#### NORIEGA GETS UNINVITED HOLIDAY GUESTS

On December 21, 1989, at 1A.M., U.S. troops entered Panama City. Their mission was to apprehend Panamanian dictator and drug trafficker Manuel Noriega. "Operation Just Cause" was the brainchild of President Bush, who felt the invasion was necessary in order to secure the safety of U.S. citizens in Panama and to protect the Panama Canal.

Noriega escaped the initial invasion, but turned up three days later at the Vatican Embassy in Panama City. On January 4, 1990, he surrendered himself to U.S. troops. The nation's leadership was assumed by democratically elected officials.

#### EARTHQUAKE ROCKS BAY AREA

On October 17, 1989 many Bay Area commuters were rushing home to catch the third game of the World Series. This would be a rush hour that they would never forget. At 5:04pm, the ground shook violently. In an instant, many homes were destroyed, bridges collapsed, and freeways buckled. As the earthquake struck, millions throughout the nation were watching the start of the third game when the earthquake struck.

The full damage was soon realized. Part of the San Francisco Bay Bridge collapsed, sending three to their deaths. The worst damage by far was the two-level Interstate 880 in Oakland, where the upper level of the highway collapsed onto the traffic clogged lower level, killing about one hundred. Water and electrical service was disrupted. Many were left homeless by the 7.0 earthquake; however, many feel that the preparations for such a disaster by the residents saved countless lives.

CHANGE SWEEPS COMMUNIST WORLD

What many thought impossible became reality this year. The Communist World began to give way, paving the road to democracy. Hungary reopened its border to the West, and announced that free elections, the first ever since the Communists took power, would be held. This had a "domino effect" on the other nations in the region. Poland announced it too would have free elections. However, the most momentous occasion was the announcement by the East German government that their borders would be open to the West. The 28 year old symbol of a divided world, the Berlin Wall, was dismantled in part early in November, sparking celebration on the streets of Berlin; families once divided were reunited as curious East Germans ventured into West Germany for the first time. In early December, Czechoslovakia announced its intentions to hold free elections. When the Romanian dictator Ceaucescu refused to give into the demands for a free election from his people, he was gunned down. This world revolution also affected the Soviet Union, where Mikhail Gorbachev instituted new reforms as Lithuania pushed for independence.



#### MANDELA FINALLY SET FREE

On February 17, 1990, Nelson Mandela emerged from Victor Verser Prison a free man. In 1964, the famous African Nationalist was convicted of plotting to overthrow the South African government. He spent the next twenty-seven years in prison. The decision to release Mandela came one week after South African President F. W. deKlerk lifted the thirty year ban on the African National Congress. Seemingly, Mandela's fierce commitment to the anti-apartheid movement has not been dulled by his long imprisonment. In his first address to the African people, he proclaimed 'Our march to freedom is irreversible. We must not allow fear to stand in our way."






