Ground Breaking Set

Approximately one year ago (1966) the voters of Madison Township went to the voting machines (in small number) and approved plans and building for a second high school for Madison Township. On Sunday September 24, the Board of Education will finally hold groundbreaking ceremonies for the new \$4 million dollar plus school which will actually contain some 21 regular classrooms, the ceremonies will get underway at 5:30 p.m. with various school board members and school officials in attendance.

The four million dollar plus building being constructed on a 58 acre tract is supposed to be completed by the fall session in 1968, actual construction of the building is not underway as yet, with the weather setting in and the possibility of a nationwide steel strike, plus a shortage of construction steel it is very doubtful that the school will be completed on schedule.

The completed building will contain some 178,000 square feet of space.

On October 10th, the voters of Madison Township will have the opportunity to vote for additional schools, the total bond issue of two (middle schools) and a new elementary school will cost the taxpayers of Madison Township something like \$6,950,000 or in round figures \$7 million dollars
