Are the French Dying Out?
Looking over their last official census report, one is tempted to ask: Are the French passing out of existence as a nation? In 1899 there were less than a million births in all France, and in Paris one-fourth of them were illegitimate. Only for the birth rate of the population would actually decline from year to year. Each year there are fewer marriages by several thousand. In 1898 there were 1,115,000 marriages in France, and in 1904 even so, rapidly does the rate decline. In 1900 France had a population of 38,000,000. Now she has 38,215,900, yet in 1910 and for ten years preceding, the average number of births was 31,000, the result in 1920. Under such circumstances, with her declining population, there should be little suffering from poverty in France. But she would there is as much as ever. It would be very scientific interest to know what causes the decline of this slowly dying people.

Yellowstone.
