Police suspect juveniles in Cheesequake blaze

Three weekend fires charred 230 acres in and around Cheesequake Park

A person is believed to be the cause behind one of the three brush fires that scorched 230 acres in Old Bridge over the weekend.

Police, along with Thomas Gerity, township fire marshal for districts 1, 2 and 4, have questioned four juveniles suspected of starting the first fire, which began at 5:15 p.m. on Friday near Cheesequake State Park, according to Old Bridge Police Lt. Jack Sweeney.

"The investigation has now been turned over to Fire Marshal Gerity," Sweeney said, adding that as of Tuesday no one had been charged with starting the fire.

Friday night's fire began near Joseph Court in a remote area of tidal marsh and forest adjacent to Cheesequake State Park.

The fire destroyed 80 acres before firefighters got it under control around 9 p.m., according to a report released by the New Jersey Forest Fire Service.

Firefighters from all four of the township's fire districts fought the blaze. Additionally, Forest Fire Service resources assigned to the incident included 25 fire-

fighters, five wildland engines, one bulldozer, two air tankers carrying about 300 gallons of water and one observation helicopter.

"The fire was pretty intense," said Dominic Cicio, coordinator of Old Bridge's Office of Emergency Management.

The Friday night blaze allegedly began after four juveniles who had been swimming in Cheesequake State Park were exiting the park but decided to stop and light a fire by burning sticks in a wooded area, according to the police report.

At one point, some of the juveniles began burning a sock. The sock was dropped on a pile of leaves, starting the fire, police said.

According to the police report, all of the youths involved attempted to extinguish the fire but were unable to stop it. At that point they fled the area.

It was also reported that one of the youths was trying to stop the others from starting the fire but was pushed to the side by another youth.

A second brush fire began Saturday just after 2 p.m. outside the state park but in close proximity to Friday's fire, Cicio said.

Dry weather and wind gusts of up to 25 mph caused the fire to spread through 151 acres of marshland before it was contained at 10 p.m.

"It went across Dock Road, across Route 34 to the border of Cheesequake Park," Cicio said.

More than 25 homes on Michelle and Janice courts were evacuated during the fire, which spread into a remote portion of the park. All four of the township's fire districts responded to the fire, along with the Forest Fire service.

Firefighters fought the blaze in brush trucks, according to Cicio. Brush trucks are specially equipped pickup trucks with heavy metal cages attached to the frame. They enable firefighters to get close to the fire while trying to extinguish it.

A wide-tread bulldozer contained the fire by pouring dirt over an area in the center of the marshland, Cicio said.

Minor injuries were sustained by a state firefighter who was bitten by a nonpoisonous snake while fighting the blaze, and a firefighter from the Cheesequake Volunteer Fire Company complained of chest pains and difficulty breathing. Both men were treated at the scene for their injuries, according to Al Miller, captain of the Cheesequake Volunteer First Aid Squad.

Cheesequake State Park, which was evacuated and closed Saturday, reopened on Sunday.

A third fire began at 7 p.m. Sunday approximately 200 yards from the area of the previous fire, at the edge of an old landfill behind the London Terrace apartments, Route 9. The fire destroyed approximately 1 to 2 acres of marshland, but was quickly extinguished, according to fire officials.

None of the homes near any of the three fires sustained serious damage.

According to police, the causes of all three fires are still under investigation.



Tax hike will be cut in half

Municipal and school officials agree to make cuts in defeated school tab

OLD BRIDGE — School and municipal officials have reached a tentative agreement to cut the proposed 2001-02 school tax rate from 4 cents to 2 cents per \$100 of assessed valuation.

The agreement was reached during Monday's meeting between an ad hoc committee of the Township Council and members of the Board of Education regarding the proposed 2001-02 budget, which was defeated in the April 17 school board election.

The council will be voting on the revised budget at a special meeting with the school board Monday at 6 p.m. at the municipal complex.

"I don't see any problems (with the revised budget)," said Councilman Larry Redmond, chairman of the school budget committee. "I thought things went very well. I don't see any trouble passing it this Monday night."

Redmond credited Dr. R. Gregory Quirk, assistant superintendent for business with the Old Bridge School District, for coming up with \$300,000 in cuts that could be applied to the budget.

"We found that Dr. Quirk made a very good gesture by finding \$300,000 in savings," Redmond said. "It (the cuts) was something they hadn't anticipated when they were putting the school budget together."

Most of the money will come from teacher retirements, Redmond said. Retiring teachers are at the top of the pay scale and therefore earn a higher salary than new teachers, Redmond said. Those teachers will be replaced with new teachers who are at the low end of the pay scale.

Under the revised plan, no student pro-

grams have been cut, Redmond said.

By working with township auditor Gene Farrell, an agreement was made that would allow the township to use its lease-purchase ability to help the school district pay for capital projects.

Councilmen Richard Greene and Edward Testino were also members of the ad hoc budget committee.

"I think it is a fair and reasonable compromise," Greene said. "Especially since members of the council have shown that we want to hold the line on taxes."

Greene noted that the Board of Education has also made efforts to keep taxes low by keeping the tax rate at \$1.85 for the last couple of years. This April marked the first time in three years that Old Bridge residents rejected a school budget.

If approved, the proposed 2-cent hike in the school tax rate will increase the rate from \$1.85 to \$1.87 per \$100 of the assessed value of a home. For the owner of property assessed at \$150,000, the increase would mean paying \$2,805 in school taxes next year — a hike of approximately \$30.

The increase in the school tax rate is a result of pressures being placed on the school budget, including escalating energy costs and increased transportation expenses, as well as increases in employee health benefits from last year, Quirk said in a previous interview.

School officials also attributed part of the increase in spending to upgrading technology throughout the district's 12 elementary schools, two middle schools and high school.

Greene and Redmond expressed disappointment at the low number of residents who showed up to vote on the \$98 million budget. With 1,695 residents voting, the budget failed by a slim margin of 65 votes. Only 5 percent of the township's 30,000 registered voters voted in the election.

However, Greene said he believes most residents will be satisfied with the final outcome.

Police still seek culprits in 3 April bomb threats

O.B. High School officials working on new plan for reacting to threats

OLD BRIDGE — A week since the two campuses of Old Bridge High School were evacuated for yet another bomb threat, police continue to search for those responsible.

While police investigate the matter, the Board of Education is offering a \$1,000 reward for information leading to the arrest and conviction of the subject or subjects responsible for calling in the April 25 bomb threat to police.

"The police department is working on the case right now," Old Bridge Police Lt. Jack Sweeney said Tuesday. "Youths have been questioned regarding the bomb threat, but no arrests have been made."

Christopher Traficante, principal of Old Bridge High School, has scheduled a special faculty meeting today for 2:30 p.m.

"We need input from our faculty to discuss what we have learned from this situation," he said.

The principal said he plans to implement what was learned during the most recent bomb threat to help keep it from happening again.

The school is also in the process of implementing a crisis management plan.

"It is a district level plan that is constantly changing and ongoing,"

Traficante said, adding that as part of the plan, existing strategies are being developed for students and faculty.

The April 25 bomb threat was the second such threat the school district received in a week. On April 17, a note that a bomb was scheduled to go off at 1:50 p.m. was found written on the radiator in a classroom on the east campus of the high school, according to police.

Students were dismissed at 1:15 p.m., approximately five minutes before the normal dismissal time. At the same time, another note was found scribbled in a restroom of the Carl Sandburg Middle School, which is adjacent to the east campus of the high school on Route 516.

Both buildings were searched, but nothing was found, according to police.

"The board, the administration and the police department are committed to finding and prosecuting to the fullest extent of the law, the perpetrator or perpetrators involved with this bomb threat," Lori Luicci, public relations officer for the Old Bridge School District, said last week.

The district is also looking to recover all costs incurred by the school district and the township due to the bomb threat.

If school is canceled at all during the remainder of the year, Luicci said, school days will have to be made up on Saturdays or at the end of the school year. The state requires that school be in session for at least 180 days, and since Old Bridge High School has now used all of its "snow days," future cancellations will have to be made up.



Sayreville may change street names, addresses

Police hope new system will avoid confusion during emergency calls

SAYREVILLE — An official change to several street names and house numbers affecting some 445 borough residences may take place on May 14.

The Borough Council and police officials are finalizing the new names of several streets and house numbers in several sections of the borough, and an ordinance to implement the changes may be introduced at the council's May 14 meeting at 7:30 p.m. at Borough Hall, Main Street.

According to police officials, the changes are part of the Police Department's effort to fix problems with the 911 emergency phone system. Several streets and names are repeated throughout the borough, and the current police 911 system does not identify duplicate street names in town, thereby creating a safety hazard.

With the police department's new computer-aided dispatch (CAD) system, the fire department, police, first aid and other emergency services will be able to identify a person's location within seconds. The CAD system will also enable police to keep their records on a computer database,

eliminating the current "paper trail" record-keeping system currently used. Additionally, the new mechanism will allow computer mapping of the entire town, helping police to identify crime trends and to better allocate manpower.

But before the system can be fully implemented, the council has to change the more than 700 "problem" addresses.

All the affected residences have been notified by police, and at least two meetings have been held regarding the upcoming changes. Most residents who will be affected have said they are in favor of the proposed changes, although some residents have expressed opposition.

According to police, most of the changes would be minor. Street names such as Thomas Street, for example, would be changed to Thomas Lane, Thomas Court or Thomas Avenue.

Any home whose address is out of sequence from other homes on the same street will likely have a digit of the house number changed to put the homes back into sequence.

The changes would go into effect sometime in July, police said.


Also, postal officials have been notified about the proposed changes, and residents will be sent change-of-address forms. Mail addressed to the former addresses would be forwarded to the residence for several months, police said.



Task force arrests 4 on drug charges

The Bayshore Narcotics Task Force and the Old Bridge Township Police Narcotics Bureau, in a joint investigation into the sale of ecstasy in the area, arrested four people on two search warrants the night of April 26-27 in Old Bridge. The two month long investigation initially led the task force to two brothers from the Laurence Harbor section of town, according to police.

Jason Kosloski, 19, and Sean Kosloski, 18, both of 160 Twilight Ave., were initially charged with distribution to undercover officers in March and April. A subsequent search warrant executed at their home April 26 resulted in the seizure of ecstasy, five bottles of liquid ketamine, and a large amount of LSD.

Minutes before the search, police said it was learned that a third suspect, Jeff Borawski, Pinetree Boulevard, Old Bridge, had just made a delivery of ketamine to Twilight Avenue. Police said a subsequent consent search of Borawski's vehicle

yielded an additional four bottles of ketamine and just under a half-ounce of cocaine.

The Bayshore Task Force and Old Bridge Narcotics Unit secured a second search warrant, this time for the home of Borawski. Approximately 10 grams of cocaine and marijuana were found at his home. Jason Borawski was arrested for possession of marijuana at the Pinetree Boulevard home, and approximately \$1,000 in cash and one vehicle were seized.

Bail was set at \$100,000, with no 10 percent option, for Jason Kosloski. Bail for Sean Kosloski was \$75,000 with no 10 percent option; bail for Jeff Borawski was set at \$50,000 with no 10 percent option. Jason Borawski was released without bail.





It's a natural reaction these days for some people to look at the news coming out of elementary and high schools around the nation and to ask the question, Where is the good news about our students?

Lack of awareness shown in New Jersey's electricity deregulation

New Jersey officials, including our former governor, appear to have displayed a lack of understanding of both economics and history when they deregulated our electric industry.

As the late British economist John Maynard Keynes pointed out, electric utilities are inherently natural monopolies. Unlike more competitive industries, whose prices are set by the laws of supply and demand, utilities were pretty much free to set their own prices. For this reason, they were kept tightly regulated or owned outright by municipalities, states or nations to minimize their tendency to "gouge" captive customers.

New Jersey residents appear unaware that they have had a choice in electric suppliers since 1999, though unlike large industrial and commercial customers, few suppliers are willing to deal with them. They seem also unaware of the consequences of the many recent utility mergers which will result in a vastly less competitive market with far fewer or possibly only unregulated regional monopoly suppliers with very likely higher prices when the lid comes off our electric rates in 2003.

Deregulation was originally intended as one method of fostering development of alternate fuels, power sources and to reduce our dependence on imported oil, when first envisioned by the U.S. Congress. Our plan, twisted by the demands of special interest groups, appears to meet none of the goals.

Indeed, our legislators should have been well aware that the benefits of deregulation to small consumers would be minimal, as there have been no significant breakthroughs in electric generation or distribution technology. However, very large price increases were more likely if shortages or price manipulation were to develop. Small users would bear not only the cost of keeping the utilities afloat but also the utilities' additional costs to resupply power to customers dropped by competing suppliers.

Our legislators should look at the hideous cost of the California plan and decide if it is better to act.

Police may impound cars of drunken drivers

TRENTON — If you drink and drive, you will lose your car for 12 hours, according to a new law.

Acting Gov. Donald T. DiFrancesco has signed a bill authorizing law enforcement agencies to impound the vehicles of persons arrested for driving while intoxicated (DWI) for up to 12 hours after they are charged. The bill also allows law enforcement personnel to issue responsibility warnings to persons assuming custody of anyone arrested for DWI.

"The legislation I signed is a good law, a compassionate law and a life-saving law," DiFrancesco said on April 19. "Drunken drivers will no longer be able to simply return to their cars after they are released from police custody. Those who pick up a drunken driver from the police station will receive a clear and stern warning of their responsibility not to let that person get back behind the wheel."

According to a press release from the governor's office, the bill was introduced following a tragic incident in Egg Harbor Township in July 2000 in which a man, John Elliott, was killed by an intoxicated driver who had been arrested, released and allowed to get back into his vehicle and drive.

"While it is unavoidable, perhaps even proper, that 'John's Law' will remain a reminder of the tragic way John Elliott's life was taken, let us strive to ensure that New Jersey citizens will also come to know the heroic way his life was lived," said DiFrancesco.

The legislation signed by the acting governor reads that whenever a person is sum-

moned by or on behalf of a person who has been arrested for DWI, in order to transport or accompany the arrested individual following release, the law enforcement agency shall provide the person responding with a written statement advising him or her of the potential criminal and civil liability for permitting or facilitating the arrested's operation of a motor vehicle while intoxicated.

Under current law, a person who permits another person to drive while intoxicated violates the state's DWI statute.

In addition to the written statement, the bill authorizes the arresting law enforcement agency to impound the vehicle operated by the person arrested for DWI for a period up to 12 hours following arrest, if the agency determines that the release of the vehicle to the person arrested represents a threat to public safety.

The bill further requires the person to whom the statement is issued to acknowledge, in writing, receipt of the statement. If the person refuses to sign the acknowledgment, the person arrested will not be released.

According to DiFrancesco, the written statement is intended to increase the awareness of a person picking up someone arrested for driving while intoxicated, warning them of the personal consequences they may suffer if they permit an intoxicated person to drive.

Furthermore, he said, the statement and acknowledgment might assist in the prosecution of those individuals who disregard the warning and permit an intoxicated person to drive.





Forest service reports 79 blazes during weekend

OLD BRIDGE — The township wasn't alone when it was hit by three brush fires over the weekend. Warm temperatures and gusty winds sparked off a series of 79 wildfires Friday, Saturday and Sunday across New Jersey's forests, according to the state Forest Fire Service.

State personnel responded to the wildfires with an array of specialized equipment, including wildland engines, bulldozers, air tankers, helicopter and forest fire hand crews, according to a fire situation report released by the Forest Fire Service's Division B, New Lisbon.

More than 1,041 acres of the state's forests were blackened by the recent fires.

According to the state agency, forests are most vulnerable to fire during the annual spring fire season, which runs March 15 through May 15.

In addition to the wildfires that scorched 230 acres in and around Cheesequake State Park, large fires were reported in several counties throughout the region.

On Saturday, a fire in Cumberland County destroyed 765 acres before it was placed under control at 2 p.m. the following day. A total of 60 homes were evacuated in the Laurel Lake development of Millville and Commercial townships. Some 100 firefighters from the Forest Fire Service fought the blaze with the use of 20 wildland engines, four bulldozers, two air tankers and one observational helicopter.

In Sussex County, a fire destroyed 6 acres, burning on a remote ridge top in Hardyston Township and requiring the use of three Forest Fire Service hand crews, two air tankers and one drop helicopter.

The recent rash of fire outbreaks are due to a combination of low rainfall during the month of April, and fair weather days with higher temperatures, windy conditions and low relative humidity.

According to the Forest Fire Service, precipitation during the first three months of the year was normal. However, rainfall during April was approximately half of the average amount.

Synagogue officials heading to court

EAST BRUNSWICK — The former cantor of the East Brunswick Jewish Center, fired last year and sued by a synagogue official for defamation of character, is charging that a group of the temple's officials committed fraud.

And his firing, he claims, was done in an attempt to conceal the alleged fraud.

Though synagogue President Michael

"Mickey" Kaufman is refuting his charges of wrongdoing, Harvey Waldman, who had been cantor there since 1982, claims that synagogue officials fraudulently diverted a corporate opportunity — the purchase of 35 acres of vacant land owned by Beth Abraham Cemetery — away from the temple.

Waldman charges that although the temple had been interested in purchasing the Fern Road property at less than market value for use as cemetery plots, a group of synagogue officials instead arranged to acquire it privately and then developed it with houses at a profit of "in excess of \$20 million."

"This is something that was done behind the synagogue's back for the people who were supposed to be working for the synagogue's benefit," said David Schrader, a South Orange-based attorney representing Waldman. "They did it for their own self-profit."

However, Kaufman refuted the charge that fraud was committed and denied any wrongdoing on the part of any of the synagogue officials. If anything illegal was done, he said, the issue would be dealt with by law enforcement authorities rather than in a civil lawsuit.

The synagogue's interest in the cemetery land dates back to the early 1980s. At that time, Waldman alleges, Rabbi Chaim Rogoff, who is still the temple's rabbi, "falsely told a member of the committee (of synagogue members) that the asking price (for the land) was too high, and therefore prevented the synagogue from undertaking the acquisition."

That land was purchased in 1993 by developer East Woods Associates, a company of which Fred Teicher, a member of the synagogue's board of directors, was a principal, for \$1.1 million, according to Waldman. The property has since been developed as residential housing.

Kaufman, however, said the rabbi told the truth when he informed the committee that the asking price for the cemetery land was too high for the synagogue. He said he could not recall the exact asking price, but it was "several million dollars, which the synagogue could not afford."

In his complaint, Waldman names other synagogue board members, including the rabbi, as being involved with the alleged "fraudulent scheme." He claims in the lawsuit that Rogoff was "remunerated"



for his assistance with the plan by getting deeded property in Old Bridge and receiving "increased compensation at the synagogue."

When asked if the rabbi or the other synagogue officials received compensation as a result of the land's development, Kaufman said he was not compensated and that, to his knowledge, nor was the rabbi or the other board members.

Waldman's termination as cantor is also a refuted topic between the two sides.

In 1999, Waldman said, a group of synagogue congregants became suspicious about the so-called scheme and hired a private investigator to look into it. The cantor said he was made aware of the investigator's hiring and his findings. Waldman claims that upon his questioning of the cemetery land transaction, synagogue officials told him he would be brought up on charges in a *Beit Din*, a Jewish arbitration tribunal, unless he discontinued the effort to reveal details of the land transaction.

According to Waldman's lawsuit, he was suspended without pay in June 2000 for allegedly refusing to participate in the *Beit Din*, and two weeks later, on June 30, he was fired.

Kaufman said that as a result of "certain behaviors" and because "the relationship among the professional staff was no longer working," a decision was made not to renew Waldman's contract, but he declined to elaborate. He said he told Waldman that his contract was not going to be renewed when it expired in 2001 and that his services would no longer be required, but that the cantor would be paid for the remainder of the contract. However, Waldman was terminated as cantor when he refused to sign a release stating that he would not sue the synagogue after his employment contract expired, according to Kaufman.

As cantor, a position which involves serving as a musical and spiritual leader at a synagogue, Waldman was being paid \$91,300 in salary, fringe benefits and pension benefits at the time of his firing, his lawsuit states.

Also in June 2000, Teicher filed a lawsuit against Waldman, alleging defamation of character. In his complaint, Teicher acknowledges that his company purchased and developed the property, but he claims that Waldman made several false and defamatory statements about the issue.

Teicher charges that his reputation was damaged by the cantor and that his ability to sell houses in East Brunswick was also negatively affected.

In Teicher's lawsuit, the synagogue board member contends that Waldman made defamatory statements, including accusations that Teicher "created a scheme to purchase the cemetery for an inexpensive price and resold lands to be used for burial purposes to the East Brunswick Jewish

Center at an inflated price." Teicher's complaint also accuses the cantor of insinuating that "the purchase of the cemetery was part of an improper money-making scheme" and that the rabbi was involved in and reaping profits from that scheme.

Teicher contends that he has been "forced to continually defend himself against the false, defamatory statements" allegedly made by Waldman.

Teicher's lawsuit requests judgment against Waldman in the sum of \$10 million, while Waldman is asking for an unspecified amount of punitive, compensatory and other damages, as well as the reinstatement to his contracted job and a contract extension for an additional three-year period.

Neither Teicher nor Rogoff could be reached for comment. Daniel Hoberman, a Hackensack attorney representing Teicher, deferred comment to Kaufman.

EAST BRUNSWICK — A South Brunswick man was arrested after leading police on a foot chase April 25 and was charged in connection with a series of thefts in North Brunswick and East Brunswick.

East Brunswick police officers Chris Soke and Ted Klouser responded to a call at 8 a.m. at Summerhill Village Condominiums, Cranbury Road, on a report of a male who had been seen climbing a tree in order to access a second-story roof of the complex.

After a 20-minute search failed to produce the suspect, a neighbor pointed police to a 1989 silver Toyota that he did not recognize

as belonging to any of the residents. Police said a computer check of the vehicle's license plate number revealed that the car had been stolen from North Brunswick during a robbery on April 22.

As Soke and Klouser began inspecting the car, Robert J. McNeil, 35, walked into view carrying two large duffel bags of what police suspected to be stolen property. Upon seeing the officers, McNeil dropped the bags and took off running, police said.

He ran through the 6th Avenue Electronics parking lot, across six lanes of Route 18 and into the residential neighborhood behind the Colonial Diner, according to police.

McNeil was finally apprehended while attempting to hide behind a home on Prigmore Street.

Police said McNeil was carrying stolen merchandise, belonging to a condominium resident, in his pocket. They also found hypodermic syringes, a double-edged knife, a screwdriver, and keys to the stolen Toyota.

Also recovered from the duffel bags were a DVD player, a videocassette recorder, a coffee can full of change, several hundred dollars in cash and a camera with lenses, police said.

McNeil was charged with burglary; receiving stolen property (items from the burglary and the stolen car); possession of a weapon, burglary tools and a hypodermic syringe; and resisting arrest.

He was taken to police headquarters for processing and is being held on \$25,000 bail.

Since his arrest, new evidence has also linked McNeil with a robbery that took place the day before on Lois Avenue, which is the East Brunswick street where the suspect previously resided, according to police.

"Accordingly, the suspect has been charged with that burglary as well," East Brunswick Police Sgt. Russ MacArthur said. "Police found a stolen sterling silverware set in the trunk of his car."





Blaze will not slow building of county learning center

MONROE TOWNSHIP — A fire took out 25 percent of a roof being constructed for a new Middlesex County school.

The fire, which began shortly after

noon on April 21 at the Academy Learning Center construction site on Matchaponix Avenue, took firefighters about five hours to completely extinguish, according to Joseph Sensale, chief of Monroe Township Volunteer Fire Company No. 1.

"The damage was kept to a minimum and only occurred on one wing of the school," Sensale said. "It shouldn't set them back too far."

The school, which is being built for autistic children, is a project of the Middlesex County Educational Services Commission. Construction on the facility will continue, and school officials expect it to be ready to open in September as was planned.

"The person who started it was doing welding or torch work inside the building," Sensale said, adding that he was uncertain of the details. The worker, he said, was using "a torch of some sort," which accidentally started the fire.

"The fire started in between layers of the roof. We had to trench-cut the roof in order to stop the fire," he said.

Trench-cutting involves stopping a fire's path by cutting out an area that the fire has not reached. Because its path is obstructed, the fire cannot move to other areas, he said.

"Due to the type of roof construction they use, it was very difficult to extinguish the fire because it was in between the layers," Sensale said. "The bottom layer was corrugated metal and the outside was the shingle."

He said the fire took two to three hours to contain, even though it was not considered to be a major blaze.

"It wasn't a major fire so much as it was just a lot of work," he said. "It was a manpower-intensive job, strenuous work. We had to run saws and remove sheeting to contain it. Once you exhaust one fireman, he has to rest, so we had to call in mutual aid."

The fire looked worse than it was because of the smoldering foam insulation between layers of the roof, Sensale added.

Three firefighters were treated at the scene for heat exhaustion.

A fourth had to be taken to St. Peter's University Hospital in New Brunswick, where he was treated and released, according to Sensale.

All three Monroe fire departments responded, including the Central Monroe department and the Applegarth Fire Company. Monroe Township Volunteer Fire Company No. 1 was the first to respond, as the fire was in its district. Fire departments from Spotswood, Helmetta, Jamesburg, Milltown, East Brunswick, Sayreville and Old Bridge also responded.

"It was a great effort by all the departments that came. They did an extremely good job," Sensale said.

For elegant, exceptional cuisine, try Trattoria Nicola

A gracious dining experience awaits you at Trattoria Nicola, 900 Easton Ave. in the Somerset Village Plaza, Somerset.

From the moment guests are seated in the elegant dining room, they are treated like royalty. The staff is extremely attentive, yet not in the least intrusive while going about their tasks of filling glasses, taking orders, serving meals and clearing tables. Soft classical music provides a quiet backdrop for dinner conversation, and the romantic lighting scheme is soothing and tranquil. Scenes of Italy grace the walls — a subtle touch of understated grandeur.

Samy Hegazy, the proprietor of Trattoria Nicola, pays strict attention to every detail when it comes to accommodating his guests.

"When it comes to fine dining, the smallest things mean so much," says Hegazy, who goes from table to table to greet his guests and to be certain every aspect of their dining experience is perfect.

"In addition to exceptional cuisine, details such as keeping water glasses filled and having plenty of hot bread on a table can be the difference between a pleasurable meal and a spectacular one," he says.

The Italian cuisine served at Trattoria Nicola is sensational. Executive Chef Teodoro Pastro relies on both his talent and creative flair when preparing the Continental dishes — evident in the vongole (an appetizer of Manila clams and spicy Italian sausage in port wine and plum tomato herb broth), and the incredibly light eggplant appetizer stuffed with baby spinach and ricotta cheese and topped with mozzarella and tangy marinara sauce. Another excellent choice is the seafood-stuffed mushrooms, beautifully presented atop mescalin greens with a mild balsamic vinegar and basil oil drizzle which was offered as a special menu item on the evening of my visit.

The selection of main courses is quite extensive. Chicken, fish and veal dishes are all skillfully prepared using only the finest and freshest ingredients. Perhaps

most impressive about my dining experience was the manzo — herb roasted black angus filet mignon accented with garlic demiglaze (accompanied by a tasty rice pilaf, broccoli and carrots). The meat was incredibly tender and perfectly prepared medium, as requested. The garlic demiglaze was extraordinary.

Trattoria Nicola's signature dishes, which include pasta and rice creations with black angus sirloin, seafood, chicken breast, sausage or prosciutto, are excellent choices for those in the mood for something adventurous. The fusilli, smoked salmon, baby scallops, leek onions, sun-dried tomatoes, and egg-

plant with sherry cream sauce was delicious and extremely satisfying.

Desserts are all homemade and absolutely heavenly as expected in a restaurant noted for fine dining. Cheesecake is the specialty of the house — banana cheesecake, strawberry cheesecake, and a delectable, cinnamon apple cheesecake — all baked by Diane Hegazy, as is the smooth and sinfully rich chocolate mousse cake.

Trattoria Nicola offers both on and off-premises catering. Parties of any kind are always special affairs at the restaurant. On the night of my visit, both a

birthday and an anniversary were acknowledged with a lovely framed snapshot of the celebrations courtesy of Samy Hegazy and the Trattoria Nicola staff. But don't wait for a special occasion to visit Trattoria Nicola — enjoy the memorable dining experience as soon as possible.





Enjoy intimate dining at Caspita! Café and Bistro

Mid the busy shops along Route 34 in Matawan is a charming, serene respite called Caspita! Café and Bistro. For the past three and a half years, owners Kathleen and Michael DiBlase have quietly changed Caspita! from a dessert café to a full-scale, lunch and dinner restaurant serving outstanding, contemporary American cuisine. This progression has not gone unnoticed — Caspita! has received its share of critical acclaim including a place in the famous Zagat listing of America's top restaurants for 2001.

The restaurant is an intimate nook with a tranquil blend of European ambiance and American warmth. A showcase of desserts, many of which are house-made, remind you to leave a bit of room to sample at least one of these treasures.

Chef Terrence Tice changes the menu every one to two months in order to incorporate into his recipes only the freshest ingredients of the season. Tice expertly blends Asian, European and American components to offer his own unique twist on many standard selections.

The meal begins with a basket of excellent, warm rolls served alongside a bowl of olive oil perfectly seasoned with a hint of garlic and herbs — it's tempting to fill up on this simple, yet seductive starter. The early spring menu featured appetizers of gravlax Napoleon served with radicchio and baby arugula with roasted beet vinaigrette, Prince Edward Island mussels with Thai spiced broth, and risotto with sautéed mushrooms and baby spinach.

The soup du jour on the chilly day we visited Caspita! was a wonderful potato leek, not too thick and not too thin, with a flawless blend of flavors. There was a nice selection of salads from simple mixed field greens with cider vinaigrette or classic Caesar, to baby arugula served with warm goat cheese and thyme vinaigrette, or roasted beets with orange sections, endive and walnuts.

For a relatively brief menu, Chef Tice has covered all tastes very well with his selection of entrees. It's difficult to decide among the tantalizing choices because the flavors of any dish will exceed the written menu descriptions. This menu offered a

couple of pasta dishes including ravioli with chicken, pancetta, roasted garlic and rosemary lemon oil, a refreshing change from traditional ravioli; and a fettuccine with lump crab meat and saffron cream. The grilled mahi mahi with rice salad and soy miso vinaigrette was a nice light selection, as was sautéed grouper with herb couscous and vanilla bean buerre blanc. There's no shortage of comfort foods made with gourmet flare, as was evidenced by the grilled tenderloin of beef with garlic mashed potatoes and red wine sauce, the grilled chicken breast au poivre with roasted potatoes, and the grilled pork chop with yam salad and red onion marmalade.

Now you're ready to dive into those spectacular desserts. There are so many to choose from, and most are also available for purchase at very reasonable prices. The tiramisu is imported, one of the few desserts that is not made on site, but it's exceptionally fresh, rather than heavy, with wonderfully addictive flavors. Other selections include New York or Italian cheesecake, key lime pie, caramel apple crumb tort, cannoli, pecan pie, chocolate mousse pie, and chocolate peanut butter pie. There's also a wide selection of cookies that can be purchased by the pound.

Caspita! is also open for lunch with a menu far different from ordinary lunch fare. The salads are similar to those on the dinner menu, and entrees include quiche du jour, a grilled burger made with portobello mushroom, roasted red pepper, red onion, arugula and pesto mayonnaise. The Chinese five-spice, grilled chicken salad with shredded broccoli and fresh sprouts in a pita was absolutely heavenly and came with a side of yam salad. A list of wraps included roasted red pepper, arugula and goat cheese with basil pesto; as well as a Mediterranean tuna salad with baby spinach and sherry vinaigrette. There are also pastas and panini on the regular lunch menu.

Caspita! Café and Bistro is located at 1070 Route 34 in Plaza 34, Matawan. Dinner is served Tuesday through Saturday and reservations are highly suggested for Saturday evenings and recommended for Friday evenings. Lunch is served Monday through Friday from 11:30 a.m. to 3 p.m. For reservations or further information, call (732) 583-6000.



Asparagus is a sure sign of spring

It's easy to tell when spring has sprung — asparagus is plentiful in supermarket produce aisles. The American Dairy Association and Dairy Council Inc. (ADADC) looks forward to asparagus season, too, because the vegetable is a natural partner for dairy foods. A successful recipe begins with a fresh vegetable.


When shopping for asparagus, look for purple tinged, tight-budded spears. They should be even-sized, at least one-half inch in diameter, and at least two-thirds green. Avoid any stalk with a large, woody, hard white base. Asparagus is best cooked the same day it is purchased, but will keep three to four days in the refrigerator. To store asparagus, remove the very end of the stalks and store them upright in one inch of water and covered with plastic wrap.

When it comes to preparing spears for cooking, try Julia Child's method: She recommends peeling the stalk, rather than just eating the part that snaps off easily (this increases the amount of edible vegetable). Use a small, sharp paring knife to cut under the thicker skin at the base of the stalk. Work toward the tip, making the cut shallower as you progress upward.

Celebrate spring with these recipes from ADADC.

Asparagus with Parmesan cheese and bacon

Yield: 6 servings
 3 tablespoons butter
 2 tablespoons minced green onion
 4 slices bacon, cooked, drained, crumbled
 1/3 cup grated Parmesan cheese
 1/8 teaspoon pepper
 2 pounds medium asparagus trimmed
 Melt butter in small skillet. Sauté onion until tender, about three minutes. Remove from heat. Stir in bacon, cheese and pepper. Meanwhile, steam asparagus until tender, about eight minutes; drain. Place hot asparagus on serving dish. Sprinkle with cheese mixture. Serve immediately.



Summer asparagus roll-up with herb cheese and sun-dried tomatoes

Yield: 24 rolls
Prep time: 30 minutes
 1 pound (24 spears) asparagus
 1/2 pound red peppers, roasted
 4-6 tablespoons herb cheese spread, at room temperature
 4 sun-dried tomatoes, soaked in boiling water for 10 minutes, drained and finely chopped
 8-10 8-inch flour tortillas
 Trim asparagus tips to four 5-inch lengths, reserving remainder of stalk for later. In boiling salted water, cook asparagus until tender, four to seven minutes. Rinse under cold water. Cut peppers into

1/2-inch wide strips. Rinse and dry asparagus tips and pepper strips thoroughly.

Mix herb cheese spread and sun-dried tomatoes together. Spread each tortilla with approximately 1 tablespoon herb cheese spread. Cut tortillas into strips 1 to

1-1/2 inches wide. Put one asparagus tip and one pepper strip together at one end of a tortilla strip and tightly roll up in spiral fashion. Repeat with remaining asparagus and peppers.

Refrigerate covered until serving time. May be prepared up to one day ahead.

Note: To roast peppers, place under broiler or over grill until skin is blackened on all sides. Place in a paper bag and close tightly to let steam for about 10 minutes. Remove peppers from the bag when cool enough to handle. Peel, split lengthwise and remove seeds, core and trim. Do not rinse under water.

Chilled asparagus salad

Yield: 4-6 servings
 2 pounds thin asparagus, trimmed
 2 hard-boiled eggs, peeled
 1 container (8 ounces) low fat lemon yogurt
 2 tablespoons fresh lemon juice
 1 tablespoon grated lemon peel
 1 tablespoon butter, melted
 1/8 teaspoon each of salt, pepper
 Steam asparagus just until tender, about five minutes. Rinse in cold water; drain. Pat asparagus dry with paper toweling. Cut into 1/2-inch long pieces. Separate egg whites and yolk; chop each. Combine yogurt, lemon juice, lemon peel, butter, salt and pepper in large bowl. Add asparagus and chopped egg. Toss to combine. Refrigerate covered, 1 to 2 hours to allow flavors to blend.



City and country folk agree: fresh peas please

There is nothing that tastes better to me than food that comes directly from the garden to my kitchen to be cooked within a few hours. Having grown up in the Midwest where farming and gardening abound, I took freshness for granted. I would never have believed that there are people who never see vegetables wearing their natural coating of good black dirt! Trying to convince me that multitudes of cooks only see vegetables a week after harvest would have been impossible. I was firmly convinced that no one would be satisfied with veggies from a plastic container.

Then I moved to New Jersey. What a difference 700 miles makes! I quickly realized that my idea of how to procure food was radically opposed to that of most of my new friends.

One Sunday, I invited a young couple from Manhattan to enjoy a day in the country on my New Jersey farm. I had no idea that we were all going to experience a cross-cultural event, but that is what happened!

Jeff and Blish (yes, that is her name) arrived for a quick ride on one of the horses, which turned out to be roughly the equivalent of a Coney Island ride on a roller coaster. After a few sore muscles and a great many laughs, we decided that dinner might be a safer and more mutually comfortable activity.

Earlier that morning, I had made a trip to my favorite local farm market for vegetables. Tiny carrots with their feathery tops, new radishes and sweet green peas found their way into my shopping bag. As I am the type of hostess who believes that everyone can participate in food preparation, I invited my guests to shell the peas. They had no way of knowing that I thought I was being generous by assigning them my favorite task. I always begged for that job in my mother and grandmother's kitchens because it meant I could pop as many of the sugar-sweet little peas into my mouth as into the bowl.

I retired to the kitchen to prepare pasta, and I looked outside to see how the pea shelling was progressing. Much to my amazement I saw two very puzzled young people staring at the brown bag of peas, the large and empty crock-

ery bowl and their glasses of wine. When I joined them to ask why the peas remained safely tucked in their green pods, Blish looked at me with great dismay. She explained that in her experience peas always arrived frozen in a block or in a plastic bag of butter sauce.

Once I composed myself and stifled my gales of laughter, I taught those two city dwellers where peas really come from and what a treat they are to eat raw. We managed to save a few peas for our meal and the dish we made will forever be known as Blish's Pasta Salad. I hope you enjoy making and eating it as much as we did that day.

Blish's Pasta Salad

For salad:

- 1 pound bow tie pasta
- 1 small bag baby carrots
- 1 pound fresh or frozen peas
- 1 red bell pepper, chopped
- 1 yellow bell pepper, chopped
- 1/2 cup grated Parmesan Reggiano
- 1/2 cup minced fresh flat leaf parsley

Louis sauce:

- 1 cup mayonnaise
- 1/4 cup heavy cream
- 1/4 cup chili sauce
- 1 teaspoon Worcestershire sauce
- 1/4 cup chopped green onion
- 2 tablespoons lemon juice
- salt and pepper to taste

Cook bow ties in a large pot of lightly salted boiling water for a total of eight minutes. After bow ties have cooked three minutes, add carrots and bell peppers. Add frozen peas one minute later or fresh peas three minutes later.

Drain pasta and vegetables and rinse with ice cold water until well cooled. Place pasta and vegetables in a large bowl, and stir in cheese and parsley. Fold in as much Louis sauce as needed to lightly dress salad.

Chill for several hours to allow flavors to mellow.

ty, but good for the environment as well."






Meanwhile, girls track coach Rich Maczka was a bit more cautious.

"We knew we'd be fairly strong," he added. "But there are three or four strong teams. It makes for a very interesting couple of days."

The Lady Knights certainly had a stellar first day, especially the trio of sophomores Kim Henry, Erin O'Dell and junior Kim Johnston, who teamed up to capture first place in the intermediate hurdles relay.

Old Bridge added to its point total with three second-place finishes. Linda Sanders, a junior and the team's top distance runner, led the Knights to a runner-up showing in the 4 x 1600 relay. In addition, a pair of seniors, Rachel Davison and Kim Bennett, spearheaded two more second-place finishes in the discus and high jump relays, respectively.

"We have a really young team this year," Maczka pointed out. "What few seniors we have really lead us, but a great deal of our talent is in the sophomore and junior classes."

That would include juniors Sarah Converey in the javelin and Brittany McCombs in the shot put. Henry and Johnston, two more underclassmen, are the team's top sprinters and "team up to do three or four events," according to Maczka.

Perhaps the Knights' best all-around athlete is sophomore Kim Spengle.

"She's our second best hurdler and one of our best javelin and discus throwers," Maczka noted.

The Old Bridge girls went 5-0-1 last year en route to winning the conference championship, and judging by the first four meets this season, they have every intention on keeping their crown.

"We've dominated most of the rest of the competition so far," Maczka said, "but we won't see some of the best teams in dual meets until the end of the season. The Relays, though, is sort of a barometer."

Meanwhile, the boys track team, off to a 7-0 start, can only hope the GMC Relays are

an accurate barometer of their superiority over the rest of the conference.

The Knights garnered a pair of first-place finishes during the opening day. The quartet of Rich Lafergola, Mark Rabinowitz, Ryan Bennett and Dan Harding combined to win the 4 x 1600 (or 4 x 1 mile) relay, while the trio of Kenny Goode, Anthony DePalma and Paul Portalatin garnished top honors in the long jump relay.

In addition, Old Bridge finished second in the 4 x 200 and shot put relay, third in the intermediate hurdles and fourth in the javelin and pole vault.

The Knights also took part in the prestigious Penn Relays last weekend. The top 12 finishers in each event qualified for the Champions of America Race the following day, and the Knights' 4 x 800 relay team of Tim Paule, Harding, Justin Marquez and Rabinowitz just missed qualifying by finishing 14th. Old Bridge finished fifth in the same event two years ago. Zeyad Hussain, Goode, Mahmoud Sei and DePalma ran in this year's 4 x 400, but also did not qualify.

Old Bridge has also received strong efforts this season from Aaron Suozzo, the team's top shot put and javelin thrower, while sophomore Brandon Nolan is the top sprinter.

"And many of those kids are back for the next couple of years," Campbell said, noting only Suozzo, Hussain, Sei and Rabinowitz are seniors. "All the rest are mostly juniors and sophomores. ... We lost some good kids to graduation last year, but it seems we were able to reload, I guess. We're hoping to do well at the county and state sectionals. Our goal is to win one or both of those championships."


