The New Science.

In brief, it is bacteriology—the key whereby man may in time unlock a part of all the mysteries of nature. Dr. Armand Ruffier writes in "The Nineteenth Century" of some of the things the new science has already accomplished for us in the field of preventive medicine.

The establishing of the foundation principles of this new ology required the researches of specialists in all the natural sciences. From the other branches of science, the discovery of microbes antedated by centuries the practical application of the knowledge. More than 500 years ago a Jewish father, Athanasius Kircherus, under his microscope living and moving creatures. In blood, virus, cheese and other substances. In 1665 another microscopist saw and accurately described microbes in many kinds of organic matter. Medical cranks of the day even hinted that infectious diseases might be due to these microbes or germs which were found to swarm in such numbers in organic matter.

Now mark you! No sooner was this theory propounded than a wise man set in and laughed it to scorn in the most brazen manner, insinuating it on his pen point as a mere fancy. He was the great brain of man had ever devised. The poor little budding theory was unable to withstand the attack of scientific ridicule, and laid itself in the darkness, to be revived and cast nearly 200 years later as the proudest triumph of scientific discovery in the last half of the nineteenth century. The moral you can pick out for yourself.

Dr. Ruffier points out some of the beneficial results already accruing to medicine from bacteriology. Pasteur's work in hydrophobia is one. Dr. Joseph Lister's wonderful success with his antiseptic dressings and surgery constitutes another. Antiseptic dressings prevent blood poisoning, and in some fields of surgery the mortality from this cause has been reduced to one per cent. By cultivating the anthrax bacillus and inoculating cattle this dread disease bids fair in time to be stamped out. Pasteur has saved the people from the ravages of cholera by showing them how to manage the fermentation of those drinks popular. All the plagues that ravage the herds and flocks of domestic animals will doubtless in time be annihilated through preventive inoculation, as one of the beneficent results of the wonderful science of bacteriology. To it also is due the chemical science of disinfectants. Greater even than this is the field that opens before the microscopist. Bacteriologists are now on a fair road to discovering and isolating the microbes of decay. If they can find the microbe for this, as there is good reason to think there may be, then one of the terrors of 5,000 years will be driven from among mankind. The same will be the case, too, with diphtheria, typhoid and scarlet fever and every other infectious physical disorder known to man. All these can be stamped out from among mankind. Talk of microbes!

The microscope the chemical substances secreted by micro-organisms might also interest the reader, but the question is too wide to more than mention here. All that we have to indicate is to show that in short time bacteriologists will have secured ways of curing diphtheria, with methods more and more scientific.

In the preceding line it has been proved that bacteriology is a direct extension of the branch of knowledge only but of all the divisions of natural science, biology, chemistry and others. But during the growth of this science the greatest light on the sciences of which it is an offshoot, has been thrown by the work made through chemical investigations, but, on the other hand, what the new science has for chemistry.
