News

The Soviet Union today is a country with many of its economic and political institutions in turmoil. The economy of the country is suffering to the point of relying on foreign aid to survive the winter. The political system of the country is also in danger of collapse. The power of President Gorbachev is the source of constant argument among his opponents and many of the republics, including the Baltic states, continue to revolt against the established government. Whether or not Gorbachev will remain in power in the next few years is a question the world waits for an answer to.



James Florio Favorite or Flop?

In the first year of his administration, Governor Florio made many changes in state policies. Most of the changes were unpopular and ill received. Lay offs, cuts in state aid, and an increase in taxes were included in his plan to pull New Jersey out of its fiscal woes.

There were also major changes in educational funding from the state. The distribution of monies throughout the state will be more evenly divided, taking some from wealthier districts and relocating funds to those in need.

It remains to be seen whether or not these changes will benefit the Garden State. Time will tell. Florio's political career will be decided in the next three years.



When the Berlin Wall fell on Nov. 9, 1989, West German Chancellor Helmut Kohl jumped at the historic opportunity to bring his country back together again. He knew that German communism was gone and that unification was inevitable. Kohl had suggested a series of treaties to bring about unification beginning in 1993 or 1994, but the stampede of East Germans into the West (340,000 in 1989) convinced him that unification had to begin immediately.

In July, Helmut Kohl met with Mikhail Gorbachev in the Caucasus resort of Zheleznovodsk to negotiate Germany's future. They emerged with these agreements: A united Germany will be free to join NATO; the 380,000 Soviet troops in East Germany will be withdrawn within three to four years; NATO troops will stay out of East Germany for those years; the German armed forces will be cut from 590,000 to 370,000; and Germany will renounce nuclear, chemical and biological weapons.

The future of Germany now lies in the hands of the people.









On Jan. 16, 1991 the United States went to war. For six months, American an Allied troops had been stationed in the Saudi desert, waiting for a confrontation that was, from the first, inevitable. Months before Saddam Hussein, Iraq's military dictator, seized the wealthy nation of Kuwait. Outraged by this overt act of belligerence, the international community banded together to defeat the Iraqis. Troops were deployed to Saudi Arabia and a policy of watchful waiting began. Economic sanctions were imposed in the hopes that violence would prove unnecessary. Operation Desert Shield was born.

Three months later, the Allies had decided that they had waited long enough. Amid missile attacks and threats of chemical warfare, the battle was joined.
