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A LOOK OVER THE FIELD

THE HEIGHT OF BALL PLAYERS AS JUDGED BY THE SEASON JUST ENDED.

Will the Short Man Force Out the Tall One—They are now holding the same—some in the Outside—Victor's Power Work

When you look back at the baseball season just ended, and note the men who have distinguished themselves, it will be found that they are of a very short make, and in fact, that the short, stocky man is beginning to predominate in base ball circles. Formerly the tall player, like a poleman, was selected as much on account of his physique as for his ability on the diamond. In fact, as impression prevailed not many years ago that a tall man had no business trying to play ball, and the remark was frequently heard regarding some new recruit for fame on the diamond: "He plays well, but he's too small." This has changed, and today the majority of baseball players are of short stature, and even equally so marked in the respect to the Cleveland team that it travels around the country weighed down with the mistake of "dumplings." Second baseman, "Chilly" is a veritable human dumping, and, with the exception of Young and Zimmer, the team is composed of a heavy set of players.

Every other baseball has been played, the opinion has been held that a tall man's first base was an absolute necessity.
