MINNISINK TRAIC TO MAIN STREET

A GENESIS

On September 30th, 1686, the proprietors of East Jersey made a grant of four hundred acres of land to Stephen Warne and his son, Thomas. This grant included all the land between Gravelly Brook and Matawan Creek, and was known as Warne's Neck. Shortly thereafter, a group of Scottish immigrants purchased one hundred acres from Warne, in the vicinity of Mount Pleasant, now known as Freneau. They promptly divided their purchase into twenty-four lots of equal size, each being forty feet nine inches wide, by four thousand, eight hundred feet long. The logic for the strange configuration of these lots probably was to afford each property owner access to the only existing road on one end of his lot, and Matawan Creek on the other. This formal delineation of property lines marks the birth of the settlement later to become known as the Borough of Matawan.

However, if an interested researcher wishes to trace the roots of our town, this can hardly be seen as the beginning; rather, it may be viewed as the end of the beginning. Where did these adventurous Scotsmen come from, and what hazard of fate brought them to the virgin forests and meadows of Warne's Neck? Following the trail of events that brought these, our Scottish forefathers, to the shores of East Jersey, one finds not a record of brave and deliberate plans to establish a community in the New World, but rather a tale of persecution, suffering, tragedy and death, which led to the founding of our town.

In England, James the Second had assumed the throne. The new king had inherited the peculiar traits of the Stuarts. His first purpose was to overcome the Parliamentary power and make himself absolute ruler. He was likewise a Roman Catholic, and one of his objects was the suppression of English Protestantism. A revolt by English Protestants was quickly suppressed and came to an end with the capture and beheading of James Fitzroy, Duke of Monmouth. Hundreds were executed and thousands imprisoned in Scotland when they refused to sign the oath of allegiance. Among these dissenters was George Scot, Caird of Pitlochie. He requested that a number of these prisoners be turned over to him as identured servants, so that he might sail to America and found a colony where their form of Scottish Presbyterianism might be permitted.

The request was granted, and in 1685 the fifty ton ship "Henry and Francis" set sail with about two hundred men and momen aboard. It was a most disastrous voyage. Hardly had the ship cleared port, when a malignant fever broke out, exacerbated by the weakened condition of the prisoners, and the poor quality of the food on board. The tiny ship battled the Atlantic storms for fifteen weeks in crossing, during which time between sixty and seventy people perished, including Caird Pitlochie and his wife and the entire crew, with the exception of the captain and the boatswain. When the pitiful survivors finally landed at Perth Amboy, they were greeted with cool indifference, and advised to seek aid from a settlement "a little way up country" (probably a group of Scottish Quakers at Copanemus, near Freehold). Since the Laird of Pitlochie had died, the survivors were no longer in bondage and considered free men. It was at this point that some of their number became acquainted with Chomas Warne and purchased the land from him to form their settlement, which they named New Aberdeen.

Although originally settled somewhat to the south of Matawan's business district, the village grew and expanded toward the north, along the banks of Matawan Creek, the Creek becoming increasingly important in the development of the area; indeed, as time progressed into the Eighteenth Century, the character of the village changed. What once had been a simple farming community, now became a major shipping port, and it was during this period that the name of the town was changed, by common usage, to Middletown Point.

During the early Eighteenth Century, Middletown comprised a huge area; including most of Monmouth County, a portion of Ocean County, even a strip of Middlesex County, and Middletown Point was the principal shipping point for this entire area. The Creek boasted an average depth of twelve feet, and was wide enough for ocean-going ships to sail its length and find safe harbor at the various docks that appeared along its shores. The point designated "head of navigation" may now be found at the site where Route #516 crosses the southwest end of Cake Cefferts. Old records indicate at least nine docks along the creek within the Borough limits, in addition to a ferry at Ravine Drive.

At the outbreak of the War for Independence, when the citizenry was forced to choose between loyalty to the Crown or the new free government established at Philadelphia, the sentiments of the people of Middletown Point weighed heavily (but by no means unanimously), toward the principle of freedom. Many heroes in the fight for freedom emerged from the small village, the best known probably being Philip Freneau, who, though not a soldier, stung the British and rallied the patriots with his rhetoric. Freneau has become known nationwide as "The Poet of the Revolution". Others who distinguished themselves in the struggle were the Burrowes family; old "Corn King" and his son, Major John Burrowes; General David Forman, and Major Thomas Hunn, commander of the local militia.

This hotbed of what they considered treasonous activity did not escape the notice of the British and Cories, and Middletown Point became the target of repeated raids and reprisals staged by the enemy. Following the Revolution, industry and shipping flourished in Middletown Point, including several mills on the Creek and Gravelly Brook, a tannery, pottery, brickyard and potash factory. A description of the Point in "Gordons Gazeteer" in 1834 states:

> "it lies on a bank elevated about fifty feet above the stream, a marsh on the opposite site; contains a Presbyterian Church, from 75 to 100 buildings, 8 or 10 stores, 4 taverns and a grist mill. Carge quantities of pork, rye, corn, cord-wood and garden truck are thence sent to New York".

As time passed, sail gave way to steam, and engine-driven vessels replaced the more picturesque but slower sloops in carrying freight and passengers to New York. Soon even this came to an end, as timber cutting, farming and building along the Creek resulted in excessive siltation, rendering the Creek no longer navigable.

Still the village prospered; in the ensuing years it would become the home of two tile factories, two piano factories, a furniture factory, a plant manufacturing buffing wheels and an electroplating plant. In 1830 a group of merchants obtained a charter for the Farmers and Merchants Bank, and for thirty-four years this was the only bank in Monmouth County. Business and industry were enhanced when the railroad came through in 1875.

The name Middletown Point was officially changed to Matawan in 1865 in order to avoid confusing postal mixups with Middletown. The name "Matawan" probably derives from the name of a branch of the Raritan Indians who frequented this area; an early Dutch map designates the land in the vicinity of the Creek as "Matavancons".

In the Twentieth Century the advent of the automobile and mass transportation wrought fundamental changes in the character of Matawan, as in all small towns in America; the people no longer had to depend on local industry and farms to provide employment, food and services. Today the majority of residents travel out of town to their places of employment; most of the food they consume and products they purchase originate perhaps thousands of miles away. What, then, is the future of Matawan?

With the community no longer necessary to provide the necessities of life, will the pride and concern of its citizens become limited to the property lines surrounding their homes, and their interest in the town limited to receiving those services necessary to maintain a comfortable living standard? We think not. Simply by becoming residents of Matawan, whether by birth or by choice, we have become part of a vibrant, growing and enduring communion of spirit; an entity whose roots trace back CHREE HUNDRED YEARS to a birth conceived in dire hardship and suffering. It is ours to rekindle the flame of community spirit, to preserve the remaining links that connect us with the past, and to build for the future on the strength of our proud heritage.

PHICIP MORIN FRENEAU 1752 - 1832

Philip Morin Freneau was born in New York City in 1752. While he was still a haby, his father, Pierre Freneau, a French Huguenot, purchased an estate of more than a thousand acres at Mount Pleasant, now part of Matawan Borough, and it was here that Philip spent most of his life.

Freneau was graduated from Princeton University in 1771, and numbered among his friends and classmates are found such illustrious names as James Madison, later to become President of the United States; Hugh Henry Brackenridge, who gained renown as a prominent jurist in the frontier village of Pittsburgh; Aaron Burr and Cighthorse Harry Cee.

While perhaps not listed among the "great" poets produced in this country, Freneau was certainly our first national poet. Much of his work is too heavily weighted with unpoetic political philosophy, but this reveals another facet of this remarkable mentality; this alone being sufficient to justify his immortality in the history of America. Freneau had a keen wit and a fearless spirit; he hated tyranny and was an outspoken champion of liberty. He soon incurred the wrath of the British through his many articles urging the Colonists to "throw off the Tyrant's Yoke", and was twice captured and imprisoned.

Once the Colonies had proclaimed their independence and established a democracy, he was quick to attack anyone he considered a threat to that principle. During the formative period of this government, his sharp satire won him many friends and not a few enemies. Washington spoke of him as "that rascal Freneau"; Jefferson said he "saved the Constitution".

In 1791 Freneau became editor of the "New York Daily Advertiser"; then editor of the "National Gazette", published in Philadelphia; and later published his own newspaper, "The Jersey Chronicle" at his home in Mount Pleasant. The "Chronicle" was the first newspaper to be published in Monmouth County.

These were times of great political foment; the infant Constitution was extremely shaky, being assailed by extremists of both Hamiltonian Federalists and Jeffersonian States Rightists, and Freneau, by means of his journalistic position; and through innumerable articles submitted to current periodicals, exerted considerable influence on public opinion.

The family home and print shop at Mount Pleasant burned to the ground in 1818. After the fire, Freneau moved in with relatives on a farm near Freehold. And here it was, during a severe snowstorm, that death came to the Poet of the Revolution on the night of December 18, 1832, in his eighty-first year. The "Monmouth Inquirer" of Freehold reported:

> "Mr. Freneau was in the village; and started, toward evening, to go home, about two miles. In attempting to go across, he appears to have got lost and mired in a bog meadow, where his corpse was discovered yesterday morning."

At his own request, he was buried on his beloved estate at Mount Pleasant. His gravesite, in a small fenced-in enclosure, and surmounted by a marble monument, may be visited today in Freneau, that section of Matawan Borough named in honor of this talented patriot.
