WHAT

IS THE AMERICAN WOMEN'S VOLUNTARY SERVICES?

It is an entirely democratic national organization, with a place for every woman who is loyal to the United States.

WHAT
IS ITS AIM?

To give you free training and help place you in the defense program of your country.

To aid such organizations as the Red Cross and Office of Civilian Defense. The Army, Navy, Marines and public departments.

WHAT
DO I DO TO JOIN?

Go or telephone to Greater New York Headquarters at 11 East 58th Street. Pl. 3-6478. Tell them your address and they will give you the address of your nearest Unit. There are 92 Units in Greater N. Y.

> WHAT DOES IT COST?

Nothing but your time and willingness to aid in the defense of your country.

WHAT

COURSES SHOULD I TAKE FOR MY OWN BENEFIT (If I can't volunteer my services?)

We suggest that every woman should take;

FIRST AID (given by Red Cross Instructors) 11 lectures two hours each. Text book 60c.

BASIC NUTRITION (given by Red Cross Instructors) 10 lectures two hours each.

HOME NURSING (given by Red Cross Instructors)
12 lectures two hours each.

CIVILIAN PROTECTION 8 lectures two hours each.

WHAT

IS CIVILIAN PROTECTION?

It is a course teaching you incendiary bomb control, air raid shelters, evacuation, war gases and the latest general information on civilian defense.

AM I

AN AIR RAID WARDEN? (after taking the course)

No. To become an air raid warden, you must apply at your Police Dep't.

DO I GET IN THE MOTOR TRANSPORT SERVICE?

You must be an American citizen.
You must pass Civilian Protection.
You must pass First Aid.
You must pass Map Reading (8 hours class work, 2 half days field).
You must pass Motor Mechanics. (10 lectures two hours each).

WHAT

MUST I HAVE TO BE IN THE MOTOR TRANSPORT?

You must be fingerprinted.
You must have a car and gas.
You must have insurance.
You must have your driver's license.
You must have an AWVS uniform.
(50 hours volunteer service required).

WHAT

USE CAN I BE IF I DRIVE MY OWN CAR, BUT CAN'T TAKE THE COURSES?

You can be in the Motor Messenger Service.

CAN I

TAKE THE MAP READING AND MOTOR MECHANICS COURSES WITHOUT JOINING THE TRANSPORT SERVICE

Yes, they are open to everyone, but Motor Transport volunteers come first.

WHAT

OTHER COURSES DO YOU TEACH?

INTERNATIONAL MORSE CODE TRAINING. (6 to 8 months for Class B Amateur Radio license.)

TELEPRINTING. (Must own equipment which costs \$2.50.)

PHOTOGRAPHY FOR DEFENSE (small charge for use of dark room, must own camera) 6 lectures 11/2 hours each.

DEFENSE GARDENING. 5 lectures 11/2 hours each.

PHYSICAL FITNESS. 8 sessions 11/2 hours each.

And many others according to local needs. Units in different localities have different programs.

WHAT

USE CAN I BE IF I CAN'T TAKE THE COURSES?

You can knit, sew, collect and distribute clothing, in our Volunteer Workshops.

You can help in the office.

You can help in salvage and collecting books, (for the armed forces).

You can volunteer your services to help with children, the sick, blind, crippled and unfortunate, as school defense aides, school nurse aides and countless other jobs, as the needs arise.

You can help sell Defense Bonds and Stamps.

I WANT

TO START A UNIT IN MY HOME TOWN, HOW DO I DO IT?

National Headquarters are at 181 Madison Ave. Go there, or write to Program and Extension Dep't.

I WANT

TO TEACH A COURSE FOR THE AWVS, HOW DO I DO IT?

See Instruction Dep't. at National, or if in Greater New York apply at Instruction Dep't. at 11 East 58th Street.

ARE

THE TEACHERS PAID?

No, the AWVS is entirely voluntary.

HOW

DO I GET A UNIFORM?

You buy one from the AWVS shop at 14 East 52nd Street after you have served the required number of hours and have required authorization. Uniforms are not compulsory, except in Motor Transport.

WHAT

CAN I DO IN THE AWVS IF I AM UNDER 182

There is a Junior Auxiliary, with courses and duties for girls from 14 to 18.

WHAT

USE WILL THE AWVS BE WHEN THE WAR IS OVER?

It will continue its plan of free training and meet the existing needs for community service.
