NEW HAVEN MURDER.

**CAPTURE OF THE PERPETRATORS
 BY INSPECTOR BYRNES.**

One of the Miscellaneous Attempts to Shoot

New York, May 12.—The perpetrators of the brutal murder of old Mrs. Margaret Hunt, which started New Haven, Conn., last Tuesday morning, have been run to earth by Detective Inspector Byrnes, and now lie in separate cells at police headquarters awaiting orders from Connecticut. They are James F. Taylor, a saloon keeper at No. 515 Hudson street, a well known resort for "hookers" of all kinds, who is 34 years old, and Henry B. Chamberlain, alias Frank Clark, a native of New Haven, whose parents, highly respectable people, now reside in the city, and who is 30 years old. He has served several terms in prison for such offenses as robbing, and he was known to the old woman, whose life he took.

Taylor has told the whole story of the murder. He and Chamberlain had heard that Mrs. Hunt carried \$10,000 on her person. They went to New Haven, obtained entrance to Mrs. Hunt's house on the pretense of having a letter for her, knocked her down and watered her with whiskey and brandy, and then they killed her. Taylor was the one who fired the shot which killed her. He was armed with a revolver. When they left the body, they took the first train back to New York. Chamberlain told his master, Corn Bell, where he had been, and some of the particulars. He was frightened by the police into confessing the whole story. Taylor, on the other hand, was more cautious.
