The application of Dr. Alan Weinstein of 40 Bushnell Road, SayreWoods South was also held over for further study. Weinstein applied for a variance in the zoning requirements of the township to use more than 25 percent of the floor space in his home for professional purposes.

Weinstein who serves as Township Physician pointed out the lack of health services in Madison Township and that he intended to enlarge the facilities of his office and equip the home located in a residential zone with a labratory, x-ray room and storage space. He claimed to that the expansion would allow him to handle township cases more efficiently. Weinstein asked that he be allowed to use 100% of the

area for medical purposes. Main objector to the proposal was a neighbor of Weinstein. The neighbor cited that the increased facilities would increase the flow of traffic on already heavily travelled Bushnell Road. He also claimed that as a result of the doctor's office at the location it created a parking problem. He complained that over a score to times he had to enter the office and ask a patient to move his vehicle so he could enter his own driveway. He also stated that bicycles and garbage cans had been run over by patients cars and that they created a garbage problem by dumping their ash trays and debris on the road. He complained of noise and sirens

and doors slamming at all hours. Donald Tierney was once again the main objector to the proposed building of a 7-11 Store located on Bordentown Avenue, Tierney cited various traffic problems at the store.

Representatives of the Southland Corporation reported that they had purchased the property with the understanding that it had been zoned as a commercial zone. They said they were told this by the real estate firm handling the transaction and were shown a map listing the area as a commercial zone. The firm was granted a building permit by former Chief Building Inspector Charles Aumick, according to representatives the building was one-third completed when a stop-order was issued.

A motion was made by Board member Farrington to hold the application over for further study, there was no second on the motion. James Tortorice a member of the Board moved that the application be turned over to the township committee this motion also failed to carry a second and was lost.

Board Chairman Leon Arrowsmith announced earlier in the evening that a special meeting will be held in the very near future to render decisions on most of the applications.

The Madison Township shade tree Commission has invited all known Township landscape contractors and nurserymen to a special meeting to be held at the Town Hall this Thursday (August 15) evening at 8:00 P.M. The purpose of the meeting is to discuss the Commission's tentative Fall and Spring planting programs and to determine what part, if any, the local nurserymen might play in it.

To be presented to the nurserymen for their reaction and comment is a proposed listing of tree varieties, planting specifications, guarantees, and other requirements. A number of possibilities are under consideration, including the outright purchase of trees by the Commission itself with the planting to be handled by the contract.


The township finally restoned the roads in Southwood after eight years of patching and hearing complaints from the residents of the area and what do they get, more abuse.


