An Ovation in the Senate After He Was Sworn In.

## FETTER'S REMARKABLE MEASURE.

WASHINGTON, Jan. 8.—The very brief session of the Senate was devoted only to Governor Hill's reception on the floor and his entrance upon his senatorial duties. Senators generally were desirous of getting down to committee work, and after appointing, with pleasant unanimity, Mr. Morgan's Judiciary caucus resolution, adjourned until Wednesday.

Senator Hill arrived at the Capitol early, accompanied by General Farnsworth. He went at once to the Democratic cloakroom and was in a moment surrounded by a group of friends, many of whom were anxious to shake his hand. Several members of the house came out and sat on the sofa in the new senator's room.

An Oration to Senator Hill.

There was also an unusually large number of spectators in the gallery. On the west side of the back row of the third floor from the end, there was a basket of big red roses. The Democratic senators did not attempt to conceal their satisfaction at Mr. Hill's presence.

While the secretary was reading the Journal after prayer, the oration to Senator Hill created another disturbance. Mr. Hill arose from his seat and was shown to his seat by Senator Canfield. Hill's chair is between those of Senators Bliss and Daniel.

Senator Hancock then stepped into the middle aisle, and announced that David B. Hill was present ready to take his oath. Then the Republican senator recited his new Democratic colleague to Vice President Sherman. The new senator then shook hands with the officers, signed the roll and went back into the crowd of Democrats, where he was again surrounded.

The hour became so great that the vice president was required to rap for order. Then Mr. Hill stood back of his seat and the House members, who were in the gallery, were formed into line and passed in front of the new senator, congratulating him heartily on his victory in New York. The scene was one which has not before been witnessed in the senate for many years.

Mr. Cockrell announced the nomination of himself on the committee of managers, of Mr. Plummer on the committee on territories, of Mr. Blackburn on executive department and of Mr. Voorhees on Indian affairs. He also announced that Mr. Hill be appointed on the committee in place of those gentlemen.

## Senator Fetter's Starter.

A remarkable measure was introduced in the senate by Senator Fetter. It is entitled "A bill for the relief of the people of Indiana." In a preamble the nature of the relief provided for is explained. The people of Indiana, the preamble says, are now laboring under "the grievous burden of an excessive mortgage on the lands of the state, the result of the failure of the government to issue the currency, the direct consequence of legislation favoring the credit of capitalists and hostile to the wage earner and producer, resulting in the excessive mortgaging of the lands of the people of Indiana to such an extent as to threaten the loss of such lands to their present owners and occupants."

The bill provides that the secretary of the treasury shall issue \$100,000,000 in treasury notes directly to the people of Indiana upon mortgage security upon any and all real estate lying within the state to the extent of one-half the cash value of the same, as fixed by the board of lay commissioners of Indiana.

At the same time the government is to receive a tax of 2 per cent. per year. Citizens to whom these treasury notes shall be issued shall be entitled to the lands to be mortgaged to secure a promissory note payable into the United States treasury in twenty years. The amount of notes to be not more than two-thirds of the cash value of the lands to be mortgaged. The mortgage tax or the principal when paid, personal property shall be levied on and the mortgagee shall be obliged to pay the amount due, then the county auditor is directed to sell the property and the proceeds of the sale shall be sent by the government.

## Two Hundred New Hills in the House.
