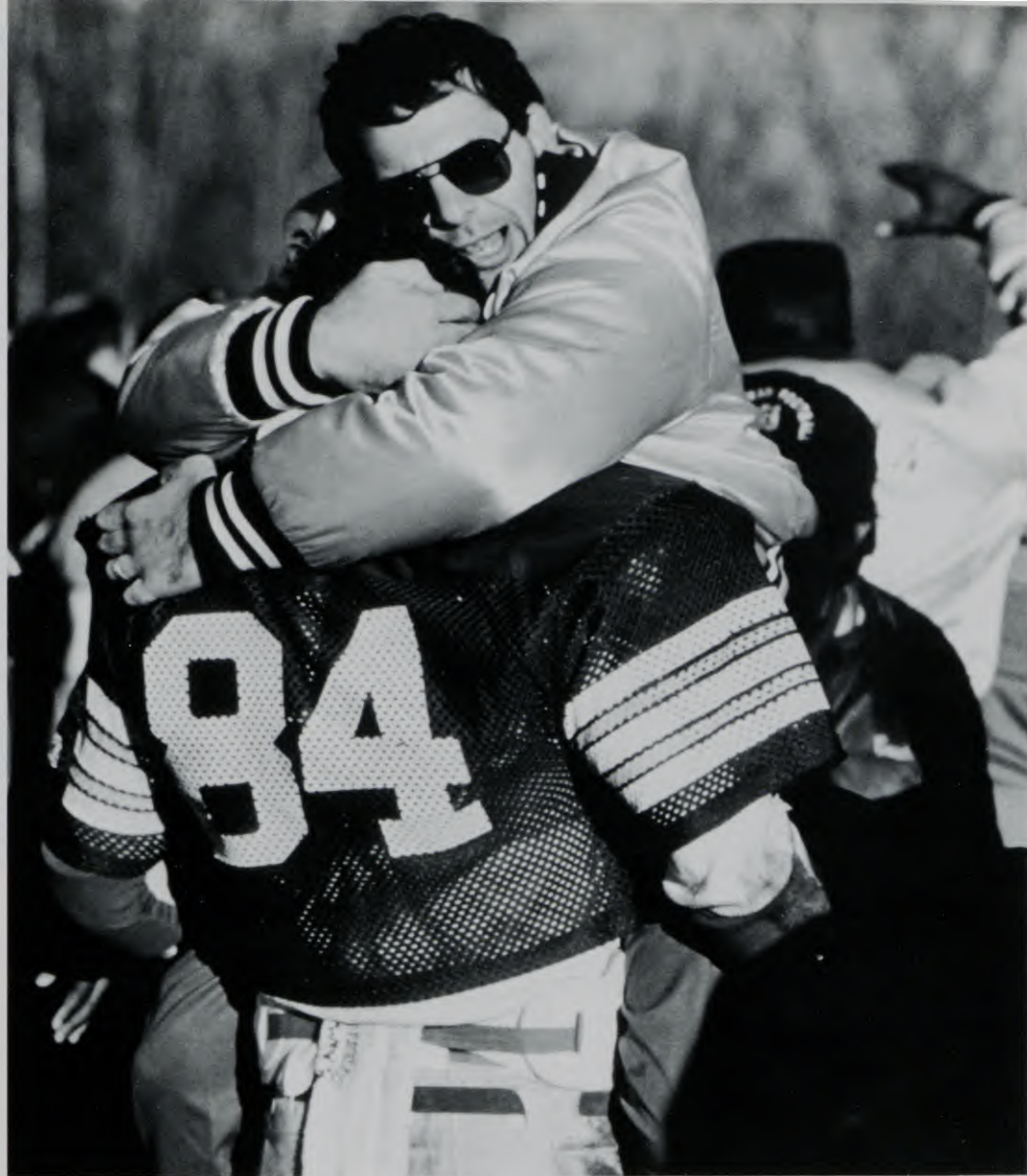

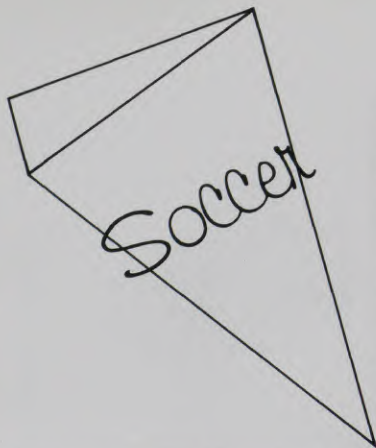

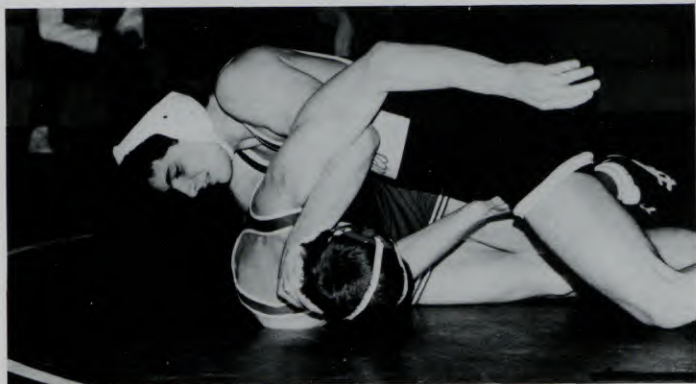
team." From the experience gained this year, there is no doubt that all of next year's matches will be standouts. The Matawan wrestlers will have the skill and the training to "pin" any opponent.



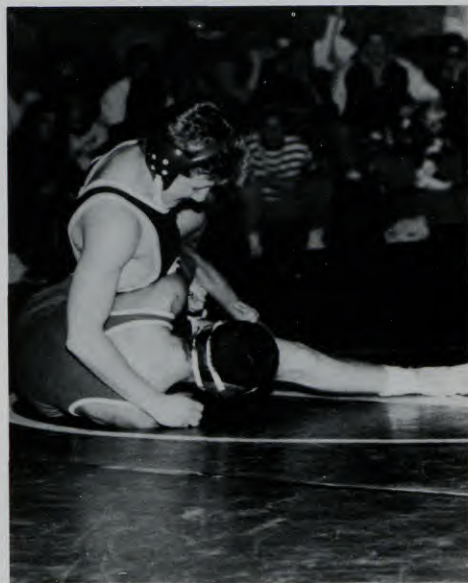
