DEMOCRATIC NOMINATIONS.
FOR CONGRESS—THIRD DISTRICT.
HON. MILES ROSS.

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THE Third Congressional District made a move when they nominated Hon. Miles Ross for Congress last Tuesday. The assembly with which the district is associated, and which should be the standard bearer of the Democracy for the Third District in the approaching election, has decided to support Miles Ross.

That Union County was entitled to the nomination, so one movement with politics of the County, on policy, and inasmuch as there was no available candidate to present before the Convention from Union County, we have failed to secure the nomination. The speech of Mr. Ross, however, for the past two terms in Congress in first-class, and there was no question of his election if the Democracy stand firm for him. He ought to be elected by an increased majority over his last election. He is a disinterested representative and looks after the interest of his constituents and district, as is evidenced by his securing the handsome appropriations for the Third District for the construction of a Light House in Indian Bay, and the dredging of that river to make it navigable. Miles Ross should be returned to Congress by a handsome majority.

We believe that he will be.

The Second Congressional District Democratic Convention will be held at Washington, on Wednesday, September 11th, for the purpose of nominating a candidate for member of Congress.

The Yellow Fever scourge has become an epidemic in New England and fifty new cases occur every day with the deaths in the proportion of one to five. At first a few isolated cases occur in towns, then the cases become more numerous, and then the disease spreads in epidemic form. It has been with Orange, Middlebury, Vinalburg and Memphis. The isolated cases have stretched further North, and one has been reported at the head of Narragansett in the city of Pittsburg.

The West Jones Free says: It appears from the best attainable evidence that the wheat crop in New Jersey this year is the largest in the history of the State, and the most profitable in yield, of any ever harvested in the State. There may be some sections where the quality is not fully up to the standard, but taken as a whole, it is a large crop of good wheat and more. As much can hardly be said of the crop, although it is believed to be equal to the average. The recent frosts have ruined the wheat in some sections beyond injury, except from frost. This condition of things leaves the farmer without the prospect of a crop of wheat, which is a great loss to him.
