Dedicate Harbor Fire Memorial Monument



Recently the Laurence Harbor Fire Co. No. 1 held its annual memorial service at which time they dedicated their new monument erected in memory of its deceased members.

The ceremony was opened by Harry Merwin, chairman of the monument committee with Stanley Thomsen fire company Chap-

lain performing the memorial service.

The invocation and benediction were given by Rev. James Silver and Rev. Melvin Stanczewski, honorary Chaplains of the fire company.

Mayor Victor O'Brien spoke briefly commanding the firemen



for their outstanding service to the community.

The memorial monument, erected in the parking lot in front of the Laurence Harbor firehouse, was a result of many months of planning by the Laurence Harbor firemen, Ladies Auxiliary and Exempt Association.

And So It Goes

Madison Township was hit by the "power failure" on Monday - fortunately the power was restored within a few hours - what most people didn't seem to realize was how really serious the situation was - without electricity for the pumps, water supplies were dangerously low - without electricity for the pumps, some of the sewerage started backing up - - - The police department turned on their emergency generator at the start of the crisis and were in radio communication during the "power failure" - - - police and special police directed traffic on the various highways because the traffic signals were all out because of the power failure - - - Members of the various fire departments were on hand at the various firehouses in the Township and were in direct radio communication with police headquarters - fire trucks also patrolled the streets announcing over the loudspeakers to refrain from using water during the emergency - - - speaking of firemen we see where Robert Gares, the driver of the South Old Bridge Fire Company fire truck that was responding to a house fire in Sayre Woods South when it was involved in a collision with a car killing four Old Bridge youths

returning from a High School football game, was acquitted of criminal negligence in Middlesex County Criminal Court - - - Judge John R. Molineux directed the verdict of acquittal - the learned Judge ruled that the state had failed to present evidence "beyond a reasonable doubt that, Gares, had operated the fire-truck "carelessly and heedlessly in wanton disregard" of others - - - as we have previously stated in the "MADISON AMERICAN" we do not believe that Robert Gares was guilty - - - we do believe that he has been punished enough - - - we do believe that for as long as he lives Robert Gares will remember October 8, 1966 - - we do believe that the South Old Bridge Fire Company will remember the date - - - we do believe that the Middlesex County Board of Freeholders should have long before that date corrected the "dangerous" Route 516 with its many bends - - we do not believe that the recent "widening" by the County Road Department is really worth a "hill of beans" - - - we feel that Route 516 should be widened to a four lane highway to handle the present traffic - - - we believe that Route 516 is as dangerous to the residents of Madison Township as "Death Alley" Route 9 - - - we believe that the county Board of Freeholders have been stalling the officials of Madison Township - - - as well as the State Highway Department - - - It's surprising to this writer to see just how many "doves" became "hawks" overnight in Our Town - - quite a few people we know in various discussions have been arguing "what in the hell are we doing in Vietnam, we ought to get out of the far east, we have no busi-

ness there" - - - The doves became hawks when the "conflict" in the middle east began - - - these same "peaceniks" then changed their song to "We have to save Israel - - - we should bomb the Arabs - - - let's save the Holy Land" - - - War is hell no matter where it is - - no matter who started it - - AND SO IT GOES.

T'Was A Hot Time In The Old Town

As was previously predicted in the Madison American, the recent meeting of the Madison Township Council held at the Municipal Building on Route 9 was one of the hottest meetings held this year in the old town hall and as was previously predicted in the Madison American the revised Zoning Ordinance proposed by the Madison Township Planning Board and later approved by the Township Council on first reading and submitted for advertisement was defeated by all seven councilmen.

Prior to opening of the public portion of the meeting to the public on the proposed amendment to the zoning ordinance which many residents evidently felt would "open the door" to Garden Apartments and down-grade property in various sections of the township Mayor Victor C. O'Brien read a statement from the Democratic majority on the council which explained that "all objections to

the proposed ordinance would be heard and that there would be no formal action taken by the council at this meeting, he promised that the ordinance would be tabled and sent back to the Planning Board for "further study."

The room was hot and smoke-filled, the people were hot and burning, cat-calls, boos, applauds, kisses filled the room as resident after resident objected to the proposed ordinance. About the only noisier place around was in front of the U.N. Building in "Fun City" where Arab sympathizers clashed with Israel supporters over war in the near East. After almost three hours of arguments against the proposed ordinance the Township Council voted to a man to vote the proposed amendment to the zoning ordinance down. The Council also received a petition bearing the signatures of almost 3,000 persons in the township against the proposed ordinance.
