EDITORIAL NOTES

There can be no real famine in any part of the world any more. Communication is so swift that the hungry can be helped before the crop is ready for the market.

The Quorum Question. Theodore Stanton has been inquiring among the government legislative bodies of Continental Europe to find out what was the usual practice in regard to counting in a quorum members who were present, but who did not vote in an assembly when they wished to obstruct legislative proceedings.

It places the French and Swiss at the head of the parade in the matter of the mental Europe. He finds that the French always count in to make up a quorum those who are present, whether they vote or not. Continental usage generally covers this matter, and the question has come up at all. In Holland the good old Dutch burghers are so severe and harmonious that the minority has never yet thought of hindering the majority.

In Norway members are required by law to be present in the lower house and to vote. Infraction of this law is punished by heavy fines. In Denmark non-voters are counted as present on the floor.

Co-operation Among Farmers. The political reasons growing out of the farmers' convention at Ocala may be said to have been the origin of an assembly originated one movement which, if faithfully followed up, will end in most substantial good to all the agriculturists engaged in it.

One state department of the National Union has already been established at Louisville. Thirty-five branch stores are to be founded elsewhere in Kentucky and other states. The organizations will select agents and place them in charge of the branch stores. They will remain one thing to insure the success of this movement to enable farmers to control their own purchases and a few retail stores.

With the example of the great cooperative store system before them in England, the farmers cannot fail in their attempt if it is well managed. Members of the first English co-operative society put their means together and formed a joint stock company. At first they confined their work merely to buying articles at wholesale and distributing them among the members, adding to the price merely the expense of distribution.

The plan above outlined has been the one that will be benefited the most in Great Britain, where the system has now spread far and wide. With modifications such as the difference of country and climate would require, the plan is the one that will succeed best in America.




