CHURCHES ARE WARNED

UNION COUNTY GRAND JURY
 GIVES SHARP REBUKE

Notes Out the Inconspicuous of a
 War on Main-Tracks When There
 is Gambling Within the Temple.

Following is the full text of the presentment of the Union County Grand Jury against lotteries, briefly referred to in the Daily Press of yesterday. It is a striking arraignment:

UNION OVER AND TERMINES AND GENERAL
 JURY DELIBERED.

OCTOBER TERM, 1904.
 The Grand Inquest in and for the body of the County of Union:

Present, That we, upon investigation, find that the particular case concerning a lottery alleged to be in and for the body of the County of Union:

After a careful consideration of the entire subject we have concluded to bring into court this presentment of facts.

The Constitution of our State absolutely prohibits lotteries. The courts have held that the distribution of presents as prizes at public exhibitions or entertainments, by chance, is a lottery; the revised statutes of our State declare that "All lotteries for money, goods, real estate, etc., shall be and are hereby adjudged to be common and public nuisances;" and the statutes further provide that if any person shall either sell or offer to sell any ticket for money, goods, real estate, etc., he shall be deemed guilty of a misdemeanor for which he may be imprisoned in the State prison for a term of one year; our courts have also held that any place in which a lottery is held is a public nuisance, and that those who are in any way contribute by their service or aid to the holding of a lottery, or who may themselves be indicted for keeping a disorderly house.

We cannot close our eyes to the fact that it has become a prevalent evil among the people of this county to raise money for various purposes by means of what the law has clearly adjudged to be a lottery; especially in this as to this particular case, in which the proceeds of the lottery are to be used for the purpose of holding public office, those who have been placed in nomination by the various political parties for office, as well as officers at large, are importuned by not only officers of the county, but also by voters and children who are just out to peddle the tickets; we feel assured that many engage in this practice notwithstanding, not knowing they are violating the law in conducting such a lottery, and simply rely upon the excuse that a charitable end justifies an unlawful means.

We believe that churches, clubs and societies formed for the purpose of promoting the welfare of one of their members or patrons are the most frequent offenders against lottery laws in our county. Within the past few days it has been publicly announced that one of the churches in this county has taken up a collection for the year 1905 worth of stock to be raffled off.

In order to stop such practices and to give ample notice to all of our citizens that we are determined to be able to indict, we have determined to make this presentment and refrain from presenting indictments.

We particularly address ourselves to churches of the various denominations in this county who have heretofore violated this law, and who contemplate further violations thereof, and call their attention to the inconsistency of their conduct in claiming to be religious while they, under the cloak of religion, are permitting equally unlawful practices to be carried on for their own pecuniary benefit, thereby to some extent justifying the charge that if the pews, rooms and races were for the benefit of these offending churches the practice would have been overlooked.
