BEEF AND PORK SCARE.

Western Dealers Say that a Pink Peril is hovering Very Near Us.

Beef tasters will have to pay well for their favorite food during the next twelve months, if they want it of prime quality, and the price of the small restaurants and boarding-houses would, it seems, do well to provide themselves with axes.

The National Provisioner calls attention to the unusual scarcity of cattle existing in the country now and to the inferior quality of the beef which reaches market. The result is that all grades of beef are sold at high prices and that the condensed scarcity of pork has made that demand greater.

George B. Weaver, manager of one of the Eastern branch of the meat market in Chicago, says that the price of the corn-fed cattle now arriving in the markets of Kansas City and Chicago, are very inferior to what were obtainable.

"Out of 25,000 cattle arriving in Chicago there ought to be 4,000 or 5,000 fine corn-fed or native specimens," he says, "and the number now can be placed in the hundreds." There may be a number of reasons for this condition, but nobody has been able to explain the reason for the scarcity of that raising stock is now so great that farmers find the tilling of their land more profitable.

"The reason for the scarcity of pork," he continued, "is principally that hogs were so cheap two years ago that farmers stopped raising them. Now they will probably start in again, and inside of a year we will have plenty of that sort of meat. This will ease the demand for beef, as a consequence, but for the present scarcity and high prices will rule."
